

Adelaide Crows v GWS

Adelaide Oval - 2.10pm (Saturday)

Adelaide: The one that got away

For the first time in 2021 the Adelaide Crows have suffered consecutive defeats going down to Hawthorn in Launceston by three points. Excitement was in the air before the game when the Crows announced Jackson Hately and Riley Thilthorpe would be playing their first games for the club. Drafted with pick two in the 2020 draft, Thilthorpe was the name on everyone's lips and the biggest positive out of the game. The key-forward starred on debut kicking five goals and the 18-year-old will surely be in line for an instant Rising Star nomination.





The result however will feel like one that got away for Adelaide. The sharp shooting Crows were in complete control at half-time leading by 25 points after kicking a remarkable 14 goals without a miss. When Thilthorpe booted the opening goal of the third term to blow the margin out beyond five goals it seemed how far Adelaide before the Hawks rallied to reduce the margin to 13 points at three quarter time. The final term was all Hawthorn who probably should have made more of their dominance when they kicked 2.6 to Adelaide's two behinds, but it was enough to hold on for a thrilling victory. After pumping up his tyres in previous weeks it was another good performance from Paul Seedsman who gathered 27 disposals, kicked a goal, and had six score involvements. Ben Keays and Rory Laird got plenty of the ball and three goals for Taylor Walker sees him remain top of the Coleman Medal chart.

There is still plenty of work to do for Matthew Nicks and the coaching staff before hosting GWS next Saturday at Adelaide oval. The Adelaide defenders as a collective did not have the best day out against Hawthorn. Jacob Koschitzke kicked five goals and for this first time this season Hawthorn kicked over 100 points.

The media spotlight should be on the performance of Riley Thilthorpe but the use of Tom Lynch as the medical sub is likely to dominate the headlines. Reports before the game suggested Lynch was struggling with a toe injury and when called upon to replace the injured Will Hamill took an extraordinary amount of time to make his way onto the field. Jason Dunstall in commentary for Fox Footy bewildered by the situation "There's a story to that because it is unprofessional if the sub isn't ready to go. There's something wrong there"

The crafty Port Adelaide Power pair of Steven Motlop and Orazia Fantasia (three goals each) snared six goals between them as the Power waltzed to a 14.9 (93) to 5.9 (39) win against a disappointing St Kilda at Adelaide Oval. Put simply, it was a dim night for St Kilda with the only highlight coming from Jack Higgins who booted a goal of the year contender and first of the game on the boundary line.

Perhaps a more excited reaction from Higgins could have sent the right message to the rest of the players rather than the flat one he delivered as soon as the goal was kicked. His real response mirrored how the Saints played for the most part of the remainder of the game.

Port's left footed wingman Karl Amon amassed 34 disposals in a PB performance while midfielder Ollie Wines was awarded the Anzac Day Peter Badcoe Medal for best afield (36 disposals). Port coach Ken Hinkley said his team showed maturity amid St Kilda's early forward-entry dominance.

"There's absolutely no doubt we controlled the game, we played a really calm and composed game of football," Hinkley told afl.com.au. "We knew the threat, and we knew how hard St Kilda would come, particularly early. "We took on the risk, and managed it really well."

The Saints could not apply early scoreboard pressure as Port Adelaide built on its lead at every break. Motlop scored goals twice in the first term while Mitch Georgiades was the beneficiary of two 50-metre penalties in the second stanza as the Power buried the game at half-time. Port's debutant Martin Frederick was super impressive off half back and he provided an exciting dash and composure.

Both he and Aliir Aliir were a treat to watch while captain Tom Jonas was a repelling force in defence. Dan Houston and Hamish Hartlett both took heavy hits last week against Carlton, but you wouldn't know it as the pair looked full of verve and sharp with their ball handling. Their team-mate Ryan Burton was superb off half-back as the Power brace for a Brisbane Lions test in Brisbane this Saturday night.

