

ROUND 23 REVIEW

Crows finish 2021 campaign on a high note

The Adelaide Crows have finished the 2021 season with a comprehensive 44-point victory over North Melbourne at Adelaide Oval. The result a good send-off for the retiring David Mackay and Tom Lynch who has not been offered a contract for next season.

Ball magnet Rory Laird was the pick of the midfield against the Kangaroos gathering an equal season Liam Sheedy high 40 possessions. Forward Shane McAdam produced one of his best displays of the season booting three goals and managed a contender for Mark of The Year in the opening term. The victory, Adelaide's seventh for the year sees the crows finish the season in 15th position. On face value it is a lowly position but importantly the Crows have shown improvement this year and have avoided a consecutive wooden spoon.

Adelaide fans will take comfort that many of the younger brigade have had a taste of AFL football and shown positive signs such as Riley Thilthorpe in his first season. The back half of the year has seen players like Harry Schoenberg, Chayce Jones and Ned McHenry begin to look more comfortable at AFL level and become important contributors.

Rory Laird and Paul Seedsman have both been rewarded for excellent seasons with selection in the 40-man All-Australian squad. Taylor Walker had a great season before his suspension finishing equal fourth in the Coleman Medal. The back line looks in good hands with Tom Doedee and Jordon Butts looks an accomplished player. There is still a lot of work to do in the Adelaide rebuild and while Matthew Nicks has not put a timeframe on a return to finals contention, he was certainly content with the performance in the final game of the season.

ROUND 23 REVIEW

Gray matters for the Power

Like he has done so often in his illustrious career, Port Adelaide Power's Robbie Gray propelled his team to a home qualifying final against Geelong Cats. Gray's goal gave the Power the lead for the first and final time against the Western Bulldogs in a double-edged game that presented the Bulldogs the chance to sew up fourth spot on the AFL ladder.

It looked likely for most of the match after another slow start by Port at an empty Marvel Stadium that deserved of a packed house. But led by Gray (25 disposals), Travis Boak (31 possessions, two goals) and midfield bull Ollie Wines Nick Kossutch (34 disposals, 17 contested), Port booked its spot for in the qualifying final against the Cats at Adelaide Oval winning 9.12 (66) to 10.4 (64). Power fans' hearts were in their mouths as one final foray by the Dogs' Bailey Smith was spoilt through for a behind with just four seconds left. Port kicked the final three goals of the game - the first was a Wines' curling goal. Boak then bent one around to perfection before he assisted Gray for the sealer as the Western Bulldog midfielders tired after half-time. Scott Lycett monstered Lewis Young in the ruck with 41 hitouts and 22 possessions while defender and captain Tom Jonas put on a masterclass against dangerous forward Aaron Naughton. Power young gun Connor Rozee was important with two goals and 100-gamer Karl Amon produced a stirring second half with his link-up work in the middle of the ground. Wines may well have sealed the Brownlow Medal against fellow favourite Marcus Bontempelli. The latter started in bright fashion to kick the first goal of the game as the Doggies were up and running early. After Naughton's goal soon after, Wines and his fellow mids took over and for all of the Power's good work across all statistics, the scoreboard didn't reflect its dominance.

Adam Treloar's dart gave the Western Bulldogs the advantage but Port wasn't to be denied a golden opportunity to book a repeat of a Cats qualifying showdown this weekend. Power coach Ken Hinkley said his team showed resilience - a trait that has been the common theme amid some adversity in the medical rooms. "It was a remarkable result because we tried everything we could to lose it ourselves with our conversion," Hinkley said after the game. "We were pretty dominant really throughout the game but we just couldn't hit the scoreboard and to the Bulldogs' credit, they were able to go forward and score. "It was a remarkable effort really when you consider it took until that late in the game to get there."

This game was basically a pre-qualifying final and the perfect set=up for the real stuff next weekend. "Finals are like that and they'll be like that all the way through," he said. "They're going to be tough and tight, we played in them last year and lost a prelim final by a goal. "We understand you have to be able to go the whole way and you've got to be able to hang in there sometimes and it's as simple as that tonight - we wouldn't go away. "The Bulldogs had lots to play for, as we did, and in the end we were able to come over, play that game of footy, hang tough and come away with a strong win."

Aside from an unfortunate hamstring injury to young key forward Mitch Georgiades, the team has a clean bill of health. Orazio Fantasia is set to be the logical replacement against Geelong.

