

Port Adelaide beat the Gold Coast Suns by 50 points at a sun-drenched Metricon Stadium. While it was 'only' Gold Coast, the Power had to respond after a winnable position was eroded by Geelong Cats' star forward duo Tommy Hawkins and Jeremy Cameron some nine days prior.

Ollie Wines did what he pleased in midfield with 43 possessions and more Brownlow Medal votes while Sydney Swans recruit Aliir Aliir dominated the air down back with countless intercept touches. Perhaps N however Port could learn a thing or two from the top-tier four and that is to be ruthless and win by 80 or 90 points and not 50.

Still, it was a solid win for the Power and young gun Connor Rozee backed up last week's five-goal haul with three first-half majors and 19 possessions.

Port Adelaide coach Ken Hinkley has a strong belief in their team.

"We're a good team but we want to be a great team," he said.

The Power are in a great position to firstly seal a finals spot and then win enough games to lock in a place for a double-chance swing at a preliminary final place. However, Port's assault on a top-four berth will be made more difficult after a knee injury to 250-gamer Robbie Gray.

"It is probably a medial, but we will wait and see until we get the scans back," Hinkley told The Age on Saturday.

Added Gray post-match: "Hopefully it's not too bad and I can play some footy at the end of the season."

"It was a really strong performance," Hinkley said.

"We were playing against a team who are probably struggling, to be fair, but we were able to come up and perform the way we wanted to perform."

Others to shine against the soft Suns were Steven Motlop who ran hard and found space at will, fellow winger Karl Amon, half-back-cum-midfielder Dan Houston and the evergreen Travis Boak. One thing's for sure, the seasoned Sydney Swans and its crop of talented youngsters will be the eager visitors this Saturday night in what promises to be a cracking contest at Adelaide Oval because Sydney will be nothing to what the Gold Coast outfit dished up.

The Digital Pass team all thought Port would take home the choccies at Alberton. Their captain, Cam Sutcliffe, got them going with a nice chase down tackle, bonus niggling 25 metre penalty, and opening goal, but from there, everything went against the Magpies and in favour of the Double Blues. Dylan Williams was the only other teammate to trouble the scorers, making the most of his day to bag six goals. Sturt kicked four on the trot either side of quarter time, then again after half time, and Port managed only seven goals to Sturt's 14.

The Double Blues controlled the footy, taking 30 more marks and earning 50 more possessions. Sturt's opening goal was a great example of that, through their captain too, and when Jack Penfold kicked truly, they lead for the rest of the match. The two set shots were as good as any for both teams, then the Magpies considerably dropped off. Only three other Port players managed a shot on goal on only Dylan's day, and they all missed. North Adelaide took on the undefeated Glenelg in their last match; Glenelg remain unbeaten. Familiar faces were getting the job done for the first 45 minutes for the Roosters; Hender, LeBois, Allmond. But Marlon Motlop has flicked the switch to get Glenelg going before and he did it again with back-to-back goals in Q2. Luke Reynolds then put the Bays in front, then he put them on ice at the end of the match. This was a good arm wrestle of a match, and so too was the last time Port and North met, back in Round 7 at Alberton. The Magpies were the form team heading into that match, but they have lost it over the last fortnight. They conceded swathes of goals against Woodville-West Torrens – and a 100-point turnaround from the result of their Round 6 meeting. They won the hitouts last week, Hayes collecting 50 of 'em, but lost the clearances by five, and inside 50s by 15 last week.

So, teams are building, and Port are slipping. The Roosters will be better for their close run against the competition's best. The game is at Prospect too. Port picked up three injuries in Round 11. The odds are stacking against them. Boyd Woodcock put a stop to the Roosters run last time they met, kicking back-to-back goals just before three quarter time; he is one of a handful of players in form heading into this must win game. They won every metric in that game except for the aerial contest, which is a weakness they have covered well this season thus far; but that game they kicked straighter.