Norwood v South Adelaide

South's Sensational Start

South Adelaide will take on Norwood this Friday night at Coopers Stadium. The two sides have thus far shown a contrast in playing ability as seen by the ladder disparity. While Norwood made it two losses in a row after falling three goals short of West Adelaide, the panthers marched to a fourth straight win defeating Sturt. The upcoming battle will be fascinating because South Adelaide are yet to truly feel the heat from a side, winning only one game this year decided under 10 points. This means if Norwood can generate their natural running game South may face their first loss of the season.

Norwood will look to redeem themselves by defeating the competitions best team. Last week would have been a hard pill to swallow, due to the circumstances in which they lost. They could not get their hands on the ball, losing the disposal count by a whooping 44. Although Norwood were able to win the clearances 43 to 26 and inside 50's 44 to 32, the entries were ill directed, which allowed the opposition to dominate defensive interceptions. Norwood coach Jade Rawlings will target this area, as the panthers have demonstrated in their early games that once they gain possession, they make the most of it. On Friday night the bloods were also able to generate many scores from a superior scoring accuracy and 37 rebound 50's. This is an impressive statistic but is not surprising, given Norwood failed to apply sufficient pressure laying a dismal 56 tackles.

The promising news for Norwood fans is they have the arsenal to defeat any opposition. Spectators only need to rewind the clock to last week, where stars of the game such as Matthew Nunn and Jacob Kennerly generated 15 clearances and 47 disposals between them. This will be pivotal if the red legs want to nullify South's effective ball use across the ground. The red and blue army are also reliant on their competitiveness through Jackson Callow and Cole Gerloff. Despite a dominant inside 50 count, they lost the arial battle which allowed their opposition to create scores from rebound 50's.

On the other end of the spectrum, South Adelaide have shown they are a genuine premiership threat. One of South Adelaide's greatest style differences between opponents has been their control on the game. Unlike the red legs who had only 56 marks on the weekend, the panthers have averaged 106 marks the last 3 weeks. This has enabled them to dominate disposal counts and control the game. Further, while the panthers do not have great disposal or scoring efficiency, they have demonstrated that through constant supply of inside 50's, defenders become overwhelmed and eventually concede scores. This is vital for Norwood to eliminate if they are to manufacture their style of fast play and catch the panthers defense out of position.

The panthers have had even contributions through both their experienced players and upcoming stars. Ex-Australian Football League players Bryce Gibbs and Matthew Broadbent have found the ball regularly and been prolific with their ball use, as Gibbs averages 29 disposals a game at 71% and Broadbent 23 disposals a game at 96%. This has been able to set up their style of play and allow the young guns of Hayden Sampson, Liam Fitt and Eamon Wilkinson to flourish and ultimately put scores on the board.

Despite the panthers coming in favorites, it would be naive to ever dismiss a prestigious club like Norwood. However, as the panthers hunt a 12th premiership in season 2021, it is very important they are able to establish early wins to set up their season. South Adelaide by 1-12.

By contrast, the only time North Adelaide have got going this season was two weeks ago, away against the Redlegs. But boy did they get going, holding Norwood Football Club to just two goals whilst piling on 16 themselves. The only rouble is Woodville-West Torrens kicked 24 that same day. Then, come last week's grand final replay, The Eagles were strong enough for long enough to repeat their victory over North Adelaide... but only just. North had a slim lead for a slim duration in the fourth and looked set to hold on, with familiar names standing strong at half back – Alex Spina had 31 touches and Jarred Allmond 30. They needed urgently to hold strong, as despite it being an extremely even contest, the Roosters conceded 20 more inside fifties.

To concede victory by only three behinds from such a deficit shows that North Adelaide are not far off the pace. Joseph Sinor has now quietly kicked one goal a week for three weeks straight – the latest turning this result on its head, right when the Roosters held the lead the longest. This means that the Eagles knocked the Roosters out of the top five. The Bays knocked the Magpies out of the top five on the weekend too. We must not forget that Glenelg are the pace setters this season (alongside South) and they showed that when they defeated the Eagles two weeks prior, with relative ease.

