

The Adelaide Crows suffered their first home defeat of the season going down to Fremantle by 12 points in a tight contest at Adelaide Oval. Adelaide is still sitting inside the top eight but in a log jam with four other clubs sitting on three wins.

A tough contest to half-time saw the Crows go into the main break with a two-goal lead before Fremantle took control in the second half to run out 12-point victors. The Dockers well served by David Mundy & Andrew Brayshaw in midfield while Matt Taberner booted four goals.

For Adelaide stand in skipper Tom Doedee impressed with Rory Laird and Ben Keays gathering plenty of the ball. It was also another impressive performance from Paul Seedsman who gathered 28 disposals, kicked a goal, and had eight score involvements to continue his impressive start to the season.

Adelaide Coach Matthew Nicks felt his team was well placed at three quarter time to go one and win the game but acknowledged the Dockers were simply too good in the end. "There were too many intercept marks, our final third efficiency was really poor. When it counted, they stood up at the centre bounce and we went down 1-6 in the clearances in the last 10 minutes"

Taylor Walker was under an injury cloud pre-game with a calf injury and despite kicking two goals did seem hampered during the match. After kicking two goals in the opening round of the season Billy Frampton has failed to kick a goal in four games since and may be under pressure to hold his position in the senior side with Elliott Himmelberg and Riley Thilthorpe waiting in the wings. A clash in Tasmania against the 17th ranked Hawthorn on Sunday an opportunity to get back on the winners list before the fixture list begins to look a little more daunting.

Port Adelaide v St Kilda

Adelaide Oval - 6:40pm (Sunday)

Port too powerful for inconsistent Saints

Amid a mounting injury toll, Port Adelaide simply got it done against a Carlton side that wanted to make a statement on a fine Saturday night at the MCG. It was a game with plenty to lose and win and the Power were the big beneficiaries.

With Dan Houston subbed out during the third quarter with a shoulder injury and Hamish Hartlett hammered with a corked thigh, Port powered to a 15.6 (96) to 9.14 (68) win. Led by the mercurial Robbie Gray (three first-half goals). Port Adelaide showed all its player depth as Miles Bergman admirably filled the void left by the long-term injury to Xavier Duursma. 'The Moving Mullet n Mo' in Lachie Jones was superb off half back and young key forwards Mitch Georgiadis and Todd Marshall showed the forward craft of seasoned veterans.

The latter pair arguably played their best games for the club while Jones' defensive sidekick Darcy Byrne-Jones returned to his 2020 All-Australian form with a sublime and polished display. Despite the close checking of Ed Curnow, the Power's marvel midfielder Travis Boak won the battle with 29 touches. Boak is a prime example of a player willing to sacrifice for the team and then getting back to what he does best leaving Curnow in his wake.

Sheer workrate.

Ollie Wines gets better and better and his ball use was creative while Aliir Aliir was, as what Melbourne Demon great Garry Lyon described as Alex Rance-esque in defence.

Few would disagree.

The Alberton Oval medical rooms will be busy during the week as the club medicos assess Huston's shoulder injury and Hartlett's corked thigh. Houston will have scans on his shoulder during the week and Port coach Ken Hinkley lauded the courage of the injured star duo. "He's in a sling," he said of Huston on afl.com.au. "He tried to come back on, but his wing was ineffective for him. "As we do always, we'll pass on the correct information as soon as he's scanned. "But I'd be guessing if I tried to tell you what it is now." The ball seemed to follow Hartlett and he tried in vain to compete.

Norwood will travel down to Richmond this Friday night to take on West Adelaide at Hisense Stadium. Both teams will look to bounce back after disappointing losses in Round 3. It will no doubt be an intriguing battle, as the Bloods are still searching for their first win to kick-start their season, whereas Norwood are looking to consolidate their spot in the top 4 and assert their ascendancy on the competition. While Westies are yet to register a win, they signaled in the first two rounds, that they can be competitive

despite suffering an unsatisfactory loss last round. Norwood on the other hand, with fast spread across the ground and silky skills, were embarrassed by North Adelaide last week and are trying to prove they are a serious finals contender.