In that game Port kicked six goals in the last guarter to run over the Roosters. Port have lost a couple of attritional matches of footy in recent weeks, and they have got another one coming for them this weekend. A strong opponent such as the Roosters, last year's grand finalists, will test them once more. They need to pass to stay in the five. North Adelaide by 1-12 points

## **Relentless Redlegs to stomp on Dogs**

Central Districts will take on Norwood this Saturday afternoon at Coopers stadium. These teams have had contrasting seasons thus far, as Norwood sit fourth with a 6-4 record, whereas the Dogs are 8th with a 3-7 record. As the competition rapidly reaches the end of the season, with a remaining 7 games, wins are becoming crucial. Last week the Dogs were victorious in a bottom of the table clash against West Adelaide, which ultimately gave their season a pulse for a potential finals birth. Comparatively, Norwood are one win off second position, which makes these favorited matches a necessity if they are to give themselves a double chance come September. As a result of the closeness between all teams in the competition, the league is becoming a legitimate spectacle for all football lovers.

The Redlegs will have fresh legs this week, as they come off a bye. This will be much appreciated for Norwood after their nail-bitter against South Adelaide, where they held on to a 9-point lead to win in the last quarter. Prior to this, they had a tiring tussle with the undefeated Glenelg, where they threw away a seven-goal lead to lose by an agonising one point. In these matches, Norwood lost most of the statistics battle. However, coach Jade Rawlings will not be deterred by this, as in both of these matches Norwood won the key areas. In these matches, Norwood had a superior disposal efficiency, higher inside 50's and more tackles. Through these three main statistics Norwood have been able to apply pressure, transfer the ball swiftly and give their forwards ample opportunity to score. This assault has been predominantly led by Norwood's experienced spearheads, in that of Douglas, Grigg and Nunn.

While, Rawlings will be content with this statistical dominance of the key areas, he will likely be concerned about their clearance numbers. Since round 4, the Redlegs have not won a clearance count. However, what is of greater concern is they have only lost the hit outs once since this date. This indicates there is not enough connection between Michael Knoll and his midfield cohort, as they regularly lose this aspect of the game. Particularly in this match, it is crucial Rawlings nullifies the Dog's midfield as this is their most prolific strength.

The Dogs are coming off good form in their last 4 weeks, stringing together two wins and two losses. These two losses have been against South Adelaide and Woodville, who respectively, are both quality sides and yet the red, white and blue challenged them both. Last week Centrals defeated the Bloods in a vengeance match, after West Adelaide had the best of them at the beginning of the year. Throughout this match, Central Districts hunger for the ball stood out. Coming into the game the look on the players face illustrated it all. Win the footy at all costs. If they can provide this intensity, they will upset the Redlegs.

In spite of this, Central District's inability to close games would be giving coach, Paul Thomas severe headaches. Throughout the season, the Dogs have not won a last guarter. They have kicked a total of 17 goals, 21 points, in comparison to the oppositions 37 goals, 22 points. A 20-goal differential! For the Doggies to snarl this week, they need to generate great energy in the final term, otherwise, Norwood's superior fitness will likely run over the top of them like a BW truck.

Last time these sides met Norwood strolled to a 32-point victory. Although the Dogs inflicted revenge on West Adelaide last week, it is unlikely they will be able to reciprocate this against the red and blue, as Norwood's polish will be too great of a challenge, Norwood by 24-36.

## Adelaide to draw blood at Hisense and record 4<sup>th</sup> win

Round 12 of the SANFL season sees a battle for the wooden spoon taking place at Hisense Stadium between West Adelaide and Adelaide. Only two points separate the two sides with Adelaide sitting in 8th on 3 wins and West Adelaide are on the bottom in 10th with 2 wins. The Bloods are coming off a loss to Central Districts away from home whilst Adelaide are coming off a bye, however, before that they won a tight one against Sturt at Unley Oval.

West Adelaide is coming off 5 straight losses and more recently lost to the Bulldogs in Elizabeth. This was a very strange game in which both sides only really turned up for 2 quarters and unfortunately for the Bloods, Centrals' two quarters were better than theirs. In a low scoring game, the Bulldogs went goalless in the first quarter and then kicked 6.7 (half of their overall score) in the second quarter which West Adelaide couldn't get back for the rest of the game. The stats were very close throughout the game with West Adelaide only really getting ascendency with the hit outs, however, they still couldn't win more clearances which negated any advantage they may have had. Elliot Dunkin was fantastic in the midfield with 36 disposals while Kaine Stevens was arguably their best with 31 disposals, 1 goal and 9 clearances. Both Josh Gore and Thomas Keough kicked multiple goals, however, there wasn't enough support from the others forwards to kick a winning score. On the other side of the fence, Nick Gillard booted 5 goals and was unstoppable up forward for the Bulldogs.

