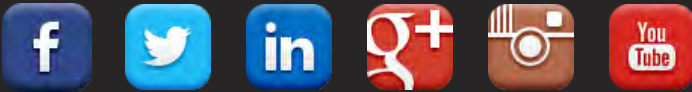

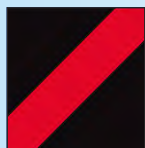

Crows unable to tame Lions

A tough encounter at Adelaide Oval has finished with Adelaide going down to the Brisbane Lions by 52 points.

Brisbane led by nine points at quarter time and the margin was tight for most of the game before the Lions kicked six goals to one in the final term to blow the margin out beyond eight goals.

Many of the key performance indicators were tight throughout the day and Adelaide finished the game +1 in contested possessions but the Brisbane class eventually overpowered the home side.

For Adelaide Paul Seedsman continued his stellar 2021 form with 21 disposals and two goals while Rory Laird was the highest possession winner on the ground with 37 touches.

The major negative was the neck strain injury suffered by Taylor Walker who was subbed out of the game in the second term and must be in major doubt for the upcoming clash with Essendon.

After a great stint of form in the SANFL Billy Frampton got another chance at AFL level but unfortunately was unable to impact the scoreboard finishing with two behinds.

James Rowe has played every game this year at AFL level but the small forward has not kicked multiple goals since round 10 and Lachlan Murphy might be in the mix for a return to the Senior team.

Matthew Nicks praised the efforts of his side against the Lions, but the match again was another learning in curve in competing with the top sides of the competition.

"You look at the scoreboard - I didn't feel that was the game. They've got so much class in their team, especially forward of the ball, and they took their chances, and we didn't unfortunately"

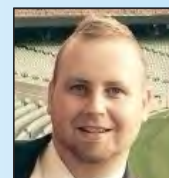

Silky first half sets up Port

Hawthorn Hawks' Shaun Burgoyne deserved so much better. The Port Adelaide 2004 premiership player and three time Hawks' premiership star played his 400th game and the first Indigenous player to reach that milestone. However his old club smashed the hapless and hopeless Hawthorn in the first half and the Power led by 48 points after Mitch Georgiadis left Burgoyne, who lost his footing, in his wake to kick the opening goal of the third quarter.

Port Adelaide withstood a Hawk challenge to win 13.9 (87) to 7.11 (53). Charlie Dixon booted four goals while young key forward Todd Marshall kicked two as the visiting Port Adelaide continually waltzed out of the centre square with Ollie Wines and Karl Amon prominent at Melbourne's Marvel Stadium. It was not like Hawthorn had a poor midfield. It had quality players in James Worpel, Jaeger O'Meara, Liam Shiels, Brownlow Medallist Tom Mitchell in the centre square. When Connor Rozee drew the ire of Mitchell and a subsequent downfield free to Dixon, the Hawks lost the plot. Rather than cheering Burgoyne whenever he was near the ball, most of the focus by the majority of the Hawthorn faithful was to jeer Rozee whenever he did his thing with it. Port did lose emerging forward-mid Kane Farrell with a suspected season-ending knee injury and he was replaced with medical sub Marty Fredericks. The latter made an immediate impact when he sidestepped Burgoyne to slot through a super goal. Wines, albeit somewhat wasteful by foot, likely has more Brownlow Medal votes in this match after he collected 43 possessions and Travis Boak continued his masterful season. Scott Lycett was immense in ruck with his bullocking work at ground level a feature, Mile Bergman was all class with his clean skills while defensive trio Aliir Aliir, captain Tom Jonas and Trent McKenzie got it done again in the back half. Hawthorn, inspired by Jonathon Ceglar's marking, did respond to close the deficit to 22 points mid-way into the final quarter.

However Sam Mayes and Rozee put the icing on the cake in a game that finished with a memorable touch as Hawthorn's triple premiership player Shiels and Boak chaired Burgoyne off the ground. Port Adelaide coach Ken Hinkley said several of the regular stars will return in coming weeks including one that was touted by some pundits as the best player in the AFL before he injured his ankle against Richmond.