As Norwood approach this match, they will know the game will be won or lost in the middle. The old football cliché cannot be closer to the truth for this match, as the Redlegs got bullied in the clearances last week 23 to 43 in favor of the opposition. This meant they couldn't get first look at the football and relied heavily upon rebound 50's to score, which allowed opposition players to flood back, hence they only managed an insubstantial 2 goals the whole match. Midfield players of the likes of Richard Douglas, Matthew Nunn and Bradley McKenzie are therefore crucial if Norwood want to make it 3-1 to start the season.

Fortunately for red and blue fans, Norwood's disposal efficiency has been first-rate the last 3 rounds and is expected to remain consistent throughout the season with classy ball users such as, Barry, Kennerly and Pedro having significant influences on games. Further, the Redlegs fast ball movement has been a staple of their game due to their smaller size. This means if the Redlegs can rectify their decision making and not overuse the ball, it is likely they will overwhelm the Bloods defense.

Yet for the 2629 spectators who watched their beloved red and black get trampled last week, they will be looking for a fervent response. The Bloods will need to repair several areas of their game, if they are to be victorious. Their inside 50 count is the most prevalent area of improvement, as they only managed 33 in comparison to Sturt's 67 last week. Coaches often stipulate that 45 or more inside 50's typically translate into wins. West Adelaide coach Brad Gotch, will be relying heavily upon Hugh Haysman for this, as Haysman is the 10th highest inside 50 supplier in the competition, with 13 in three matches. Gotch will also look to Kane Stevens and Patrick Fairlie to provide assistance around the ground, as they have been top ball winners in the Blood's past three matches. There has been an even supply of goal kickers this season with Johnson, Gore, Beech and Koster kicking a collective of 17 goals. It could also be warning signs for Norwood if Keough manages to find his prolific best, after booting the most goals for the club last season.

It will be a fascinating contest between the two sides and ultimately give a more thorough indication of where the two teams sit. The match will likely say more about Norwood, as it will decipher whether they are a genuine flag contender or a middle of the road team. The Bloods have not played finals since 2015 and if they do not want to repeat history, this is a must win match. Nevertheless, I think the Redlegs superior disposal efficiency will allow them to move the ball faster and ultimately overcome initial resistance from the Bloods outfit. Norwood by 25-36

Full disclaimer: I have not seen much footy from either team in the last month; I have been busy watching their respective women's teams. At any rate, all teams are coming off a loss, but there is a thing or two that both Adelaide and Central Districts could learn from their women counterparts.

The Central Districts men were truly outmuscled by Glenelg last week. They lost every differential and were smashed in the air, taking three contested marks to the Bays' 18. Whereas Shelby Smith outmuscled all comers for her 19 positions on Saturday, for the Dogs women; nearest teammate Paige Allan had 10. 'You Dogs' all came hard at Glenelg in the fourth quarter, the men managed two goals, while the women managed three, trimming the margin to three points before full time hit. Both teams kicked four goals eight last week, neither proving enough to earn a win. The women also kicked nine goals last fortnight at Adelaide Oval, where the men

managed only seven against Port Adelaide, at Alberton.

Watching that game last week, I must say that the doggies played extremely well to be four goals up at the half against Port Adelaide. I wrote in last week's preview that it was Port's sheer pride that got them over the line at home. But that excellent first half was well setup by clinical clearance work and deep entries inside fifty, which is a recipe the Dogs need to get back to, quick-smart. Both teams are one win two losses, and for one team, it may be a bridge too far to catch the top five – after only a month of footy. It is a critical game.

Central Districts will enjoy a return to home at X Convenience oval. The Dogs are likewise a proud club when at home, something I saw in the women's rousing win against the Bloods, one that truly reignited their season. Can the men do the same? Adelaide's first proper tilt at a premiership was their last season, in 2019, coming short in the preliminary final. Luke Reynolds got under 'em, and Glenelg got over 'em by five goals, then the pandemic put paid to 2020 for Adelaide's newish SANFL team.

That team often included Bryce Gibbs, who put up 200 touches in seven games, averaging seven clearances, fifteen kicks, five marks and 110 dream team points. So, to watch Gibbs kick a match winning goal for South against Port last week brought melancholy unto this Adelaide Crows AFL fan. It is predictably the engine room that needs revving up at Adelaide if they are to stay in the mix. If they are not to win it at the 'coal face', then the Crows must chase bloody hard after their opponents' footy. Much like the Crows women's team did in the leadup to their third AFLW Final appearance in four complete seasons.