Their attack is elite, choc-full of familiar faces too. Lachie Hosie, Luke Reynolds and Liam McBean have each kicked goals every week thus far, if you don't mind. Perhaps they can replicate the Jacks, Jakes and James' of the Eagles back in 2020, providing a constant presence up forward and a headache for the opposition back six. I like North Adelaide's strategy in the ruck, building from the latter half of last year. I could write about Lewis Hender all week as one of my favorite forwards, big or small; but last week he went unseen. I think he will be back to his best, and so too will the Magarey Medalist Campbell Coombe, plus a host of other contributors. Against the competition's best the Roosters have conceded bigger runs of points than they have put on. Like in volleyball, that is a surefire way to lose a game you have otherwise played well enough to win.

North Adelaide can string it all together and it will define their season if they can or can't in the next fortnight. They may have handed out the season's biggest drubbing, but to date it's their only win. It is high time for them to grind out a couple of wins, be they pretty or ugly, and the Roosters will be right back on track. They can start with one at home on Saturday lunchtime. Bloods to go back-to-back to get their season rolling

As Round 5 of the SANFL season gets underway, West Adelaide host Central District at Hisense Stadium.

Both sides have started the season poorly as both sides head into this game with just the one win each.

On a positive note, both sides have been very competitive in most if not all of their games so far so this should be an exciting game of footy, regardless of what the current ladder suggests. The Bulldogs recorded their first win in round one against the Roosters whilst the Bloods are coming off a 3-goal win against the Redlegs.



The Bloods come into this game with only one win, however, two of their losses were by under 12 points, with a 50-point loss to Sturt their only really bad blemish. Last Friday night's game against an out of form Norwood side was the perfect opportunity to get their season on track. They took this opportunity and ran out 18-point winners. Surprisingly, they had 12 less inside 50s than the Redlegs, however, they were able to score on over half of their entries which was the key to their victory. This win was a very even performance with a lot of players contributing, but it was Jordan Boyle (33 disposals) and Edward Allen (24 disposals, 1 goal and 9 tackles) who were the best on the ground and fought until the end to get their side over the line.

Centrals on the other hand, recorded their only win in round one and are coming off three consecutive losses. Their recent loss to Adelaide was by 23 points, however, it could have been a lot more if not for a second half fight back. In the third quarter alone, they managed to kick 4 goals to Adelaide's 1 which brought the margin back to two goals, but Adelaide kicked back in the last and ran out convincing winners. The Bulldogs didn't do a lot wrong, in the end it came down to the fact that Adelaide got off to a fast start that Centrals couldn't really peg back throughout the game. Adelaide was simply the better team on the day kicking 16.7 with forward Billy Frampton kicking 7.3. 


Sturt v Adelaide

In round 3, the Crows were belted by 14 goals at the hands of last years' premiers and were never in the game.

Fast forward seven days, the script is reversed with the Crows leading at every change and always in control against Central Districts at Elizabeth.

Big Billy Frampton who was dropped from AFL duties, returned to SANFL football by booting a bag of seven goals from 10 shots. Sturt currently sit at the bottom of SANFL ladder (percentage behind 9th placed Central). With only one win from the first month of season 2021, Sturt need to take control of their season. The next fortnight will challenge the Double Blues and can make or break their season. Matches against the Crows this week, and then an away fixture against the unbeaten Tigers, could mean a slow start to season 2021, could become a real nightmare, real quick.

The Crows were dominant last week, and with Riley Thilthorpe and Elliot Himmelberg both kicking goals against Hawthorn, Frampton will likely stay in the SANFL side which will threaten Sturts leaky defence. Crows 25-36 points.



It is an exciting time for football as we are weathering a transitional phase, we are getting a small taste and preview into what our great game could look like in the future. The past couple of seasons have seen the empathic entrances and births of exciting young talents; for example, Matt Rowell, Max King, Zak Butters, Sam Walsh and Bailey Smith, to name a few.

