





# **Crows blitzed by Bombers**

The Adelaide Crows registered the lowest score in their AFL history and lowest score recorded at Marvel Stadium finishing with two goals in the 63-point loss to Essendon.

The first quarter was some of the most boring football of the season, but the Bombers managed to kick two late goals that would end up being a match winning lead. Adelaide lost defender Tom Doedee in the first term when he courageously ran back with the flight of the ball leading to a very heavy collision with Anthony McDonald-Tipungwuti. Suffering blurred vision and chest soreness it would seem unlikely the defender will be available for selection next week.



The 24-year-old by no means had a great game finishing with two behinds, but he did genuinely have a crack and finished with 17 disposals and 11 marks which stacks up favourably against many of his teammates. The defeat leaves Adelaide languishing in 16th position, the silver lining some Adelaide fans focusing on is it will assist with a better draft pick at season's end.

Adelaide coach Matthew Nicks more concerned with how poor his team was on the Friday night stage in a game that some pundits predicted was winnable for the Crows.

"It goes against the body of work we've put together for the year, it's one out of the box that I can't explain. The effort wasn't at the level it needs to be able to play AFL footy"



# St Kilda v Port Adelaide

# Port's top four aspirations are Gawn

It was the same old story. Another wonderful chance for Port Adelaide Power to make a statement, at home soil at Adelaide Oval, against a top-eight side. A knee injury to the returning Zak Butters put more of a sour aftertaste to a disappointing evening. Butters will miss a month with a right knee strain after he took an intercept mark.

Port were powerless to stop top-two-bound Melbourne Demons as Christian Pettracca (three goals), Clayton Oliver, (33 touches), defensive pillars Steven May, Jake Lever and unheralded Harrison Petty, did what they pleased against a wayward home side.

Aerobic roaming forward beast Tom McDonald was superb with three goals and Kysaiah Pickett found form with three majors as well as the Dees destroyed Port to win 12.14 (86) to 8.7 (55). While Demon fans dare to dream and with great reason, Port's faithful, its coaching panel and players are searching for answers as to why the Power cannot crack the top-eight code with wins against such sides. It was an arm-wrestle early but Melbourne's midfield wore down a tiring Power on-ball brigade. Aside from Ollie Wines (33 possessions) and consistent duo Travis Boak and Karl Amon, others played in spits and spurts. Another positive was the form of Miles Bergman while fellow young gun Mitch Georgiadis continues to impress. His third-quarter hanger, when he used Dees' ruckman Max Gawn as a step ladder, was a thing of Mark of the Year contention.

Petty took young Port Adelaide forward Todd Marshall to the 'cleaners' while May was disciplined against Charlie Dixon although the latter did win some one-on-one marking battles. Lever did what he does best and took some key marks when Port tried to rally in the second half. Melbourne rebounded from a lapse four-week stretch to be a serious flag threat. The loss for Port yet again exposed a weak underbelly and it has just over a handful of minor round matches left to right the many wrongs - and some - if it is to contend against serious opposition such as the Dees. Power coach Ken Hinkley was a frustrated man after a failure against legit teams.

"We've had a few people who haven't been at their best form or their most consistent form," he said. "Clearly we've been OK at times because we're fifth, we've won enough games to put ourselves in a position, but to beat the best teams you've got to have more numbers in your favour than against. At the moment we're probably leaving it to a few too (many players)."

# Norwood to make it two in a row

With five minor round games remaining, both Norwood and the Eagles are wanting to cement their places in the major round. If you have no plans on Saturday afternoon, head to Coopers Stadium as this promises to be one of the matches of the season.

Norwood bounced back last week with a polished performance against Port Adelaide at Alberton.

Despite being challenged by the Magpies in the third quarter, Norwood were able to steady and record a comfortable 36-point win. Tristan Binder was the star up forward with three goals. He was supported nicely by Brad McKenzie, Xavier Tranfa and Harry Boyd, who each scored two goals.



Dual Magarey Medallist Mitch Grigg and his former Crows teammate Richard Douglas were both in sparkling form.