They ran down Collingwood in the last of the rounds, then they ran down Melbourne in a Prelim for good measure, with ferocious tackling pressure. Come Saturday, it was to be Brisbane's day in the sun – maiden premiership secured. On Saturday, the Adelaide Crows SANFL men had three times as many hitouts as Woodville-West, from which they managed 27 clearances. The Eagles incredibly had 40 clearances from just 20 hitouts. Your opponents will kick 20 goals on you, every week that happens, because they are toujours at the fall of the ball. The Crows women may have limped and crawled to the finish line on Saturday. The Crows men let their opponents walk all over them. As an isolated incident, fine. But it has happened twice in three weeks. If the Crows let them, every dog will have his day at home this coming Saturday. The Crows have their backs to the wall; they've no choice but to compete. Central District by 1-12 points

During Round 4 of the 2021 SANFL season, Port Adelaide head down to the Bay to take on Glenelg at the ACH Group Stadium. This shapes as an intriguing game with the Tigers producing 3 wins from their first three games and the Magpies will be wanting to get their season rolling after starting at 1-2. So far, Glenelg have won their first three matches relatively comfortably with two 5 goal wins. On the other hand, Port Adelaide, stocked up with AFL talent have struggled to translate that into early wins.

Glenelg are coming off a convincing win against Central Districts in which they won by 34 points. This could have been an even larger win with the Tigers being inaccurate throughout the match and kicking 10.16. The clearance numbers were even all the way through the game; however, it was what Glenelg were able to do after the initial contest was done that was crucial to their win. They smashed the Bulldogs for disposals, recording 79 more, and were then able to translate this into inside 50 entries from which they could then hit the scoreboard. Also, they had 15 more contested marks than Centrals which meant that they often had marks inside 50 or down the line from a kick-out giving them easy access going forward. Lachie Hosie continued his good start the season, kicking 3 goals for the second time this season, however, it could have been more as he had 3 behinds as well. Jack Hannath was huge in the ruck with 31 hit outs and a goal whilst Luke Partington continued his fine form with 26 disposals.

This will be back-to-back away games for Port Adelaide after their tight 9-point loss to South Adelaide last weekend. They would have been hoping for a better start the season given their list, however, it hasn't quite panned out that way so far. Like Glenelg, they were wasteful inside 50 against the Panthers, kicking 10.12. They had more inside 50s but couldn't convert enough with Schofield, Farrell and Surman the main culprits, all kicking multiple behinds. Peter Ladhams being dropped from the AFL side meant they could play two rucks with Sam Hayes being the other. This led to a 42-14 hit out discrepancy in Port's favour, which then resulted in a large win in the clearances, however, still they couldn't generate enough good looks inside 50. Tom Rockliff (41 disposals) and Sam Powell-Pepper (1 goal and 18 disposals) were doing everything they could to get Port over the line and should be in contention for an AFL call up soon. Cam Sutcliffe was terrific as well with 3 goals, 29 disposals and 7 tackles and showed that he still has what it takes to perform at a high level.

In 2019 these two sides played against each other in two finals with results going each way, however, Glenelg got the ultimate prize after beating the Magpies by 28 points in the Grand Final. Glenelg were well and truly the best team on the day but again, Port's goal kicking cost them as they kicked 6.9. The best for the Magpies was Jack Trengove with 25 disposals and for Glenelg Matthew Snook took home the Jack Oatey Medal with 28 disposals and 12 tackles. To say the Roosters dominated on Friday night is an absolute understatement. Woodville-west Torrens got back on the winner's list last week, making easy work of the Adelaide Crows at Woodville Oval on Saturday afternoon. After a disappointing loss to the Bays a week earlier, the Eagles came out firing against the crows, kicking the first four goals of the match. The Eagles had 26 more inside '50s for 18 more scoring shots, as well as winning the disposal count by 135. Saturday was also the first time since Round 2 2018 a team had scored 24 or more goals in a game.