"Zak will push for next Thursday. He got through the [SANFL] game well on Saturday. I'm not being in any way disrespectful to the competition, but Zak Butters is an AFL player every day of the week, he just needed to get a game under his belt to give him confidence that he can play," Hinkley said Butters' possible inclusion for the Power for the top-four blockbuster against Melbourne Demons at Adelaide Oval this Thursday night. "He won't be perfect if he comes in next week or the week after, but he'll be there, making us better for every week that he's in the team. "[Duursma will] play next week in the SANFL, all things being equal, and we'll be really pleased to have him back as well. "Tom Clurey (broken jaw), Jackson Mead (spleen), played in the SANFL today, we had Zak playing in the SANFL today, so we're starting to get some of our pieces back.

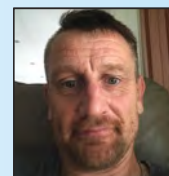

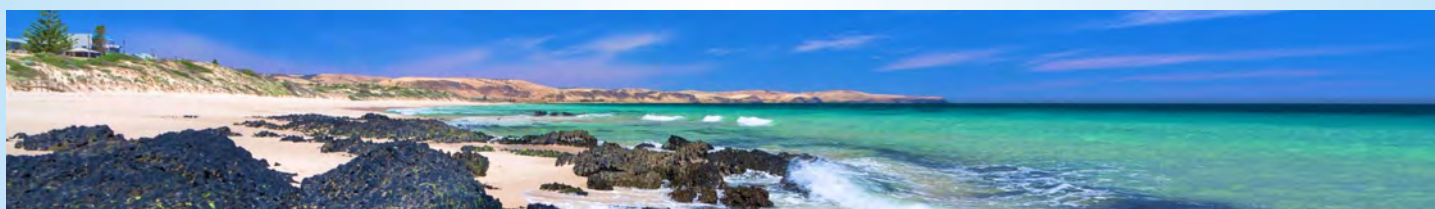

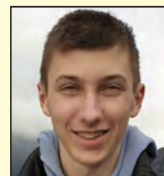
Port Adelaide v Norwood

Port Adelaide went to X Convenience Oval last week and had a 9-point victory over the Bulldogs. Unluckily for Centrals, Port welcomed back three AFL quality players back with the likes of Tom Clurey, Hamish Hartlett and Zak Butters all returning from injury. It was a very tight game from the outset with the biggest lead of the game only being 14 points in Centrals favour late in the 3rd quarter. Ultimately, the game came down to accuracy in front of goal and Port's ability to kick 9.3. They smashed Centrals in disposals, marks and hit outs but still Central's had more scoring shots but just couldn't steady themselves when they needed to. Hamish Hartlett was prolific across half-back racking up 33 disposals and looked back to his best while Boyd Woodcock continues to perform, having 25 disposals and 1 goal. The story of the game for almost all Port Adelaide supporters, however, was Zak Butters getting back on the park and playing his first game since he was injured in April. He seemingly didn't miss a beat and 21 disposals and 2 goals which is great news for Port fans.

Norwood on-the-other-hand will be looking to bounce back after losing to the Double Blues. This game was played in pretty bad conditions hence the low scores, however, the Redlegs would have still been hoping for a better result in front of their home crowd. The game was tight up until half-time and then Sturt managed to kick away in the 3rd, kicking 3 goals and keeping Norwood goalless which set up their win. Norwood did have their opportunities in the last, however, as they kept Sturt scoreless but only managed 4 behinds themselves. Sturt were able to make the most of their dominance in the 3rd while Norwood couldn't do the same when their turn came in the 4th. Norwood managed to win the clearances along with the inside 50s, however, due to the nature of the game and conditions they struggled to make enough quality looks that they could generate into goals. Nothing shows how bad the conditions were quite like the number of tackles that were laid. Norwood had 146 tackles while Sturt had 124 which shows how much of a slog this game was. It was a low disposal game which Declan Hamilton lead for Norwood with 20, however, again, the tackle numbers were insane. Matthew Nunn and Tom Lewis both had 23 tackles, more tackles than James Battersby who had the most disposals on ground (21) touched the ball which you don't see every day.