Adelaide on the other hand last played in round 10 and had a great win against the struggling Double Blues. Adelaide led by a healthy margin for much of the game which came in handy late as Sturt made a massive late charge in the last quarter. Similarly, to West Adelaide, Adelaide had far more hit outs but struggled to turn that into possession which luckily didn't hurt them too badly. Sturt had more clearances and inside 50s, but Adelaide was too efficient which was a major help in securing the 2 points. One thing that has hampered Adelaide somewhat this season has been their goalkicking accuracy or lack of. In their last 4 games they have kicked 10.13, 6.8, 6.9 and 6.9, however, they bucked this trend against Sturt kicking 14.6 and finally putting up a score above 80 which they hadn't done since 5 where they played, guess who, Sturt. Clearly, they enjoy Unley Oval, and it has seen two of their better performances in front of goal.

Jackson Hately was terrific with 31 disposals, 1 goal, 8 tackles and 7 clearances and won't be playing at this level for much longer if he keeps that form up. Kieran Strachan was great in the ruck with 37 hit outs, 9 marks and a goal. Billy Frampton continues to impress with 3.1 while Matthew Wright and Mitch Marini kicked 2 goals each.

Last time these two sides played was in round 2 and saw a very close game where Adelaide ran away with a 6-point win. Recent history also suggests that this game is either going to a blowout or a very close game with 2 of the last 5 being decided by 6 points and the other 3 being 60-65 points. This one should be close again and I expect a similar result to what happened earlier in the year. Adelaide needs to win to keep their finals hopes alive but the Bloods won't go down without a fight. What would be even more satisfying for Marty Mattner was the fact his side had 11 goalkickers and gave themselves a chance to qualify for finals. This was a big win at Alberton Oval. This was Sturt's first win at the venue since 2016, and one the double Blues faithful would have enjoyed.

Sturt's dominance was evident with their clearances. Battersby and Davis were instrumental in allowing Sturt first opportunity from stoppages, to the move the ball forward.

Sturt simply won more of the ball than Port Adelaide and were very efficient in front of goal. Sturt had 21 scoring shots and kicked 14.7 in return. This is the double blues highest score since round 3.

Sturt will still believe they have an opportunity to play finals, so long as they can continue to win. They currently sit in seventh place and four points behind five placed Port Adelaide. If Sturt can replicate the intensity and effort, they showed against Port Adelaide, they will still believe they are good enough to compete with the top sides.

South Adelaide will be keen to win and keep in touch with the Eagles and will be aware that Norwood are right behind them. Whilst the game is at Unley, I feel South will be too strong, and they will return to some good form knowing a double chance is critical come finals time. Prediction: South Adelaide 1-13 points.

Tstitas has had an outstanding season and leads the disposal for the league with 289. The Eagles have some classy players such as Riley Knight, Joseph Sinor, Jack Hayes and Tyson Stengle, who have all had solid seasons. The Eagles have won their last two games at home by an average of 57.5 points this season and will be looking to being that sort of form against the Bays this weekend.

# Amato's 5th Quarter

### Sam Jacobs: The Most Underrated Ruckman Of The 2010s

Brodie Grundy, Dean Cox, Max Gawn, Nic Naitanui, Todd Goldstein... some of the finest ruckman we have seen in the past ten years. They all have Australian jumpers to their names and are sighted as being the best in the business. One name frequently left out of this mould however, is Sam 'Sauce' Jacobs.

Forever the team-man, Sauce played over 200 games for Carlton, Adelaide and GWS, won three showdown medals and was part of the All-Australian nominated squad of 40 on three occasions, but never truly received the recognition he deserved.