The Eagles had the first five disposal winners of the match, and one of them was former Adelaide Crows player Riley Knight who was the leading disposal getter. Knight mustered up 34 disposals, including ten clearances, as well as kicking two goals and claiming second best. Jack Hayes was the best on the ground collecting 33 disposals and three goals. Zane Williams and Tyson Stengle both kicked four goals as well as claiming sixth and fourth best, respectively. James Tsitas and Jimmy Toumpas collected 27 disposals each, with Tsitas collecting third best and Toumpas claiming sixth best to round out the Eagles best players. If the Eagles play and score like they did on Saturday then, it's going to be a big effort to stop the 2020 premiers.

This will be a fantastic Grand final rematch with quality players from both sides everywhere on the field. With two quality midfield line-ups, this game is going to be of a great standard. Tex Walker, you have proven the football world wrong.

Prior to the 2021 season, many critics, myself included, believed the best had past for Taylor Walker. He was getting in the way of the developing Darcy Fogarty and Elliot Himmelberg, and was trying to hold on to his career that wasn't showing much love back. I was one who was calling for Tex to retire, to give the game up and allow the Adelaide Football Club to move forward without him (in an on-field sense).

Scrutinised from every angle for multiple reasons, whether warranted or not both on and off-field since the 2017 Grand Final, Tex Walker has defied his critics to start his 2021 campaign in career-best form.

This is not a one-game wonder, nor is it a case of being a 'flat-track bully', In five games, Walker has kicked bags of five (against reigning Grand Finalist Geelong), six against the Swans (undefeated after three games) the Gold Coast Suns (possible finals contenders), three against a struggling North Melbourne and two against the resurgent Fremantle in what has been a refreshing and unexpected return to form.

Not only has he been hitting the scoreboard, Tex looks fresh and fit, is running all over the ground with ease and has averaged 17 possessions, seven marks and three Inside 50s thus far in 2021. Tex's form has coincided with what has been a surprising start for the supposed wooden-spoon contenders Adelaide, who have surprised the competition with a 3-2 start to the season under second-year coach Matthew Nicks.

Adelaide has a strong nucleus of experienced, middle-aged players including Walker, captain Rory Sloane, Brodie Smith, Rory Laird, Paul Seedsman and Tom Lynch who have all been collecting their share of the football in the middle and made solid starts to 2021, all averaging above-average numbers, with Adelaide placed fourth for average clearances. It has however, been the young players who have most impressed.

First-year player James Rowe has injected a real spark in Adelaide's potent forward 50, scoring four goals from three games, a couple from tight angles and playing that classic small forward role. Specialising in crumbing the packs and sneaking out the back to set up other players. Ned McHenry (12 possessions ave), Sam Berry (five tackles ave) and Shane McAdam (11 goals) give Adelaide fans plenty to look forward to not only this year, but in the years to come.

The new man on the mark rule introduced this year has allowed a quicker-paced flow and allows the ball to spring from one end of the ground to the other at a typically more efficient and freeflowing rate and allows key forwards like Walker to run off their man and lead at the ball rather than

needing to take pack-marks, something Walker has had stifled in his game in previous years with slow ball movement. Above-average conversion rate of 61% goal kicking accuracy helps too.


This incredible start to the season sees emerging forwards Darcy Fogarty and Elliott Himmelberg without major game time early days in 2021.

Freeze or Fifty!!

There are several new rules or rule modification for this season The most significant of which is that the player on the mark can't move once the umpire calls stand, until the umpire then calls play on or it is a 50 metre penalty.



Every year there are rule changes some appear as just being changed for the sake of making a change but really have no impact.

However, this latest rule change has really made an impact on the game. After round 1 and some of the 50m penalties paid it looked like a rule change that was ruining the game. It definitely sped up the game while the players and umpires were adjusting to the new rule but it didn't benefit the game it was having the opposite effect.

It could well be argued and probably rightly so that it is not a new rule it is really just the umpires now enforcing a rule that has always been there but very rarely enforced until this season.

The power full forward is once again a feature of the game and they have returned to having a significant impact.

The older full forwards such as Lance Franklin, Jack Riewold, Josh Kennedy and Taylor Walker who at the start of this season it would have been more than reasonable to expect that this could well be their last season, Now they may well be able to extend their careers to play on for at least another season.

The perfect example of how the rule speeds up the game, creates higher scoring and a better spectacle was clearly evident on Friday night when West Coast played Collingwood.

