Struggling Crows no match for Giants

The Adelaide Crows suffered their worst defeat of the season going down to GWS by 67 points in the round seven clash at Adelaide Oval. Less than a minute into the game Taylor Walker kicked the opening goal of the match but it was one way traffic from here on it with little for Adelaide fans to crow about for the rest of the day.

Adelaide fortunate that wayward kicking from the Giants saw the Crows only trail by seven points at quarter time. By half time the Giants dominance began to show on the scoreboard as the margin stretched beyond five goals and by the end of the game the margin had blown out to 11 goals.

GWS dominated all key performance indicators. Clearances, contested possessions, inside 50s, marks inside 50 and finished with 13 more scoring shots. The Giants had multiple avenues to goal with Jesse Hogan, Harry Himmelberg, Tom Green and Sam Reid all kicking multiple goals. For Adelaide Taylor Walker kicked 50 percent of Adelaide's goals with two.

A 41-17 clearance count in the Giants favour will be of massive concern for the Adelaide coaching staff. The Crows will be hoping to regain skipper Rory Sloane for the upcoming Showdown against Port Adelaide, who are also coming off a disappointing performance. Matthew Nicks was rightfully disappointed in his post-match interview and time will tell if a statement is made this week at the selection table.

Listless Port powerless against Lions

Port Adelaide Power were 7-6 up and with all the momentum as Charlie Dixon marked from a centreing kick from the returning Sam Powell-Pepper. However, Hamish Hartlett thought it best to remonstrate and the free kick was reversed and rewarded to the hosts. From that moment on, it was all the Brisbane Lions as the club registered a fourth-straight win over Port 13.15 (93) to 5.14 (44).

Amid from centre half back Aliir Aliir, midfield bull Ollie Wines and the emerging Willem Drew, there were no other winners for the Power. The Lions were magnificently served by Harris Andrews who thrashed Charlie Dixon while Charlie Cameron went on his motorbike motion best with four goals and Joe Daniher (two goals) was a presence working well in tandem with Eric Hipwood. The notion that Port Adelaide Power is a contender may need to be reconsidered and maybe, just maybe, some players read the media spoof and believed that the team was a premiership fancy. The way the players approached and played during Saturday night's letdown indicated that the side was anything but.

Port's coach Ken Hinkley was left frustrated after the game. "We couldn't handle some of the contest stuff," Hinkley said on the afl.com.au site. "Whether that was in front, or behind or in the middle - it was all over the ground. "We were nowhere near our best and the opposition was at their very best at what they were trying to do. "We go back to work, we learn, we take the lesson. We don't like the lesson, we don't like the taste of it, but we deserved it."

In-form Wines was superb with 37 possessions and Hinkley praised the midfielder. "Ollie I thought was amazing. He gave what he had. I think a few others could have jumped on with 'Ol'", he said. The Power missed Travis Boak (quad strain), but Brisbane missed Brownlow Medallist Lachie Neale. "It wouldn't have mattered if you had 22 Travis' out there tonight, we needed some support," the coach said.

Boak is expected to return for this weekend's Showdown against the Adelaide Crows - a team also eager to respond to an equally soft effort against improving Greatest Western Sydney Giants.

Eagles to break South's Heart

Rarely over the past few seasons would both the Eagles being playing the Panthers, a week after both teams coming of losses.

The Panthers were brave against a resurgent Norwood at the Parade last Friday night. Norwood who were staring down the barrel of three straight losses, wouldn't let this opportunity slip.

The Panthers fell nine points short despite keeping Norwood to three behinds in the last quarter. South

Adelaide could only manage six goals for the game. For the first time in season 2021, there were no multiple goal scorers on the night.

This was clearly their lowest score across the first five rounds. No doubt Jarred Wright will review their goal scoring opportunities as twelve scores from 35 Inside 50 entries isn't enough. Like their upcoming opponents, the Eagles second quarter wasn't one which will feature in the highlight reel. The Eagles conceded seven goals, whilst only scoring one themselves. At least after half time, the Magpies only scored five goals with Eagles closing the second half with three of their own.

Troy Menzel continues to lead on the scoreboard with three goals. Apart from Menzel, there wasn't a lot of support from the other forwards.

The Eagles just didn't win enough of the ball as Port racked up over 400 possessions for the match. The ruck was a challenge for the Eagles with Port Adelaide's ruckman winning Hit Outs (33 – 18). The Eagles did well to nullify the effectiveness of these Hit Outs by losing clearances by one.

After leading at half time, Centrals were defeated by a Bloods outfit last week, whereas Norwood corralled the Panthers to their first loss of the season. Just when the season appears to become predictable and the disparity between good and bad teams clear, there has been defining upsets. Therefore, while Norwood are clear favorites against the bottom sitting Dogs, the season has shown that it would be unwise to write the Dogs off.