These two sides go way back, however, more recently Norwood have had the bragging rights winning 4 out of the last 5. They have played already this year in round 1 where the Redlegs ran out 45-point winners. Matthew Nunn was huge that day having 39 touches and 11 tackles, while Sam Mayes and Jarrod Lienert were the best for Port. 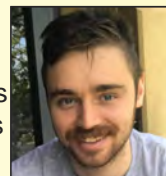
Eagles v West Adelaide

Glenelg have just notched a club record 12 and 0 start to the season. The crows ran them mighty close on the weekend, mind you. That makes up two of Woodville-West Torrens' losses in their 8 and 4 start. The only other matches the Eagles have lost were against Port Adelaide and South Adelaide. They have rectified this by beating both teams in their second encounters. Their second encounter with Glenelg was a close one too, before three of Glenelg's potent front six notched their bag for the day.

The Eagles had eight individual goalkickers denied a second helping against the competition's best team so far. Woodville West Torrens must have the next-best back six, conceding 65 points on average (on the Channel 7 broadcast) a figure they were 20 strokes under on the weekend. South had plenty of chances (11 more inside 50s) but the Eagles defence just wicked the footy away to the wing, and then back through the corridor, twice escaping out the back for a goal versus the flow. Linking them along the wing all day at Noarlunga was Poole & Pudney (gentrified café name!); 38 times the Eagles went end-to-end of Flinders University Stadium. Tyson Stengle was key in reversing the Round 6 result with an electric five goals, from booming set shots, bananas, and snaps – easily the best player aground, though well supported by Daniel Menzel. Will the Bloods even get a dozen more inside 50s than the Eagles, this week back at Woodville Oval? Not likely. Last week they were swamped by the Roosters 66 to 28 in that stat and did well to remain in the game at half time. Last these two sides met, Westies were swamped on the scoreboard too, by 100 points back in Round 7 – Season 2021's biggest margin.

The conditions probably got to West Adelaide on Saturday; it was muddy hard yakka. They won the ball off half back but then coughed it up right then and there, or in the square, with too many bullets for handpasses, fired at each other's knees. I saw a frustrated Elliott Duncan wishing for his teammates to present going forward – they were stuck in the mud, forced into the wings of a resurgent North Adelaide, now back in the five. Port Adelaide could be back in with a significant win at the direct expense of Norwood, who were defeated at home by Sturt, the Double Blues suddenly a win away from the five, should the Magpies not survive the Redlegs at home. Regardless for the Eagles, after West Adelaide comes Norwood, so one way or another, this fortnight of footy will shake up the peloton nearly as much as that inattentive fan at the Tour de France. For West Adelaide, their first five games of 2021 brought reasonable results, before they lost to North Adelaide by seventy points and had to front the Eagles a week later. They front the Eagles after again losing to the Roosters; they have competed better but, in that game, produced just three goalkickers up forward, and not one win since. They will need half the team to hit the scoreboard if they are to beat the Eagles. Expect the Eagles to fly high, in their crested indigenous guernsey, at home, that very circle on their chest. **Eagles by 37-48 points**

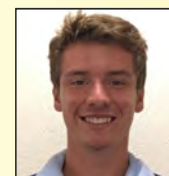
South Adelaide v Adelaide

In this marginal defeat to Glenelg, Adelaide dominated much of the play registering seven more inside 50's than the opposition. Further, the Crows direct ball use and ability to control the play by taking 14 more marks, allowed Adelaide to beat Glenelg at their own game. This is also a strength of South Adelaide, as they generate excessive disposals through taking marks. Therefore, if Adelaide can nullify this, like what they did against the competitions top team, they will take a large stride to winning the match. Unfortunately for Godden, he faces a series of issues with their current game style. The most severe of these in recent weeks has been Adelaide's inability to stop a sides momentum. When the crows get caught in a high scoring 'shoot-out' they lose. This season the Crows have conceded 5 or more goals in at least one quarter nine times. In two of these other matches, they conceded 4 goals in a quarter. This severely impacted Adelaide last weekend, as Glenelg kicked 8 goals to the Crows 4 in a dominant last quarter. The Panthers need to reciprocate this weakness if they plan on breaking their three-game losing streak.