Both players were instrumental in setting up Norwood's win with their centre square work. Norwood won the clearances and had many more inside 50's (50:33). Norwood also dominated the overall possessions (+66).

The one area that would make Jade Rawlings challenge his group, would be his team's inaccuracy in front of goals.

The Redlegs managed 26 scoring shots for a return of 14.12. Rawlings and his players will no doubt review their goal kicking from the weekend and try and improve upon their 54% efficiency.

The Eagles managed to hold off the Bloods by 19 points in their fixture at Woodville Oval. Despite being the heavy favourites, the Eagles had to battle to make sure they secured the two premiership points.

It won't just be Jade Rawlings reviewing his teams goal kicking, the Eagles had 30 scoring shots to West Adelaide's 16. Despite the discrepancy in scoring shots, they could on convert nine into goals. Tyson Stengle and Jack Hayes kicked 5.8 between them. Despite his inaccuracy, Jack Hayes had a day out. He had 29 disposals and unbelievably had 20 marks. The next best was eight.

The Eagles dominated possession against the Bloods and had their goal kicking been more accurate, it could have been a massive day for the reigning premiers. Former Demon and Power player Jimmy Toumpas was outstanding at half back. His 29 disposals were key in repelling many forward attacks from the Bloods.

Unfortunately for the Eagles Jake Von Bertouch injured his hamstring.

These two sides met earlier this year in round eight. The Eagles won the game convincingly (47 points). Tyson Stengle kicked 3.3 on that occasion. James Tsitas had a game high 34 disposals in the Eagles win.

This match has huge implications on the race for the finals. If Norwood can win. They will join the Eagles on 18 points and equal second spot on the ladder. If the Eagles win, they can cement second spot and move closer to booking themselves a double chance come the major round.

A special call out to Paul Puopolo, who took a contender for mark of the year in the last quarter at Alberton on Saturday. This is one of the reasons many of us love SANFL footy.

# Roosters to do the 'Crowing'

I cannot see Adelaide's Reserves side winning this clash against North Adelaide this weekend.

Three weeks ago, it was a different story. The Roosters were outside the four and right next to Adelaide on the ladder. Both teams have led a late charge for finals; unfortunately for Adelaide, they ran into Glenelg at their undefeated best. Much like Sturt this weekend, momentum has counted for nothing against the competition's white-hot form, undefeated team. Adelaide also ran South Adelaide close, in a

game they let get slightly away from them at half time, before trimming the margin bit by bit unto the end, until a couple of steadiers, by who else but the veteran combo of Bryce Gibbs and Matthew Broadbent I spoke to Mitch Marini, who has played a handful of games for Adelaide this season. They tested Glenelg as much if not more than any team this season. But this weekend's game was the frustrating result. The Crows reserves got jumped early, admitting South settled better than them. In that half, Mitch says, "we had our chances but couldn't go on with it. If you compare that result to Round 1 against them this year, it highlights the progress of the team."

Adelaide are three games outside the five, with only five more to go. He admits it's not a great position to start relying on other results, 'but all we can do is keep playing good footy and getting better each week."

There's no need to complicate it. Unfortunately North Adelaide look like a team who is much improving each week; the goal of returning to the Grand Final firmly in their sights. They shot straight as a die; the top three goalkickers with 15 goals 1 between them, nine goals coming in a lightning first quarter against Central Districts – they had enough points on the board by half time, and Lachie Wilson had seven of his eight goals. North exploded through the middle, with 20 extra clearances and likewise inside 50s, had 100 odd extra touches, and took 40 more marks. From 25 fewer entries, and 50 fewer kicks, the Crows made a decent fist of their match against South, further south, the game at Victor Harbor, SANFL's first, featuring amongst the SA Country Championship all weekend.