What is event more pleasing for tiger fans, is that Lachie Hosie returned in the reserves and kicked six goals in only a half of football.






Sturt v Eagles

They kicked 10 goals after half time, and Cambell Combe took a portal to 2020 and back again for 35 touches and 16 marks.

Bryce Gibbs is every chance to be Magarey Medallist in 2021, but his two goals and 33 touches only trimmed the margin in what was North's first win down south in some time. Aaron Young is averaging three extra touches a game since North's winning run began, and he bagged four goals on the weekend.

North outmuscled south throughout the second half. So too did Norwood to their bottom rung opponents in West Adelaide. Only the week before did they put up 25% more scoring shots than the undefeated Glenelg, leading for a vast majority of the match. Then came a frenetic fourth quarter where Glenelg bagged 7, three tigers became multiple goalkickers, and while Norwood managed two to Richie Douglas, it was two too few for Norwood as a squad, un-defeating Glenelg by only ten points. Glenelg is also North Adelaide's only loss in two whole months of state league footy.

So, these teams are both challenging for the competition's best, though there's remarkable little room for error for Redlegs fans – Should they lose to North, the ball is in Sturt's court to break down the door for fifth spot. Norwood, regardless this week's result, take on the Adelaide Reserves, who were touched up by the reining champs. It was only that match putting them out of contention for the five, the crows mounting a worthy effort to make the five and falling two weeks short. Norwood truly got close to Glenelg, who, unlike the NSW government, are indeed the gold standard this year, in an extremely tight contest. They leapt ahead in hitouts, which allowed them to nudge ahead in the clearances, and again in the inside 50s, before they squandered some chances in front of goal. And it happened again on the weekend. Credit must go to Michael Knoll, who's had a whirlwind career since switching sneakers for sprigs. His return in Round 14 has heralded a month of ruck battle wins, much like he put up all season for the Panthers in 2019. I was on media placement at SANFL alongside Paula Brinkworth and Zac Millbank when the AFL's first mid-season draft ruffled some feathers, and then plucked Knoll from Adelaide's South, sending him to Sydney on a contract that was ultimately not renewed.

His footy at Norwood clearly is. This author would like to think Saturday's game will be an even contest once more. Both teams have been winning the lion's share of possession – it can happen no longer, so the teams had better prep to make do with the scraps. Should Norwood get half as many inside 50s as they did on the weekend, all they need to do is break the goalkicking shackles early, and it could be an away-win for the ages, all-but locking them into finals in the process. Should Mitch Harvey drop it at his feet instead, well, the Roosters are a fortnight's more momentum away from two genuine cracks at a title they missed last year. They play Sturt the following week, who have everything riding on their two matches against both of last years grand finalists. I'm looking forward to it all. Who Will Be The Sixth 400-Gamer?

In what has been a difficult time for the game in the previous two weeks, with COVID-19 once again causing havoc on the AFL Season, it was a weekend of celebration for the great Shaun Burgoyne. On Saturday night, 'Silk' became the fifth player in the game's 163-year history to reach the 400-game milestone, and the first Indigenous player to notch the quadruple century.

For just five players to reach this incredible achievement in almost two centuries goes to show what is required; a strong work ethic, dedication, resilience and a hint of good luck with health and injury along the way.

There are many players currently in the league who are somewhat within striking distance of the 400 game mark. However, with form issues, injury concerns and the possibilities of game-time and/or positions on lists being compromised in the future due to rebuilding and money-saving, some are more likely than others.

I have identified three players who are the most likely to reach that elusive 400 game milestone;

1. David Mundy

Current Games Played: 347

Games Required: 53

For so long many out of Perth would barely give David Mundy a mention, but now the Victorian-born midfielder is certainly up there as one of the finest footballers to ever come out of a Western Australian club. From his first season in 2005, Mundy has held an unquestionable position in Fremantle's best 22 and has rarely disappointed. A best and fairest in 2010 and All Australian in 2015, and a selection in Fremantle's 2013 Grand Final are among his greatest achievements on field. At the age of 35, the former captain is playing as well as ever, averaging 25 possessions, five clearances and four tackles, all of which are considered above average for AFL standard. For David Mundy to reach 400 games, he would need to play majority of this season's remaining games at least two more full seasons, a final or two would help boost those games up. It seems far-fetched, but if he continues at the rate he is now... why couldn't he?

