# **Carlton gives Adelaide the Blues**

Carlton has given under siege David Teague a one-week reprieve from the media blowtorch with a 10- point victory over Adelaide at Marvel Stadium. The Crows started the game brightly but failed to capitalise on their early dominance kicking 2.6 to zip before two late goals to Carlton reduced the margin to six points at quarter time.

Darcy Fogarty kicked two goals in the opening term but disappointingly failed to register another score or have any impact after this. The second quarter could best be described as a disaster for Adelaide with Carlton kicking eight goals to take a commanding 28-point lead into the main break. Footy fans do not generally like to see opposition players performing well but an exception can be made for Eddie Betts.

The former Crow kicked three goals and was close to pulling off one of the marks of the year in the second term. Adelaide battled away in the second half and despite some late chances were not able to peg the margin back. The Blues will also feel they failed to make the most of their opportunities in the final term, booting five behinds with many of them very manageable shots but they did enough to hold on.

The Crows dominated clearances 38-22 but butchered the ball inside 50. Despite a mixed bag in front of goal Taylor Walker was the pick of the Adelaide forwards with three goals and nine score involvements. It seems a regular trend with Laird, Keys and Seedsman the major ball winners for Adelaide, but Sam Walsh was the dominant midfielder on the ground. This reflected in the Coaches' votes with the 20-year-old receiving a perfect ten. Matthew Nicks was able to take some positives out of the game but again lamented a poor quarter of footy that ultimately proved costly.

"It is pretty clear we lost our way in the second quarter. Our opponents were too good for that period of time and we weren't able to change the momentum of the game. "It's been a reasonably consistent issue for us throughout this year... our ability to limit damage when an opposition has their tails up"

# **Amayesing win by Port**

Travis Boak had seven touches to half-time and was well-tagged by Sydney Swans' stopper George Hewitt. But gun Port Adelaide Power midfielder Boak finished with 30 touches while medical sub Sam Mayes effectively booted the winning goal after the brilliant Lance Buddy Franklin had put the Swans ahead at a damp Adelaide Oval on Saturday night. Haulking Power ruckman Scott Lycett slotted the final goal of the game from a standing start as the hosts leapfrogged Geelong Cats into fourth spot in a thrilling 12.9 (81) to 10.11 (71) win. Port Adelaide did lead by 15 points at three-quarter-time and looked home and hosed. However, enter Buddy. He booted three goals which included a superb sliding goal when he warded off ex-team-mate Aliir Aliir to put the Swans in it.

Emerging Todd Marshall marked strongly to give Port some breathing space before Buddy's brace of majors made the home crowd nervous with anxiety. The Power then showed the fabric in which coach Ken Hinkley wants his team to build on from to become a great one. Dan Houston marked in 'unknown territory' that led to the Mayes major and the Port side had several who starred in the fierce contest against a side that will feature in the finals. Ollie Wines did his Brownlow Medal chances no harm with another dominant display in midfield and Charlie Dixon played further up the field to take some strong marks. His two goals were crucial as well. Willem Drew was arguably Port's most consistent four-quarter player and he had eight tackles and clearances. Miles Bergman impressed again with his clean ball handling on a wing and Karl Amon continued his great season. There are a couple of injury concerns with Trent McKenzie who damaged a shoulder after he and impressive Will Hayward collided both going for the ball. Dixon also was hobbling after hurting an ankle but both players will be assessed during the week. Boak said the side showed character and that it was 'about time' that Port beat a quality and likely finals-bound team.

"We haven't beaten a top eight side this year I don't think," he told Fox Footy post-game. "We knew the pressure was on us and that it was going to be a great battle." Boak had 12 possessions in the championship quarter, the third, and he kicked a crucial goal. His efforts earned the praise of Melbourne Demon great Garry Lyon. "Champion. That's what champions do," he said. "They're never down for a whole game. They look at a disappointing half and go right I'll fix it ... that's why he's one of the most admired players in the competition." Hinkley commended his team's ability to stick to the process when challenged by a Buddy-inspired Swans. "There's no doubt it was slipping away a little and that was the quality of the opposition... but I thought our resilience was remarkable," Hinkley said after the game. "We've had an attitude to a squad mentality and right now we're stretching and testing that out a bit. "There was an opportunity out there to not keep at it but to our boys' credit they did keep at it. "We're 10-4 and I'm remarkably proud of the resilience of the team and the group that got tested all the way through and got the job done. "When they got a bit of momentum in the last quarter, our blokes found a way to get back to the front and win the game, and that was important." Port meet Hawthorn at the MCG this Saturday night that will also mark 400 AFL games (for Hawthorn and Port) for ex-Power premiership player Sean Burgoyne.