The Crows will likely be missing big target Billy Frampton again this week, as he will need to fill Taylor Walkers void in his absence. However, Adelaide exemplified their depth last weekend as both Will Hamill and Brayden Cook were top performers in their side's loss. Hamill's ball-use and Cook's goal kicking will be crucial in their match this week.

While South Adelaide has comfortably lost their last three games, coach Jarrad Wright does not need to make major structural changes to the team's style. In recent matches the Panthers have maintained ample possession and generated greater inside 50's. However, their inaccuracy is kicking them out of games. In last weekends clash, the Panthers had 11 more inside 50's than the Eagles but had a scoring accuracy of 40 per cent. Thus, they lost by six goals. This has become a commonality of South Adelaide's game, kicking a total of 35 points and only 20 goals in the last three matches. Fortunately for the Panthers, their experienced talent of Gibbs and Broadbent, coupled with the upcoming superstars of Overall and Wilkinson, will give blue and white fans enough to cheer about, because they know if they can convert goals, their dominance in other areas will allow them to win the game.

Overall, this match is poised to be a blockbuster and will help form the top 5, or potentially leave the door ajar for late finals run. **South Adelaide by 1-12.**

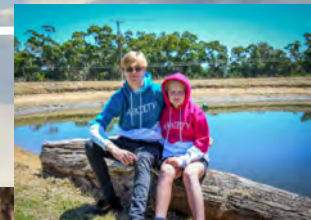

Who Will Be The Sixth 400-Gamer?

In what has been a difficult time for the game in the previous two weeks, with COVID-19 once again causing havoc on the AFL Season, it was a weekend of celebration for the great Shaun Burgoyne. On Saturday night, 'Silk' became the fifth player in the game's 163-year history to reach the 400-game milestone, and the first Indigenous player to notch the quadruple century.

For just five players to reach this incredible achievement in almost two centuries goes to show what is required; a strong work ethic, dedication, resilience and a hint of good luck with health and injury along the way.

There are many players currently in the league who are somewhat within striking distance of the 400 game mark. However, with form issues, injury concerns and the possibilities of game-time and/or positions on lists being compromised in the future due to rebuilding and money-saving, some are more likely than others.

I have identified three players who are the most likely to reach that elusive 400 game milestone;

1. David Mundy

Current Games Played: 347

Games Required: 53

For so long many out of Perth would barely give David Mundy a mention, but now the Victorian-born midfielder is certainly up there as one of the finest footballers to ever come out of a Western Australian club. From his first season in 2005, Mundy has held an unquestionable position in Fremantle's best 22 and has rarely disappointed. A best and fairest in 2010 and All Australian in 2015, and a selection in Fremantle's 2013 Grand Final are among his greatest achievements on field. At the age of 35, the former captain is playing as well as ever, averaging 25 possessions, five clearances and four tackles, all of which are considered above average for AFL standard. For David Mundy to reach 400 games, he would need to play majority of this season's remaining games at least two more full seasons, a final or two would help boost those games up. It seems far-fetched, but if he continues at the rate he is now... why couldn't he?

Only seven games away from over taking Matthew Pavlich's club record for most games played.

2. Joel Selwood

Current Games Played: 325

Games Remaining: 75

The captain of the Geelong Football Club has been the epitome of hard work, dedication, and an unbelievable success rate. Since debuting in 2007, where he won the NAB Rising Star award, he has played in five Grand

Finals, won four Premierships, three best and fairest awards, six All Australians and four times the most courageous player, he has also only ever missed the finals on one occasion in 2015. Only once in his fifteen seasons has he played less than 20 games a year, he has been able to escape serious injury for so much of his career and has never been dropped.

However, Selwood's courage to go back with the flight of the ball and unflinchingly dive into packs has resulted in concussions and head injuries. His biggest strength is also his biggest weakness, and this is the only concern in not reaching 400. With Geelong's premiership window wide-open for the next few seasons and with Selwood form still certainly apt to remain in the side, he would certainly be expected to at least get very close.

For Joel Selwood to reach 400 games, he would need to play until at least another three seasons, playing at least 20 games every campaign. By that stage he would be 36 years old, if he stays injury free and avoids anymore concussion issues, there is absolutely no reason it cannot happen.