As it sits, Centrals are 1-4. This is a record that Central Districts coach, Paul Thomas, will want to hurriedly change if they are to taste success in 2021. However, there are some fundamental issues facing the club this season, which are preventing them from winning games. The most glaring being their inability to run out games. During their last five matches they have lost four of five last halves. The collective score being 8 goals 25 behinds, to the oppositions 23 goals 21 behinds. In an aberration against the Crows where they won the last half, they still lost the last quarter 3 goals 2 behinds to 5 goals 4 behinds. Whether the cause is fitness related or brain errors is unknown, however what is obvious, is that if they are unable to play a consistent four quarter brand of football, it will be a very bleak year for Doggies fans.

Nevertheless, what is promising for Dogs' supporters is that they are getting enough look at the ball, as they have been competitive with all teams in areas of clearances, inside 50's and disposals. This has been led by the usual suspects including Kyle Presbury and Travis Schiller, who both average above 23 disposals, at more than 75 per cent by foot. Further, what has put a smile on supporter's faces has been the blossoming of young gun Harry Grant who is averaging 21.2 disposals, at 88 per cent after playing only 5 games. For Centrals to win this week, they will also rely on big performances from their key players up forward, such as Aiden Grace and Justin Hoskin who collectively have kicked 20 goals for the Dogs this season.

However, if Centrals want to pull off an upset they will have to perform well, as Norwood are coming off their most satisfying win of the season. After defeating South Adelaide last round, Norwood will look to make it two in a row. During the match last week, Norwood were able to get their hands on the ball regularly beating the Panthers in disposals 319 to 262. This enabled the Redlegs to get the footy into their prolific ball users such as Nelligan, Douglas and McKenzie. Through this quality ball use at 77 percent Norwood muscled 10 more inside 50's than the opposition.

One of the greatest concerns for Central Districts is the pressure Norwood were able to apply. Led by their midfield spearhead Matthew Nunn who acquired an unfathomable 16 tackles, the Redlegs won the tackle count and brought the heat. They no doubt look to replicate this which will make for a fascinating contest.

I believe Norwood will get the desired result, as they have shown that when they perform at their best, they are one of the most dangerous teams in the competition. Yet, as it is always the case after a satisfying win, clubs can become complacent and overconfident, which may leave the Doggy door ajar. Therefore, if Centrals can piece together a four-quarter performance for the first time this year, fans should not be surprised if an upset is to occur. Despite this, the red and blue have shown they are the better side this year and therefore I think they will win in a tight battle.

The fixture has been altered to ensure that this match acts as the curtain raiser for the AFL Showdown which will take place shortly after. Port Adelaide currently sit just inside the top 5 with a 2-3 record, whilst Adelaide is in 8th position with the same record but a slightly worse percentage.

The Magpies are coming off a commanding victory against Woodville-West Torrens in which the won by 60 points. The first quarter was tight and there was only one goal in it at quarter time, however, after that the flood gates opened and Port kicked 12 goals to the Eagles' 4 for the rest of the game. The inside 50 count was too uneven with the Magpies only having 9 more entries, but it was what they did with those entries that made the difference. They managed to score off over half of their inside 50s compared the Eagles who scored off only 29% of theirs. This meant that they were able to score with ease and their forward line was clearly too much for the Eagles' defence to handle which allowed them to keep running the scoreboard up. Peter Ladhams showed his class with 1.3 along with 23 disposals and 15 hit outs whilst Tom Rockliff (34 disposals), Kane Farrell (31 disposals) and Jarrod Lienert (27 disposals) continue to push their case for AFL selection. Ben Edwards was the standout in front of goals kicking 4 with Cam Sutcliffe and Dylan Williams kicking 3 each.

Adelaide on the other hand lost by 1 point in a thrilling encounter at Peter Motley Oval against Sturt. For much of the final term they looked like they were going to win with late goals to James Matthews and Mitchell Marini almost sealing the deal. In the end it took a set shot from Sturt's Ashley Johnson to steal the victory from a very tight angle to break Adelaide's hearts. In a one-point loss there wasn't much Adelaide did wrong, apart from the fact that they allowed Sturt to score from over half of their inside 50s. Their defence could handle the likes of Ashley Johnson (4 goals) and Mark Evans (3 goals) and it could have been a larger margin if Sturt had kicked straighter than they did. This could cause trouble for this upcoming Showdown as this is exactly what Port Adelaide were able to do well in their previous game. Matthew Wright continues to hit the scoreboard, ending with 4 goals, while their highest disposal winner was Josh Worrell with 22. Disappointingly, none of their players fighting for AFL selection stood up, with Billy Frampton and Darcy Fogarty only managing 1 goal each and Chayce Jones who had 15 touches in the first half, drifted out of the game in the second half, finishing with 20.