A handful of AFL experienced stars are turning up each week, as expected, and they're increasingly better supported by their fringe players. There will be some injury top-ups to the Crows AFL sides, as well as some reward for consistent efforts here in the SANFL, as the AFL side were lackluster against the bombers. Last these two sides met, the Roosters got well and truly going once they hit time on in the first quarter – happily, a recurring theme for their last month of footy. They kicked six goals unanswered, either side of quarter time and then again bridging three quarter time. Harrison Wigg has been a barometer for this successful middle part of the Roosters season, clearing traffic 10 times for them last week with his 42 touches.

Their last loss was against Glenelg, and since then, they have managed to break every game open within 20 minutes and lead it for the rest. If they get the jump on Adelaide this week, it will be all over, red rooster, once more. North Adelaide stands to gain several key players over the next fortnight back from injury, so if they get through this clash unscathed, expect them to charge further up the ladder still. # Sturt to make it five straight at Elizabeth

Well, it's Round 15 of the SANFL season this weekend, and here's hoping for some closer contests than last weekend. The average margin was 30 points, with some teams proving why they are better than the teams on the bottom half of the ladder. Unfortunately, two teams on the losing side of the ledger last weekend and the bottom half of the ladder are the Central District's and Sturt football clubs. The Doggies host the Double Blues this Saturday afternoon at X Convenience Oval.

Both Central's and Sturt will need a red-hot run in the last five minor round matches to have any chance of playing in September this season. Unfortunately, the doggies fell victims to the Roosters by 48 points last Saturday, and Sturt went down to the Bays by 30 points.

The Doggies downfall was the first-half, where they conceded 15 goals to 5, with North Adelaide kicking the biggest first half score of the year with 91. After Half-time, however, Central fought back with outscoring North Adelaide in the second half, eight goals to six. Apart from the last round and rounds 6 and 12, the Doggies have been all of the matches and have shown signs of beating the top sides. A shining light for the Dogs this season has been forward Aiden Grace, who is second in the league for goal kicking with 29 goals. Grace kicked 4 goals last round as well as 3 in round 13 against the Magpies.

A positive for coach Paul Thomas has been their pressure, with the dogs only losing the tackle count once in the last six matches. Fraser Fort has also been pivotal for the Doggies, especially in recent weeks, as he has featured in the best players in the last four consecutive matches. Midfielder Travis Schiller has also had a solid season, averaging 23.3 disposals for the year, including 101 disposals in the last month. Another positive for Coach Thomas is their ability to come out after half-time to try and turn the match around as they have won the last three third quarters. Central's will be hoping to keep the tackle pressure up and put on a show for their fans at Elizabeth this Saturday.

The Double Blues are sitting two matches, and percentage outside the top five and their finals hopes are hanging by a thread. Sturt faced the Bays last weekend, who proved too strong at Unley. Even though Sturt went down by five goals, they were in the match up until half-time. The Bays kicked away in the third quarter, kicking five goals to one to make it hard for the Double Blues to claim an upset win. Much like Central District's, a positive for Sturt is their fighting quality, kicking five goals in the last quarter and not giving up. Casey Voss had a strong match, collecting 29 disposals and fourth-best. Fellow defender Guy Page had a standout match for the Double Blues, claiming first-best and gathering 23 disposals.

Sturts Dynamic Forward line featuring Josh Hone, Daniel Fahey-Sparks and Jordan Houlahan again made it difficult for defenders, hitting the scoreboard once again. Although Sturt trailed at quarter time last round before, they had won the last four consecutive first quarters which is a positive for Sturt. Coach Marty Mattner will be hoping his side can get off to a fast start and claim a win away from home.

The last time these two teams faced each other, it was an absolute cracker, with Central's holding on for a 10-point win. Sturt has won the last four matches at Elizabeth oval and have not lost there since 2015. I think Sturt will make it five straight at Elizabeth and win in a close contest. Sturt by 1-12 points

# **Purring Panthers Pounce on lossless Tigers**

This week is set for another SANFL blockbuster as South Adelaide travel to ACH Stadium to take on the undefeated Glenelg. With a remaining five games, each contest is becoming crucial for ladder ascendancy. The match is poised to be a quality exhibition of skill and class as the sides sit respectively first and third. However, it is a much more significant battle for the Panthers, as a win will drastically enhance their top 2 aspirations.