3. Dustin Martin

Games Played: 258

Games Remaining: 142

This one may, but should not, come as a surprise. While Dustin Martin still has at least six seasons plus a few finals required to reach 400, he has proven to be one of the most consistent and durable players we have seen... possibly ever.

Since debuting for the Tigers in 2010, Martin has never played less than 20 games in a season. From round one 2010, he has always been one of Richmond's most important players and a main stay in the midfield. He has avoided injury through most of his career and become one of the greatest players in the game's history. Three premierships, three Norm Smith Medals and a Brownlow Medal put him in the elite category in every sense. Football is his life, he loves the game of there does not seem to be any obvious reason why he would give the game up until he exhausts everything he has, and he still has many years to come with a lengthy contract not expiring until 2024, which would be expected to be extended.

For Dustin Martin to reach 400 games, he would need to play until at least 2027. At this stage he would be 36 years of age and I cannot see any reason why this is an unrealistic prospect. He is arguable in career best form, tearing up the midfield with his strength, ability to shake players of and that powerful, penetrating kick.

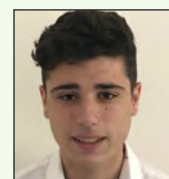

The Clemente Code

Over-officiating is killing our game!

Australia's great sport of football is a treasure as it is a game that has uniqueness, packed with flare and excitement. However, our beloved league, the AFL has been coming under scrutiny for various reasons in recent years and over-officiation has most definitely become a much-heated debate amongst pundits and spectators.

I believe in the law, rules are extremely necessary across all fabrics in our society and footy is included in this but, the game has currently reached a level where strict officiation of the rules has been affecting the quality and potential of AFL fixtures. Many games we have viewed thus far in season 2021 have still been injecting us spectators with pure adrenaline and keep us glued to our seats biting our nails. Round 10 at the Adelaide oval between the rebuilding Adelaide Crows and premiership contenders, Melbourne was an example of fine AFL football, but once again, umpire performance was reviewed.

Umpire discrepancies continues to be a problem in the AFL. I and I'm sure many others are fed up of hearing of umpire complaints after every fixture that is played. Too much attention is put on how the men in green shirts and short shorts do their business on the field. On two occasions this season, the AFL have announced publicly after the conclusion of a round that the umpires have made a mistake. For example, the umpires should have paid a mark to Geelong's Jeremy Cameron in the dying minutes against Sydney in round seven and Adelaide's Nick Murray should have been penalised with a deliberate in the dying seconds against Melbourne in round 10. Both mistakes potentially altered the results of these games.

Currently, we are not seeing any consistency from our umpires on the field. A theoretical truth we have witnessed countless times this season is one hold in the ball given down the field and then a couple of minutes later two hold in the ball tackles are not given. The amount of inconsistency we are seeing from umpires is staggering and it is leaving a bitter taste in the mouths of all involved in footy, most especially, spectators.

It is a very conflicting situation; a lot of pressure is being put on umpires, but I do not believe that this is the solution to our problem. I strongly believe that constant pressure and bombardment on umpires is creating the over-officiation the is killing the spirit of footy and making many AFL games mundane.

As we know, the AFL have been extremely strict and conservative with concussions and rightly so, but this has most definitely has plagued the minds of umpires and influences decisions. Gold Coast's Nick Holman was sent to the tribunal by umpires for a dangerous tackle, this was a reprehensible decision as Homan's tackle was perfectly legitimate. Adelaide's David McKay was also sent to tribunal for an illegal bump when it was a player going in hard to a ground ball contest. Rightly, both incidents were cleared at the Match Review Panel (MRP). Umpires are being too cautious, and their decisions are seemingly trying to eradicate the natural hardness and physicality which makes our sport great and unique.

After viewing round 16's contest between Adelaide and Brisbane at the Adelaide Oval, it highlighted that there are major inconsistencies with one of the biggest components of the game, the hold in the ball. Also, as we have seen across many games throughout the season, the deliberate out on the full has been extremely inconsistent.

Umpires are being extremely inconsistent this season and it is more evident now than previous seasons. It is simple, it is being over-officiated. Constant rules changes and politics behind concussions are influencing umpires negatively. They are leaving a sour taste in our mouths as the fabrics of footy are being forgotten in their decisions. Maybe reform in umpiring is required.