This Showdown has been a long time coming with neither side able to participate in the SANFL last year. Port currently leads the Showdown tally 8-5, however, as with all Showdowns previous results don't matter at all. Last time they played the Magpies ran out 30-point victors at Alberton Oval. Sam Mayes kicked 3.2 and Tobin Cox could have had a day out with 2.5. Andy Otten and Lachie Sholl had 24 disposals each for Adelaide while Willem Drew lead the way for Port with 32. It shut the gate on North Adelaide, who had none of the next nine shots on goal, and it swung wide open for Glenela.

Liam McBean soon bagged his last two of five goals: returning to pole position for the Ken Farmer medal. But Lachie Hosie had other ideas, and he kicked his 14th goal from five games to go one clear at the top of the goalkicking leaderboard. Luke Partington is clear at the top of the Shearman Medal tally too, as voted by the coaches. He had another 35 touches and 7 clearances to put the afterburners on North in the final quarter. They are also top of the ladder; in case you were wondering. Can Sturt knock them off?

Sturt's two wins this season have come when they have dominated their opponents in possession, but they would be chuffed with the hard work that went in to stopping Matty Wright and the Adelaide Reserves last week. They had a third more scoring shots from fewer inside fifties, which nearly proved too few, before Ashley Johnson made his tight set shot count for one goal and two premiership points. It is a timely momentum boost if Sturt want to catch up to the top five. They missed out last season, which will not be lost on the playing group nor the fans.

They are within one big win of Woodville-West Torrens in third place and Norwood in fourth, two teams that gave Sturt a fortnight's handicap to start the season. The Bloods thrashed the Redlegs in the disposal count, as well as having 20 more tackles, even with having more of the ball. Saturdays match against the Bulldogs was an arm-wrestle, with the Bloods kicking four goals to zero in the last quarter to run away with the victory. Thomas Keough was the best player on the ground, kicking four goals and collecting 17 disposals. Joshua Gore was also very good for the Bloods, claiming second best with 22 possessions and two goals. Jono Beech also found the sticks kicking three goals. The Bloods have lost the clearances in nearly every game this season, but that hasn't stopped them from getting the ball, winning the disposal count in four out of the five games. Their willingness to still hunt for the footy and their effort to grind to victory has been the key to their success in the last two weeks.

I am intrigued to see how West Adelaide go against North Adelaide's Campbell Combe, who is second in the league for clearances. It is going to be a matter of who can keep the pressure up and continue to strive and win the footy will claim the four points on Sunday.

The Last time West Adelaide defeated North at Prospect was way back in Round 12 in 2016 and will be looking to break that drought. I think the Roosters will be too good however and will be back on the winner list with a three-goal win.



Buddy May Be The Final AFL Player To Kick 1000 Goals... Ever

Five players in VFL/AFL history have ever kicked 1000 goals, they are Tony Locket (1360), Gordon Coventry (1299), Jason Dunstall (1254) and Doug Wade (1057). There is only one man who can realistically add to the list, Lance Franklin who currently sits on 955 goals since his debut in 2005, is just 45 away from that rare four-figure. 'Buddy' is certainly the only player who can realistically reach 1000, with Richmond's Jack Reiwoldt (684), West Coast's Josh Kennedy (661) and Tom Hawkins (617) all in the twilights of their careers.

After playing just ten games in 2019 and missing the entire of the 2020 season, many were questioning whether the 34 year old would run out his enormous nine-year \$10 million contract, which expires at the end of next season. Returning to Sydney's senior side in Round 2, he has shown he still has that goal-sense that has made him the greatest forward of the modern generation. Scoring three against Adelaide, three against Essendon and then his first big return to form with five majors and the Brett Kirk medal in a close loss to arch-rivals Greater Western Sydney. Unfortunately, though, he has missed the past two games with bone bruising on his right knee sustained in the Sydney Derby, but has trained well since and despite being expected to miss several weeks, is even a chance to play this week against the undefeated Melbourne.

With 14 games (plus potentially finals) to come for the Swans (and Buddy), he would need to average three goals this season (with the assumption he plays all 14 games) to reach that special 1000 mark in 2021, which is certainly achievable if his body is kind to him. If not, he still has next year to get there, even at 35 years of age. The new standing on the mark rule has led to more attacking gameplay, higher scores, and a chance for forwards to make more of an impact in a scoring sense. This will assist Lance Franklin, who can kick from long distances off one or two steps, his biggest strength has always been just that, putting the ball through the big sticks and find scoring opportunities for others.

If he does get there, it is highly possible he will be the final player in Australian football history to do it. The game is now becoming more about stamina, endurance, and athleticism. Gone are the days where full forwards are there to simply take marks and score, they are expected to run up the ground to draw key defenders out of the 50-metre arc and at times, even act as a second-ruck option. If a player hypothetically plays 300 games, they will need to average at

least 3-4 goals every game as a minimum to reach 1000 by that stage... a tough ask indeed.