As Adelaide approach the mammoth battle this week, the playing group will be quietly confident as they are arguably in their best form of the season, winning their last two matches. In these last two matches the Crows respectively defeated West Adelaide and Sturt. In Adelaide's most recent match against the Bloods, Adelaide visibly lost the statistics aspect. However, through their direct ball use they were the superior side. Further, Adelaide's intent to win the contested 50-50 ball was evident in this match. This was seen by their domination of contested marks 16-6, which ultimately enabled them to rebound out of

defensive 50 and have several set shots, as opposed to goals on the run. This has been a staple of their game for quite some time, as their key targets in that of Frampton, Strachan and Worrell are regularly taking a high number of contested marks and providing targets across the ground. Thus, they have not lost a contest mark count since round seven. Unfortunately for Crows fans, their last two matches have been an aberration to a dismal season. In Adelaide's previous four matches they have had lower disposals, marks, efficiency and clearances than the opposition. The most alarming of these

statistics for coach Mick Godden, is arguably their lack of marks and disposals. This is largely because, they they can gain control through their contested marking ability, yet they are playing an easily defendable brand of football by kicking to contests as opposed to controlling the ball for large periods of time and spreading the ground. Moreover, their lack of disposals is concerning, as they cannot get their hands on the ball. This is pivotal against Glenelg as they are a high-pressure side, which means quick disposals are crucial in navigating through congestion.

In contrast, Glenelg have been a model of consistency. Arguably much of their dominance stems from their ascendancy in lower grades, as they are top in both reserves and U18's. This provides coach Brett Hand with a plethora of capable players at his disposal. While Adelaide is in good form, Glenelg have maintained an 11-game hot streak. This is largely attributed to their consistent performers of the three-pronged L attack consisting of Liam McBean, Luke Reynolds and Lachie Hosie, who have collectively kicked 74 goals between them. Such goal kicking power mixed with Brett Turner and Luke Partington's midfield efforts, have correlated to a successful Glenelg side.

Yet, it is important to recognise few teams can go undefeated in a season. As we delve through history, the 1972 Miama Dolphins or 1929 Collingwood sides, spring to mind. However, these teams are in isolation as most competitive sides cannot perform perfect seasons. Therefore, history indicates Glenelg are likely to lose before the end of the season. Unfortunately, for Adelaide fans, it will not be this week as Glenelg's cleanliness, coupled with their innate desire to win the football will likely overcome any Adelaide counterattack. **Glenelg by 36-48**.

Well, I spoke about how much of a danger game it was for Port Adelaide in their trip to Prospect Oval to face North. After an even first quarter, the onslaught began. The Roosters kicked 10 goals in a row, and it was near-on a half of footy played before Port could register just their fifth goal.

North dominated possession, taking fifty more marks over their opponent and cruising to a twelve-goal with with ruthless efficiency and accuracy. Defenders hit their rebounds, debutants hit their stride, and a Nick Blewett dozen players hit the scoreboard. Young, old, and sundry got the job done for North Adelaide, with Andrew Moore and Aaron Young racking them up against their old side, as well as Harrison Wigg returning to the fore. Last season the Roosters had just four losses across the season before becoming runners-up. This season they had four losses by Round 5. I am sure they have a point to prove before they are neglected from September in 2021, and they sure as shit made that point last week. Their emphatic win reinstates them to the top five. Otherwise, the Roosters will close their two-game deficit to the \*best-of-the-rest, in the space of a month, just you watch.

I do not know where Stuart Taverner went last week in the ruck, after three games of increasingly good footy. The Bloods need to sort out their ruck selection, because fifteen hitouts will not win you a game of league footy. Not to mention that the Roosters are often well suited in that category. These two teams faced each other in the Reserves last week incidentally, and North Adelaide lead from start to finish. I predict the same result this weekend. North by 37-48 points

One team that was on the wrong end of an upset was South Adelaide who went down to the Double Blues at Peter Motley Oval Saturday afternoon. The third-placed Panthers fell 11 points short to the seventh-placed sturt in a match where many people would have expected them to win. If they had won that match, they would have been second and match in front of other teams. One of those teams they would have been in front of is the Eagles, and the Panthers host them this Saturday at Noarlunga.