West Coast Eagles have had in previous seasons an imposing forward line. Now with the new player on the mark rule and them having all 3 of their power high flying power forwards in Kennedy, Darling and Allen playing they put on an entertaining spectacle as they crushed the Collingwood defence's. They clearly demonstrated how this new rule change benefits strong marking power forwards and with having the luxury of three in the one side they would have surely given all opposition defensive coaches nightmares on Friday night.

Has it increased the overall scoring from recent seasons? Well that is not really possible to tell as in 2020 the quarters were of reduced length and the interchange cap for that season and the previous season was 90. In 2021 the interchange cap has been reduced to 75. Reducing the amount of player rotations can potentially have an affect on player fatigue and the game scores making comparisons to previous years not really relevant.

There have been some good rule modifications over the past 10 years and some not so good changes such as the super sub rule which was thankfully deleted in 2016. However, this time with the "stand or it's 50 metres" rule it appears that the AFL has got it right. It not only makes it a more entertaining game to watch it genuinely appears to actually have improved the game itself. Hopefully this is one change that is here to stay and that with it the high flying, crowd drawing, stadium filling, full forwards remain a spectacular feature of the great game.

The return of the power forward?

The first five rounds of the season have seen more action occurring inside forward 50's, something all football enthusiasts wish to see. More footballs are being slotted through the big sticks and the power forwards who patrol the forward 50's are doing the slotting. Increased forward action seen in the first five rounds begs a big question that the course of the season will answer. Is this the long-awaited return of the power forwards?

Further adjustments to the game rules made by the AFL, something that we have all been acclimatising to in the last few seasons. A significant rule change that was made by the officiators of our great game was the 'man on the mark'. This adjustment has created debate of much controversy as players must not deviate from the mark at all. Any form of movement from the mark will result in a 50-metre penalty; players are umpires are still adapting to this change. However, this change has strongly worked in favour for forwards.

The lack of movement on the mark enforces quicker movement of the football and it allows midfielders to effectively deliver to players on leads. The primary trait of a power forward is to provide strong leads and this rule change has granted them the service they have been desiring. The statistics of the season so far are showing that the presence of a power forward is strengthening, and this will come as a sign to the AFL that the man on the mark rule adjustment has worked a charm.

A pivotal statistic raising eyebrows is marks inside the forward 50. Carlton's emerging power forward Harry McKay is currently leading the competition with 22 marks inside 50 within the first five rounds, followed by Geelong spearhead, Tom Hawkins with 20. The increased forward 50 marking is attributed to the man on the mark rule change as the kickers are not pressured by the mark, allowing them to move quicker and select better options (to leads) rather than resorting to the long ball.

Contestant marking in congested packs is a challenge haunting power forwards who would much rather be fed the ball on a lead. Faster ball movement has resulted in the ball being delivered to them more conventionally, providing them more chances to convert.

A prime example is Adelaide veteran spearhead, Taylor 'Tex' Walker who currently leads the Coleman Medal (22 goals). The Texan is a forward who must be fed the ball on the lead; he is being provided the service as he is sixth in the competition in inside 50 marks (17) and 2020 saw Tex notch only 10 inside 50 marks. Walker's resurgence has been one of the stories of the season and highlights the return of dominance of power forwards.

Josh Bruce of the Western Bulldogs kicked 10 goals against North Melbourne in round three: a rare and remarkable feat in modern football. Along with Bruce's 10, McKay kicked seven and Walker kicked six. Round three proved to be a great haul for the big men in the forward line and everyone loves to see a bag. In 25 of the first 26 games of the season, the winning sides had more inside 50 marks. So far, 2021's match winning formula is to get on the correct side of the register in forward 50 marks.

The new season has so far shown that power forwards are making a steady return, and this is extremely exciting for all that love our game. We have so far seen contests of higher scoring and the power forward spearheads cashing in. Forwards are finally receiving the service, and all will have their eyes peeled on the Coleman Medal race. A significant rule change is allowing the power forwards with increased service and opportunity to convert. For the better of the AFL; the 2021 season could dawn the return of the autonomous power forward.