Lance Franklin has had the unique ability to play both roles, his selfless acts in the 2008 and 2013 Grand Finals for Hawthorn to push up the ground, confuse opposition defences and draw himself out of the game to produce the overall result of premiership success shows not only is he the elite goal kicker of the 21st century, but a team man too. While he may not have achieved the ultimate success from two attempts in Sydney, he has left nothing in the tank.

45 goals may be hard for some, but Buddy has scored more than that in 12 of his 16 seasons in the competition, so unless a horrible set of circumstances including freak injury or extreme suspension... the football world will see its sixth and possibly final 1000 goal scorer.

That Elusive Flag

Over the past number of years, intrigue has increased around Lance "Buddy" Franklin's huge move from Hawthorn to Sydney on a record 9-year deal worth roughly a million a year. Many would say that Franklin's career at Sydney has been a failure due to the fact that he hasn't won a flag with them. Many others have said that he's only gotten better, and his individual resume has propelled him well into the conversation of one of if not the game's greatest player. Franklin however, still one won two premierships with his old club so measuring his success at Sydney can only go so far because will always say "well at least he's won a flag". There have been many players who have been hailed as some of the greatest players of all time but have never won a premiership. Players such as Nick Riewoldt, Patrick Dangerfield, Nathan Buckley, Matthew Pavlich and Robert Harvey just to name a few. All of these players have an amazing list of accolades with multiple times All-Australians, Brownlow's and even Norm Smith's with Nathan Buckley famously winning the award in the 2002 Grand Final where he captained Collingwood to a heartbreaking loss to Brisbane.

There is often the conclusion that these players are almost underrated in a way when comparing them to a player who might not be as gifted as a footballer but is incomparable when it comes to winning premierships. Take Luke Hodge for example, a stalwart of the Hawthorn Football Club one of the best players the game has seen especially when it comes to finals. His resume speaks for itself, 2 Norm Smith medals, 4 premierships and 3 of them as captain. That aside and looking at him as just a pure footballer, Hodge does not come close to someone like Robert Harvey. Harvey, with back-to-back Brownlow's, 8 All-Australians and a number of other individual awards, but no premierships, not a single one. The only time Harvey came close to winning a flag was in 1997 against the Adelaide Crows in which his team (St Kilda) lost after leading for most of the afternoon. He then came agonisingly close in 3 losing preliminary finals before retiring at the conclusion of the 2008 season. Nathan Buckley and Nick Riewoldt both played in successive losing Grand Finals and both were captains of their respective teams. Both were phenomenal players in their own right but at times get overlooked when in the conversation of the game's greatest players that of course includes premierships. Luck does play a part too like a player such as Joel Selwood who has evolved into a fine player and one of the best of the modern era but has also been fortunate to play in a team which has regularly challenged for the premiership and by just his fourth year of playing, he had already played in 3 consecutive grand finals winning 2. The question mark will forever hang over players listed above as the big zero in the list of premierships won unfortunately outweighs all of their individual achievements. Many of them have said that they would trade all of their awards for a flag just one, just to experience what it's like actually winning a premiership. That being said premierships should not be the only way to measure if a player is good or not. Footy is a cruel and tough game though and winning premierships is that much harder.

These players are still considered the peak level that are currently existing in the game as they are still inputting great influence for their teams. Many clubs in the AFL are beginning transitional phases in their squad developments and some clubs are extremely benefiting but others are yet to reap rewards. The Gold Coast Suns, who are still young to the competition are continuing their approach of grooming young players. The Suns contain several young talents in their camp such as Matt Rowell, Izak Rankine, Ben King and Jack Lakosius; 18 players listed between the ages of 18-21 and the youngest squad age average of 23.7 years. The Adelaide Crows who are currently conducting a rebuild are looking to the stars of tomorrow with the youngest squad age average also of 23.7. Adelaide's emerging players such as Lachie Scholl, Jordan Butts and newly introduced Riley Thilthorpe are being mentored by Adelaide veterans Taylor Walker, Rory Sloane and Daniel Tahlia.

All clubs in the AFL are possessing young exciting talents who will bring our great game forward, and clubs such as Port Adelaide, Gold Coast and Adelaide are primarily forming their squads with youth who are being guided by senior veterans. Geelong has the oldest list in the AFL with the average squad age of 25.3 are not embracing youth to build a future legacy. With pre-season recruits of Jeremy Cameroon, Isaac Smith and Shaun Higgins, it illustrates that Geelong are preparing for the present and not the future. They must bring a flag to Kadinia Park in the next couple of seasons to make it worthwhile.

Several clubs are loading their squads with youthful talent and their senior veterans are guiding them in the right direction. Without a shred of doubt, the young talents we are currently witnessing will birth a new and exciting era of Australia's game.