Glenelg enter the match as hot favorites as they are yet to put a foot wrong in season 2021. They sit on top with a record of 13-0. A model of consistency other sides have been able to match. Their charge towards booking a double chance come finals has been led by the usual suspects. Partington, Mcbean, Turner and Hosie have bullied opposition teams this year and exemplified why they are the best. However, for opposition like the Panthers, now is the time to strike. Glenelg are missing star forward Luke Hosie to a hamstring injury, forcing McBean to fill his void. Last week in the Tigers victory over Sturt, scoring was not of great concern, as McBean booted 6 goals to lead his side to a 5-goal win. Yet, against a high-quality defense such as South Adelaide, having no Hosie may prove to put great stress on the Glenelg forward line.

Glenelg coach, Brett Hand, will be impressed by his sides consistent ability to find themselves in front on the only statistics that count... the scoreboard. In the past four matches Glenelg has not dominated the statistics, winning only 2 of 4 inside 50 counts. The Tigers have instead relied on their effective ball movement, through winning the hard ball. This is illustrated by Glenelg winning contested marks in 12 of their 13 games. This also suggests the Tigers trust their sizeable forward line. Thus far this system has been faultless, however if South Adelaide are able to nullify Glenelg's height, they could upset the Tigers lossless streak.

South Adelaide has been in relatively poor form the past three weeks, winning only one game. This much needed win came last week against a fighting Adelaide outfit. While the Panthers have not been at their prolific best, they still sit third and one win outside the top 2. Their downfall in recent games has been their inaccuracy in front of goal, kicking at only 34.6%. If they are to defeat the pinnacle of the competition Glenelg, they will need to make the most their opportunities in front of goal.

It will be a fascinating battle against these sides, as South will be looking to extract revenge after Glenelg's direct style of play overcame the Panthers ball control, in round 4. This controlling style of play has been a key facet of the Panthers ball movement this season. In last weeks match against the Crows this particularly shone through, as they had 35 more marks than the opposition. Further, the Panthers seasoned players such as Broadbent, Gibbs and Sampson are giving South fans enough to get excited about, as they are all having exceptional seasons. South Adelaide coach, Jarrad Wright will be particularly impressed by the impact Gibbs is having as he is averaging 26.7 disposals and is arguably the Magarey medal favorite. This contest in the middle between two bulls of Gibbs and Partington will be a mouthwatering for SANFL fans.

If south Adelaide can reduce the Tigers contested marking and counteract by controlling the ball through excessive marks, Glenelg could find themselves no longer with a perfect record.

Both sides will be looking to bounce back after losses in round 14 which sets up what should be a good contest with plenty at stake.







West Adelaide is coming off a 19-point loss against the Woodville-West Torrens Eagles which, in the end, was a very flattering result. The Eagles kicked 9.21 in the end which shows how ugly this game could have been if they had been better in front of goal. Even with this inaccuracy the Bloods were never really in the game and were held at arm's length the whole game. The Eagles only had 6 more inside 50s which shows how effective they were at being able to generate scoring shots regardless of if they ended up in a goal. The Bloods also lost clearances which shows that even while being dominated for most of the game they were still able to get the ball inside 50 enough, however, they weren't able to create enough good looks which was the difference in the end. Jack Hayes was terrific for the Eagles with 29 disposals and 2.4 and it could have been an even bigger afternoon for him if he had kicked straight. For West Adelaide, Elliott Dunkin, Mitch Duval and Patrick Fairlie all had 25 while up forward Connor Fairlie was the only multiple goalkicker with 3 and was the main target for much of the day.