The past 10-15 seasons has seen the AFL be dominated by some of the greatest players to step on a football field such as Gary Ablett Jnr, Lance Franklin, Patrick Dangerfield, Scott Pendlebury, Dustin Martin and Nat Fyfe. Players such as Ablett Jnr have hung up their boots, but the other great veterans mentioned are entering the twilight periods of their illustrious careers. Adelaide's emerging players such as Lachie Scholl, Jordan Butts and newly introduced Riley Thilthorpe are being mentored by Adelaide veterans Taylor Walker, Rory Sloane and Daniel Tahlia.

All clubs in the AFL are possessing young exciting talents who will bring our great game forward, and clubs such as Port Adelaide, Gold Coast and Adelaide are primarily forming their squads with youth who are being guided by senior veterans. Geelong has the oldest list in the AFL with the average squad age of 25.3 are not embracing youth to build a future legacy. That Elusive Flag

Over the past number of years, intrigue has increased around Lance "Buddy" Franklin's huge move from Hawthorn to Sydney on a record 9-year deal worth roughly a million a year. Many would say that Franklin's career at Sydney has been a failure due to the fact that he hasn't won a flag with them. Many others have said that he's only gotten better, and his individual resume has propelled him well into the conversation of one of if not the game's greatest player. Franklin however, still one won two premierships with his old club so measuring his success at Sydney can only go so far because will always say "well at least he's won a flag". There have been many players who have been hailed as some of the greatest players of all time but have never won a premiership. Players such as Nick Riewoldt, Patrick Dangerfield, Nathan Buckley, Matthew Pavlich and Robert Harvey just to name a few. All of these players have an amazing list of accolades with multiple times All-Australians, Brownlow's and even Norm Smith's with Nathan Buckley famously winning the award in the 2002 Grand Final where he captained Collingwood to a heartbreaking loss to Brisbane.

There is often the conclusion that these players are almost underrated in a way when comparing them to a player who might not be as gifted as a footballer but is incomparable when it comes to winning premierships. Take Luke Hodge for example, a stalwart of the Hawthorn Football Club one of the best players the game has seen especially when it comes to finals. His resume speaks for itself, 2 Norm Smith medals, 4 premierships and 3 of them as captain. That aside and looking at him as just a pure footballer, Hodge does not come close to someone like Robert Harvey. Harvey, with back-to-back Brownlow's, 8 All-Australians and a number of other individual awards, but no premierships, not a single one. The only time Harvey came close to winning a flag was in 1997 against the Adelaide Crows in which his team (St Kilda) lost after leading for most of the afternoon. He then came agonisingly close in 3 losing preliminary finals before retiring at the conclusion of the 2008 season. Nathan Buckley and Nick Riewoldt both played in successive losing Grand Finals and both were captains of their respective teams. Both were phenomenal players in their own right but at times get overlooked when in the conversation of the game's greatest players that of course includes premierships. Luck does play a part too like a player such as Joel Selwood who has evolved into a fine player and one of the best of the modern era but has also been fortunate to play in a team which has regularly challenged for the premiership and by just his fourth year of playing, he had already played in 3 consecutive grand finals winning 2. The question mark will forever hang over players listed above as the big zero in the list of premierships won unfortunately outweighs all of their individual achievements. Many of them have said that they would trade all of their awards for a flag just one, just to experience what it's like actually winning a premiership. That being said premierships should not be the only way to measure if a player is good or not. Footy is a cruel and tough game though and winning premierships is that much harder.

There is always a lot of hype and expectation of young players taken high in the end of season AFL Draft. There is a high percentage of top 2 draft picks that make it to playing afl and over 90% of them will play on average will play more than 100 games.

The Adelaide crows in 2020 used their first draft pick, number 2 pick of the draft to secure the young 18 year old Riley Thilthorphe from West Adelaide. Riley at 202cm tall is a highly versatile player having played 12 games for West Adelaide in ruck, on the wing and as a key forward. He is very quick and agile for his size and also has great speed.making him a asset to any team.