In three of their last four matches, they have had more scoring shots than the opposition, and they will be looking to hit the scoreboard this weekend against the Eagles.

The Eagles are also coming off a loss as they went down to the undefeated Glenelg on Sunday at Maughan Thiem Kia oval. The Eagles were in the contest from the beginning and lead at half-time, and three-quarter time, being the only second team for the season to do so. Strangely, Sam Mayes was pulled from the game in the second quarter and had to drive to Adelaide Oval to be the AFL medical sub after Hamish Hartlett came up sore in the warmup. With or without Mayes, however, Port were struggling and it was looking like a big North win from the outset. North dominated all the key areas and especially aerially where they had almost double the number of marks that Port had which allowed them to chip their way through Ports defence and create good looks inside 50. Due to Port's growing injury list, they only had 8 AFL listed players on the field and of those Riley Bonner and Boyd Woodcock were the best. Bonner had 34 touches across half-back and will be looking for an AFL recall while Boyd Woodcock had 29 touches in a midfield role as he vies for that small forward position in the AFL side to replace Robbie Gray. Ethan Moore topped the Port goal kickers with 2 goals while Ollie Lord continues to improve with 1.2.

In recent years Port have had the wood over Centrals, winning 4 of the last 5 encounters. They last met in round 2 with Port winning by 17 points after a great comeback. 



# The Apple Isle Bid

Australian rules football has been played in Tasmania as long as the mainland states with the first clubs formed in the early 1860s. The state hosted the national football carnival in 1924, 1947 and 1966. In 1960, the Tasmanian state side defeated a Victorian state side made up from some of the best players from the Victorian Football League.

On 24 June 1990, Tasmania's state team defeated the Victorian state team in front of a full house at North Hobart Oval fuelling the first calls for the state to house its own AFL team. Colin Alexander kicked 4 goals for Tasmania during the match. In 1991, Fitzroy played three games in Tasmania.

In 1992 Roger Curtis, then president of successful Tasmanian State League side Clarence, flagged the inevitable decline of Tasmanian football without the presence of its own AFL side. Curtis said that "The only way to get the kids playing football here is to give them access to the best product available and that, of course, is AFL football...You would have to call the side 'Tasmania' as fans simply won't follow a relocated side with its traditional name, even if it was Collingwood". In April 1994 the Tasmanian Sports Minister, Peter Hodgman, spoke to the AFL about the possible introduction of a local team to the league and had raised the possibility of state funding.

Between 1994 and 1997 the bid was prepared for a Tasmanian team that involved the construction of a 30,000-capacity stadium at the Hobart Showgrounds in Glenorchy, at the cost of approximately \$30 million. The AFL's continued rejection of the Tasmanian AFL team has raised significant controversy, with the Government of Australia launching a Senate inquiry in 2008 which AFL Commission CEO Andrew Demetriou and chairman Mike Fitzpatrick both declined to attend. At the enquiry, Tasmanian senator Kerry O'Brien brought into question the AFL's commitment to the game in Tasmania, and stated that he believed that with continued neglect, the popularity of soccer could overtake Australian rules football in Tasmania. There are already more children playing soccer than Australian rules football in Tasmania.

The AFL argued that the New South Wales based participation numbers were in excess of that in Tasmania, furthering their argument that a team in Western Sydney was a higher priority. The Senate enquiry found that insurmountable cultural barriers would make such a move non-viable. Several media commentators have strongly speculated that the AFL Tasmania as somewhat of a soft target for relocation of struggling clubs particularly for Melbourne. Clubs such as North Melbourne and Gold Coast in recent years have been flagged to relocate but this would be quite disrespectful to the footy mad state of Tasmania as they deserve their own team as they have been playing football for as long as anyone else in the country. With the recent Covid 19 crisis significantly affecting the AFL financially, new Tasmanian premier Peter Gutwein has adopted a noticeably more aggressive stance on the need for an AFL club based in Tasmania and has said that now is the best opportunity for the state to be granted a license and that will not only help the AFL monetary wise but further make the competition truly national. This is long overdue; Tasmania arguably should've had a team in the AFL ages ago but the AFL have continuously poured money into non-traditional football states to varying degrees of success. They must reward a state that is as footy mad as anyone with their own team, the time is now.