In this one-on-one chat, I sat down with the 203cm big-man as he took me through his career.

Sauce comes from a small coastal town, located on the eastern coast of the Yorke Peninsula. "Adrossan has a very small community. I had a very eventful upbringing, being in a small town my life revolved around sport: basketball and cricket in summer and football in winter."

Recruited by Carlton with pick one in the 2007 Rookie Draft, Jacobs spent four years at the Navy Blues and played alongside superstars Chris Judd, Eddie Betts and Bryce Gibbs. "I was very fortunate to spend four years at Carlton. I didn't know many people when I went over there, but over the four years I made a close group of friends. Four years is your typical working apprenticeship and that's what gave me the springboard to play some good football when I came home to South Australia."

After 2010, Sauce requested a trade back to South Australia. As the Crows farewelled several club legends, this opened an opportunity for the big man who instantly established himself as a regular in a struggling side. "2011 was good personally, I felt coming back home I was ready to play regular AFL football. Neil Craig was a very hard working, high standards coach and I really enjoyed that side of it. A lot of the stuff Craigy taught was bout resilience and he pushed us hard mentally and physically, I was very fortunate to have nine months with him."

The following year stands as one of the most underrated seasons in recent time, with Adelaide rising from 14th to a single kick away from a Grand Final. "When Sando came across, he instilled immediate belief and we all hung off every word he said because he came from Geelong who had been so successful. We had a lot of guys in the right demographic and in 2012 it just all came together. Unfortunately we didn't cash in on that team in the following years."

The 2012 Preliminary Final against Hawthorn was a tight affair, with Adelaide taking an unlikely lead with five minutes remaining, only to fall short to a star-studded Hawthorn team. "It was a special game with a lot of tense moments, when Stiffy kicked that goal the crowd went mad. But as soon as that siren goes, it's very disappointing."

Two seasons of disappointment would follow with the Crows missing the finals on both occasions before parting ways with Brenton Sanderson. Phil Walsh was appointed as senior coach for season 2015, but on

# Amato's 5th Quarter

### Sam Jacobs: The Most Underrated Ruckman Of The 2010s

3 July, the darkest day in Adelaide Crows history struck with Walsh losing his life in the most tragic circumstances. "Walshy thought a lot differently to a lot of other coaches I had. I was at home, it was about 5:30 in the morning when Scott Camporeale called me and told me he'd passed away. It was just the raw emotion and trying to get your head around it was a really difficult thing to do. There were so many support mechanisms at the club and we all felt we could work through it together. A lot of credit must go to Scott Camporeale."

The 2017 season was a season of dominance for the Crows, who stormed their way to a Grand Final for the first time since 1998, but for Jacobs was remembered for losing his brother, Aaron. "It was a really challenging and emotional time. 2017 was my most eventful year to say the least, but to be at a football club and have the support was warming at the same time. It would have been nice to have won the Grand Final and dedicate it to my brother."

Adelaide were hot favourites in the 2017 Grand Final, but fell over at the final hurdle to an underdog Richmond outfit who were at the start of their dynasty. "When you run out on the ground, it's an absolute cauldron and a moment I will never forget. It's the pinnacle of our game and to be part of it, you just can't replicate."

"We started the game well, but still weren't playing the way we wanted. We went in at half time nine points down but it felt like we were nine goals down. The rooms were really flat and everyone was a bit shellshocked, there probably wasn't enough conversation. Richmond played the game on their terms and as we know now, they are one of the greatest teams of the modern era."

After the disappointment of the Grand Final, the much-spoken about pre-season camp took place and Jacobs believes it may have played part in the club's on-field demise of 2018-19. "No doubt the external noise with the camp had an affect own our performance. There was some positives to come out of it, but there was a lot of stuff I didn't feel was relevant to what we were doing. I don't feel anything bad towards the club because we had to get better, so we tried something different and it didn't work. I just see it as a missed opportunity with the team we had (2018-19), because although we were getting older we were still at the peak of our powers."

After the Crows had missed their final opportunity to win a premiership in 2019, the club began cutting ties with many players. Jacobs however, was one that chose to leave on his own accord. "It was my call, the Crows were looking to rebuild and Riley O'Brien was ready. GWS offered me two years and the Crows could only offer one, and most of that would have been in the SANFL."