It is always a big risk to talk about a player after just a debut game. They can be very nervous not perform at their best or have an off day and go onto be a Great of the game. The opposite is also true they can go out have a brilliant first game and never get close to a repeat performance for the rest of their playing career.

Riley debuted on the weekend against Hawthorn in Launceston. Expectations were high and his first quarter performance was average at best. However it was not long into the second quarter and everyone new the name Thilthorpe as he kicked three goals in quick succession showing great athletic skill in both the air and on the ground. He ended the game with an Adelaide Crow club record of 5 goals on the debut. Five goals on debut is obviously impressive, but well short of the most ever goals on debut which was also against the Hawthorn Football Club in 1949 when John Coleman kicked an incredible 12 goals.

The 5 goal haul obviously has drawn attention but the way he moved around the ground and his marking ability were the major standouts I think of his performance. There was the obvious question before the game how he would fit into the team being a ruck/forward player with O'Brien in the team in the ruck position and winning the club best and fairest award at the end for 2020. However Thilthorpe is still a young maturing player and probably not suited at this stage until he develops further to ruck duties and playing him in the forward line for now at least appears to be the perfect fit.

After one match there is still a long way to go to see if he will live up to expectations of the number 2 draft pick but he is definitely on his way with what he has shown so far. One mark he took in front of goals was like a mark of another full forward who also played for West Adelaide he debuted for the Crows in 2012 had only 5 disposals and kicked 1 goal 3. His name was Tony Modra.

Every pre-season we seem to hear the same thing on repeat, the most boring of broken records.

'Carlton were just a little off in some key areas last season which cost them important games.'

'If they didn't lose those two or three close games they would have made the finals.'

'If Player A and Player B got a good run with injury, that would have been the difference.'

'This is **definitely** the year it all comes together.'

Six rounds in, they are once again in that familiar average 13th position with a disappointing 2-4 start, having won against fellow-mediocre and inconsistent Gold Coast and Fremantle but failing against premiership-contenders Richmond, Port Adelaide and Brisbane as well as arch-rival Collingwood. With games against the undefeated Western Bulldogs and Melbourne in the coming weeks, it is likely Carlton will be facing a 2-6 figure, possibly even 2-7 with a questionable game against Essendon also coming.

Their effort could not be questioned, but the execution is poor majority of the time. Despite being ranked sixth for Inside 50s (336 average), and having 57 against Port Adelaide in round 5, producing only nine goals. Rushed kicks, fundamental skill errors and bombing high, floating balls to outnumbered targets are killing them week after week.

With so many first-round draft picks on their list; Charlie Curnow, Harry McKay, Jack Silvagni (Father-Son), Jacob Weitering, Paddy Dow, Sam Petrevski-Seton and Sam Walsh, many of these names with multiple pre-seasons under their belt, the time would surely have arrived. But once again, as often is the case with Carlton, they continue with the 'give them time' excuses.

Currently sit third in the AFL for clearances, they have performed 'okay' in patches, but hardly enough to be considered genuine finals contenders. Granted, they haven't had the greatest luck on the injury front, with best-22 members Charlie Curnow, Jack Martin, Nic Newman and Zac Fisher out for the foreseeable future, but every club has injuries and it seems once Carlton has one player from their best side out, they see this as an excuse for not performing. Too much midfield pressure is placed on Patrick Cripps, who while still collecting his fair share of the football (26 possessions average), he does not seem as threatening as he has in previous years.

Another season of Mediocrity coming for the Blues?

While the young brigade do perform as well as they can, their experienced heads are simply either past their prime or just not performing in general. Marc Murphy is not playing well enough to remain in the team, at the ripe age of 33 the best has clearly past him. He averages 14 possessions and has little influence on the result. Levi Casboult has played every game as Carlton's go-to man in the forward line, yet has



only scored four goals at a woeful 36% accuracy from eight possessions (average). He doesn't even look threatening.

Carlton are not exactly terrible, their best 22 in theory looks a damaging side capable of performing consistently, but they are far from elite. They simply do not control the ball and use it efficiently. This is proven in the three major key performance stats, which never lie.