The revival of TEX

Taylor Walker, the man known as "Tex". This season has seen the veteran key forward revitalise his career with 20 goals after just the first 4 rounds. Rewind the clock back to the end of last season and many were tipping that season 2021 was going to Walkers last as his spot in the team was going to be taken over by his successor Darcy Fogarty who was taken at pick 12 in the 2017 draft. Given the iconic

number 32 worn by arguably the greatest ever Crows player Mark Ricciuto, Fogarty has been tipped as the Crows' next big thing with Walker firmly looked at in the rear-view mirror as a has been player. Enter the 2020 off season and Tex hit pre-season training with a mission in mind, looking to make a stand that he is here to stay and won't be squeezed out of the team by some plucky youngster. He returned this year looking leaner, more mobile and kicking with power and confidence and having a huge presence on the field as he started with a bang kicking 5 goals in a 12-point upset of last Grand Finalists Geelong. He then followed that up back-to-back 6 goal hauls in round's 2 and 3 and a further 3 majors in the latest game. This is his best start to a season, and he is only the second player in 30 years to kick 5 or more goals in the first 3 rounds of a season after Jonathan Brown achieved back in 2010.

Many have pointed at the new "stand" rule change implemented at the start of the season which prevents the man on the mark from leaving his position to try and nullify the kickers next piece of play. This allows the ball carrier to play on more and break the oppositions line of defence therefore freeing up their forwards and playing to their advantage by hitting them with lead up kicks. This is where Walker is at his best because he never has been and never will be a high-flying crash and bash contested marker. He's a leading forward in which he wants to ball straight out in front of him and benefits well from a well kicking midfield who know how to deliver the ball well. So far this season the Crows have done, and Tex has breathed new life into his career by doing so. The new "stand" rule change is by far not the only reason for Walker's resurgence as his confidence is through the roof thus far, you can see it in the way he plays, he wants to be out there and not burdened with too many responsibilities that in his last years as captain he struggled to juggle. The burden of being the captain eventually took a tole on the power forward as in the 2018, 2019 and 2020 season's his influence and performance were going downhill at a rapid rate. As the all-time Adelaide Crows leading goalkicker now he must've seen his career slipping right through his fingers as the rest of the footballing world did quite clearly. Whether it be a multitude of factors or just one simple rule change, Taylor "Tex" Walker is back and is not only leading the Coleman Medal thus far but is also leading the AFL Coaches votes too. This is one of the biggest stories of the year and it'll only get better.

Berry Energizes Adelaide

Unexpected, amazing, are both accurate descriptions of Adelaide's start to the season.

There are several new faces in the team this year and none have been more impressive or instrumental in Adelaide's rise from the bottom of the table last season to a top 8 contender than Sam Berry.

Berry at only 19 from Gippsland Power made his Afl debut for Adelaide in round 1 and has gone from strength to strength. At the end of round 3 Berry was ranked fourth in the league in pressure acts, sixth for tackles and nineth for, pressure acts in defensive half. highly impressive for a first season player

Taylor Walker has had an incredible start to the season kicking more goals in the first three matches than the entire season last yea. There is no doubting that he is a power house forward and a very accurate kick. However, a major reason for the impressive start to the season is he has been getting the ball delivered to him from the midfield a lot faster and better-quality delivery than in recent years. This is due to a large extent of the new look midfield which is a lot more efficient and effective than it has been for several years Berry has been a significant part of this with the pressure he applies to opposition midfielders and at every opportunity he is always looking for an attaching option and to move the ball quickly forward. This is a significant change from the Adelaide we have been used to seeing in recent times where they were overusing the ball in the midfield and as a first option, they would look for a sideways pass the majority of the time instead of looking up the field. Thus, allowing the opposition, a huge amount of time to get into their defensive positions and shut down avenues to goal. The new look Adelaide moves the ball forward quickly and allows Walker and McAdam first use of the ball and the result of this is obvious with Walker currently leading the Coleman Medal on twenty goals and McAdam in the nineth on the top goal scorers list for the season with ten goals

Sam Berry has added a new dimension to the Adelaide, through his speed and pressure he generates with his high tackle numbers he has created multiple turnovers and scoring opportunities. The fortunes of Adelaide have without any doubt turned around in this current season as with only four matches played, they have won three which equals the total amount of wins they had for 2020. Maybe Berry is the spark to re-ignite Adelaide to once again be a genuine finals contender.