Port Adelaide on-the-other-hand had a 36-point loss at home to Norwood. Norwood had a 2-3 goal lead for much of the first half until they kicked away after half-time and ran away with a comfortable win. Norwood had 17 more inside 50s than Port which is always going to put you in a position to win no matter who you are playing. Port's defence held up well enough in the first half, however, the constant entries from the Redlegs proved too much in the second half and ended up running over Port's fatigued defenders. One positive for Port was Xavier Duursma getting back in action from his knee injury. He finished with 14 disposals, but more importantly got through the game well. Hamish Hartlett looks back to his best and followed his 33 disposals last week 17 disposals, 1 goal and a whopping 14 tackles. Riley Bonner had 29 disposals and a goal as he also vies for an AFL recall. In the forward line, Pete Ladhams and Dylan Williams both kicked 2 goals while Tyson Goldsack chipped in with one as well.

Recent games between these two sides have been blowouts galore with the closest margin being 26 points in 2018. More recently, Port won their game in round 8 of this year by 29 points and will be looking to do something similar and beat the Bloods on both occasions this year. On that occasion scores were level at half-time until Port's leaders like, Sutcliffe, Mayes and Goldsack took control and eventually secured a comfortable win. Sam Mayes was best on ground that day with 30 disposals while Kaine Stevens was great for the Bloods with 33 disposals and a goal. Port will be expected to win this one and they should do relatively comfortably yet again.



### **Who Will Be The Sixth 400-Gamer?**

In what has been a difficult time for the game in the previous two weeks, with COVID-19 once again causing havoc on the AFL Season, it was a weekend of celebration for the great Shaun Burgoyne. On Saturday night, 'Silk' became the fifth player in the game's 163-year history to reach the 400-game milestone, and the first Indigenous player to notch the quadruple century.

For just five players to reach this incredible achievement in almost two centuries goes to show what is required; a strong work ethic, dedication, resilience and a hint of good luck with health and injury along the way.

There are many players currently in the league who are somewhat within striking distance of the 400 game mark. However, with form issues, injury concerns and the possibilities of game-time and/or positions on lists being compromised in the future due to rebuilding and money-saving, some are more likely than others.

I have identified three players who are the most likely to reach that elusive 400 game milestone;

### 1. David Mundy

Current Games Played: 347

Games Required: 53

For so long many out of Perth would barely give David Mundy a mention, but now the Victorian-born midfielder is certainly up there as one of the finest footballers to ever come out of a Western Australian club. From his first season in 2005, Mundy has held an unquestionable position in Fremantle's best 22 and has rarely disappointed. A best and fairest in 2010 and All Australian in 2015, and a selection in Fremantle's 2013 Grand Final are among his greatest achievements on field. At the age of 35, the former captain is playing as well as ever, averaging 25 possessions, five clearances and four tackles, all of which are considered above average for AFL standard. For David Mundy to reach 400 games, he would need to play majority of this season's remaining games at least two more full seasons, a final or two would help boost those games up. It seems far-fetched, but if he continues at the rate he is now... why couldn't he?

Only seven games away from over taking Matthew Pavlich's club record for most games played.

### 2. Joel Selwood

Current Games Played: 325 Games Remaining: 75

The captain of the Geelong Football Club has been the epitome of hard work, dedication, and an unbelievable success rate. Since debuting in 2007, where he won the NAB Rising Star award, he has played in five Grand

Finals, won four Premierships, three best and fairest awards, six All Australians and four times the most courageous player, he has also only ever missed the finals on one occasion in 2015. Only once in his fifteen seasons has he played less than 20 games a year, he has been able to escape serious injury for so much of his career and has never been dropped.



However, Selwood's courage to go back with the flight of the ball and unflinchingly dive into packs has resulted in concussions and head injuries. His biggest strength is also his biggest weakness, and this is the only concern in not reaching 400. With Geelong's premiership window wide-open for the next few seasons and with Selwood form still certainly apt to remain in the side, he would certainly be expected to at least get very close.

For Joel Selwood to reach 400 games, he would need to play until at least another three seasons, playing at least 20 games every campaign. By that stage he would be 36 years old, if he stays injury free and avoids anymore concussion issues, there is absolutely no reason it cannot happen.

### 3. Dustin Martin

Games Played: 258 Games Remaining: 142

This one may, but should not, come as a surprise. While Dustin Martin still has at least six seasons plus a few finals required to reach 400, he has proven to be one of the most consistent and durable players we have seen... possibly ever.