After the COVID-19 impacted 2020 and unexpected fall from grace from GWS, who had come off a Grand Final the season prior to miss the eight, Jacobs knew it was time to call it a day. "I was very comfortable with the decision (to retire) and grateful I got to play at the highest level for 14 years. I'm working at the Crows now in an engagement role off the field, and hope to keep spending more time with my family which is a positive to."

# TEAM TALK with JORDAN

## **Costly Near Misses**

The year 2005 was a new year for the crows, new coach, new system, essentially new everything. Gary Ayers had finished at the helm halfway through the 2004 season when he was told his contract would not be renewed for the following year. Neil Craig took over as caretaker for the remainder of the season and was then appointed as the next senior coach. The back-to-back premierships of 1997-1998 were long gone but weren't that long ago that they faded away into distant memory because there were

still a handful players left from those years such as Mark Ricciuto, Andrew McLeod, Simon Goodwin and Ben Hart just to name a few. 2005 saw Adelaide have their best home and away season in the history of the club, finishing 17–5 and winning the club's first ever minor premiership for finishing atop the ladder after the home-and-away season. The Crows had started promisingly after the disappointment of 2004 winning 4 of their first 6 matches, and gathered momentum as the season progressed, winning 10 matches in a row from rounds 13 to 22. The last of these was a stunning eight-point victory over premiership favourites West Coast at Subiaco Oval, in a match that saw them leapfrog the Eagles into top spot.

The Crows were brought crashing down to earth in their First Qualifying Final against fourth placed St Kilda at AAMI Stadium. In a tough, low-scoring contest Adelaide missed the leadership of captain Mark Ricciuto, suspended for striking Adam Selwood the previous week, and despite a late fightback they lost by 8 points. The loss set up a sudden death Semi Final against Port Adelaide, the reigning Premiers. The Crows regained Ricciuto, and in front of a crowd of 50,521 they defeated Port by a Showdown record margin of 83 points. As a result, Adelaide faced a Preliminary Final match against West Coast at Subiaco, where they had won just three weeks before. In another tough game in windy conditions, West Coast broke away with five goals to one in a decisive third quarter, and again a final-quarter comeback was in vain as the Eagles ended Adelaide's season, winning by 16 points. West Coast would then lose the Grand Final to Sydney the next week by just four points. Adelaide joined Essendon (1999) and Port Adelaide (2002 and 2003) as recent AFL minor premiers who had failed to make the Grand Final.

2006 saw the Crows start the season in dominant fashion. Narrow losses to West Coast in round 2 and Richmond in round 8 - the latter noted for Richmond's controversial but successful "keepings-off" tactics were the only blips in the radar as Adelaide stormed to a 14-2 win/loss record, with eight of those wins by 50 points or more. At this stage, their percentage of 172.38 was the best since West Coast in 1991. Adelaide then faded by losing 4 out of their next 6 matches but recovered and finished the season strongly to record 16 wins and 6 losses, thus finishing 2nd on the ladder only behind West Coast in first. They beat Fremantle comfortably at home in the qualifying final and would then face West Coast again in the preliminary final this time in Adelaide. Missing club stalwart and captain Mark Ricciuto to illness the Crows were still favoured to win and started brilliantly leading by 22 points at half-time. West Coast eventually clawed their way back largely due to their star-studded midfield led by Chris Judd, Ben Cousins, Daniel Kerr and Dean Cox and even led halfway through the last term before withstanding a late comeback to again break Adelaide hearts. The crows finishing their season disappointingly after promising so much. All in all, these two years/seasons in 2005 and 2006 was a massive chance missed for the Crows to secure their 3rd premiership. The club is still today looking to win that elusive third premiership. Whether it be bad luck, missing key players or just not turning up on the day, the Adelaide Crows have since their first two premierships seem to threaten without fully following and claiming another flag. 2017 saw the club finally make the grand final again only to go down to Richmond by 48 points. This premiership drought is an interesting and mysterious one that will continue to intrigue many people for years to come unless it is broken.