TEAM TALK with JORDAN

The Cattery

2007 was the year that Geelong became the powerhouse that they are known as today. After years of underachieving failing to become that powerful team that they always threatened to be they finally turned it around by not only having developed an ominous high attacking game style that wielded three premierships in five years, but they made their home ground Kardinia Park (it has had many different names over the years) the unbreakable fortress that many a team have now come to fear when they play there. In modern day football, every little bit counts, and the Cats have known that better than most teams. We all talk about fortresses when dominant teams seem even more powerful and even invincible on their home decks, but no team has ever had as pronounced a home ground advantage as Geelong has had at Kardinia Park. Footy pundits and critics have long since given up quoting the numbers, they've just accepted the fact that it's near on impossible to win there.

Before Geelong turned their fortunes around some 14 years ago, they famously lost a match to North Melbourne at Kardinia Park in what became the "line in the sand" moment for them. Not only was the playing group called into question but the club as a whole, culture administration, coaches all of it. They then destroyed an abysmal Richmond by 157 points at the Telstra Dome (now called Marvel Stadium) and from then have never ever looked back. As mentioned above, since then Geelong entered a golden era yielding three flags, playing in 5 grand finals and further 10 preliminary finals which is incredibly impressive. None of those games have been played at their home ground which is affectionately called "The Cattery" but it sure has played a major part in the club's consistent dominance over the competition. Since that loss to the Kangaroos in 2007 and as of the 2021 season, Geelong has played a total of 108 games at Kardinia Park. They've won an astonishing 97 of those, 97! Only 11 losses which is incredible, and their winning strike rate is 89.9%. The sheer key factors in the dominance that Geelong has there are teams that have relative unfamiliarity in which no visiting team ever playing there more than once per season and some of the bigger drawing Victorian clubs such as Hawthorn, Carlton and Richmond only playing there very occasionally, like once or twice in 12 years. The unique dimensions of the ground in my opinion play the biggest part.

Kardinia Park is only just the longest ground of any of the current AFL stadiums at 167 metres only a metre longer than Adelaide Oval, two metres more than Optus Stadium in Perth and five metres more than the MCG. It is significantly narrower than any of the other grounds however which is the most unique aspect of the grounds landscape. At just a measly 112 metres wing-to-wing, it is 27 metres skinnier than the MCG and that near 30 metres difference to the MCG is as good as one less kick for sides trying to switch the play side to side and make the ground bigger. It's no wonder teams have struggled and often have found themselves kicking the ball out on the full more than usual when they play at the cat's home ground. It's also Geelong's incredible defensive qualities that really shine through effectively smothering the opposition into turning it over and having all defensive lines covered effectively roadblocking half the ground. Considering how many teams have struggled there over the years, there are a few sides that boast somewhat of a half decent record there in recent times. Sydney has taken the cat scalp there 4 times in the last few years and had a 3-game winning streak there and Fremantle famously beat the cats in the first and only to date final played at the ground, the 2013 qualifying final, the dockers also beat them there again in 2015. For every other team it is the dreaded travel across there to face impending death. Of the 97 wins, 31 of those has been by a minimum of 10 goals and a further 8 has been by 100 points or more. Now that is some sort of dominance and it doesn't look like diminishing any time soon.

Collingwood well they have a long road ahead and the rest of the season would be best spent reviewing their list and coming to the right decision on who stays and who goes at the end of the season or risk an all but certain wooden spoon if they don't in 2022.

Hawthorn and North Melbourne in years gone by were two power house teams of the competition but now are only shadows of their former selves. When you look at them and where they both seemed to be headed for the next few seasons at least it raising a question on what should be done. Tasmania is an improving football state and currently for them to join the competition would create what nobody really wants a bye. However, should the lists of Hawthorn and North Melbourne be merged and the best of them retained they could then look at being a competitive team instead of 2 teams competing with Collingwood next year to avoid the wooden spoon.

No club likes it and neither do their supporters but it may well be time now to look at merging North Melbourne and Hawthorn for season 2022.