Since debuting for the Tigers in 2010, Martin has never played less than 20 games in a season. From round one 2010, he has always been one of Richmond's most important players and a main stay in the midfield. He has avoided injury through most of his career and become one of the greatest players in the game's history. Three premierships, three Norm Smith Medals and a Brownlow Medal put him in the elite category in every sense. Football is his life, he loves the game of there does not seem to be any obvious reason why he would give the game up until he exhausts everything he has, and he still has many years to come with a lengthy contract not expiring until 2024, which would be expected to be extended.

For Dustin Martin to reach 400 games, he would need to play until at least 2027. At this stage he would be 36 years of age and I cannot see any reason why this is an unrealistic prospect. He is arguable in career best form, tearing up the midfield with his strength, ability to shake players of and that powerful, penetrating kick.

# **The Cattery**

2007 was the year that Geelong became the powerhouse that they are known as today. After years of underachieving failing to become that powerful team that they always threatened to be they finally turned it around by not only having developed an ominous high attacking game style that wielded three premierships in five years, but they made their home ground Kardinia Park (it has had many different names over the years) the unbreakable fortress that many a team have

now come to fear when they play there. In modern day football, every little bit counts, and the Cats have known that better than most teams. We all talk about fortresses when dominant teams seem even more powerful and even invincible on their home decks, but no team has ever had as pronounced a home ground advantage as Geelong has had at Kardinia Park. Footy pundits and critics have long since given up quoting the numbers, they've just accepted the fact that it's near on impossible to win there.

Before Geelong turned there fortunes around some 14 years ago, they famously lost a match to North Melbourne at Kardinia Park in what became the "line in the sand" moment for them. Not only was the playing group called into question but the club as a whole, culture administration, coaches all of it. They then destroyed an abysmal Richmond by 157 points at the Telstra Dome (now called Marvel Stadium) and from then have never ever looked back. As mentioned above, since then Geelong entered a golden era yielding three flags, playing in 5 grand finals and further 10 preliminary finals which is incredibly impressive. None of those games have been played at their home ground which is affectionately called "The Cattery" but it sure has played a major part in the club's consistent dominance over the competition. Since that loss to the Kangaroos in 2007 and as of the 2021 season, Geelong has played a total of 108 games at Kardinia Park. They've won an astonishing 97 of those, 97! Only 11 losses which is incredible, and their winning strike rate is 89.9%. The sheer key factors in the dominance that Geelong has there are teams that have relative unfamiliarity in which no visiting team ever playing there more than once per season and some of the bigger drawing Victorian clubs such as Hawthorn, Carlton and Richmond only playing there very occasionally, like once or twice in 12 years. The unique dimensions of the ground in my opinion play the biggest part.

Kardinia Park is only just the longest ground of any of the current AFL stadiums at 167 metres only a metre longer than Adelaide Oval, two metres more than Optus Stadium in Perth and five metres more than the MCG. It is significantly narrower than any of the other grounds however which is the most unique aspect of the grounds landscape. At just a measly 112 metres wing-to-wing, it is 27 metres skinnier than the MCG and that near 30 metres difference to the MCG is as good as one less kick for sides trying to switch the play side to side and make the ground bigger. It's no wonder teams have struggled and often have found themselves kicking the ball out on the full more than usual when they play at the cat's home ground. It's also Geelong's incredible defensive qualities that really shine through effectively smothering the opposition into turning it over and having all defensive lines covered effectively roadblocking half the ground. Considering how many teams have struggled there over the years, there are a few sides that boast somewhat of a half decent record there in recent times. Sydney has taken the cat scalp there 4 times in the last few years and had a 3-game winning streak there and Fremantle famously beat the cats in the first and only to date final played at the ground, the 2013 qualifying final, the dockers also beat them there again in 2015. For every other team it is the dreaded travel across there to face impending death. Of the 97 wins, 31 of those has been by a minimum of 10 goals and a further 8 has been by 100 points or more. Now that is some sort of dominance and it doesn't look like diminishing any time soon.