Only seven games away from over taking Matthew Pavlich's club record for most games played.

2. Joel Selwood

Current Games Played: 325 Games Remaining: 75

The captain of the Geelong Football Club has been the epitome of hard work, dedication, and an unbelievable success rate. Since debuting in 2007, where he won the NAB Rising Star award, he has played in five Grand

Finals, won four Premierships, three best and fairest awards, six All Australians and four times the most courageous player, he has also only ever missed the finals on one occasion in 2015. Only once in his fifteen seasons has he played less than 20 games a year, he has been able to escape serious injury for so much of his career and has never been dropped.

However, Selwood's courage to go back with the flight of the ball and unflinchingly dive into packs has resulted in concussions and head injuries. His biggest strength is also his biggest weakness, and this is the only concern in not reaching 400. With Geelong's premiership window wide-open for the next few seasons and with Selwood form still certainly apt to remain in the side, he would certainly be expected to at least get very close.

For Joel Selwood to reach 400 games, he would need to play until at least another three seasons, playing at least 20 games every campaign. By that stage he would be 36 years old, if he stays injury free and avoids anymore concussion issues, there is absolutely no reason it cannot happen.

3. Dustin Martin

Games Played: 258 Games Remaining: 142

This one may, but should not, come as a surprise. While Dustin Martin still has at least six seasons plus a few finals required to reach 400, he has proven to be one of the most consistent and durable players we have seen... possibly ever.

Since debuting for the Tigers in 2010, Martin has never played less than 20 games in a season. From round one 2010, he has always been one of Richmond's most important players and a main stay in the midfield. He has avoided injury through most of his career and become one of the greatest players in the game's history. Three premierships, three Norm Smith Medals and a Brownlow Medal put him in the elite category in every sense. Football is his life, he loves the game of there does not seem to be any obvious reason why he would give the game up until he exhausts everything he has, and he still has many years to come with a lengthy contract not expiring until 2024, which would be expected to be extended.

For Dustin Martin to reach 400 games, he would need to play until at least 2027. At this stage he would be 36 years of age and I cannot see any reason why this is an unrealistic prospect. He is arguable in career best form, tearing up the midfield with his strength, ability to shake players of and that powerful, penetrating kick.

Over-officiating is killing our game!

Australia's great sport of football is a treasure as it is a game that has uniqueness, packed with flare and excitement. However, our beloved league, the AFL has been coming under scrutiny for various reasons in recent years and over-officiation has most definitely become a much-heated debate amongst pundits and spectators.

I believe in the law, rules are extremely necessary across all fabrics in our society and footy is included in this but, the game has currently reached a level where strict officiation of the rules has been affecting the quality and potential of AFL fixtures. Many games we have viewed thus far in season 2021 have still been injecting us spectators with pure adrenaline and keep us glued to our seats bitting our nails. Round 10 at the Adelaide oval between the rebuilding Adelaide Crows and premiership contenders, Melbourne was an example of fine AFL football, but once again, umpire performance was reviewed.

Umpire discrepancies continues to be a problem in the AFL. I and I'm sure many others are fed up of hearing of umpire complaints after every fixture that is played. Too much attention is put on how the men in green shirts and short shorts do their business on the field. On two occasions this season, the AFL have announced publicly after the conclusion of a round that the umpires have made a mistake. For example, the umpires should have paid a mark to Geelong's Jeremy Cameron in the dying minutes against Sydney in round seven and Adelaide's Nick Murray should have been penalised with a deliberate in the dying seconds against Melbourne in round 10. Both mistakes potentially altered the results of these games.

Currently, we are not seeing any consistency from our umpires on the field. A theoretical truth we have witnessed countless times this season is one hold in the ball given down the field and then a couple of minutes later two hold in the ball tackles are not given. The amount of inconsistency we are seeing from umpires is staggering and it is leaving a bitter taste in the mouths of all involved in footy, most especially, spectators.

It is a very conflicting situation; a lot of pressure is being put on umpires, but I do not believe that this is the solution to our problem. I strongly believe that constant pressure and bombardment on umpires is creating the over-officiation the is killing the spirit of footy and making many AFL games mundane.

As we know, the AFL have been extremely strict and conservative with concussions and rightly so, but this has most definitely has plagued the minds of umpires and influences decisions. Gold Coast's Nick Holman was sent to the tribunal by umpires for a dangerous tackle, this was a reprehensible decision as Homan's tackle was perfectly legitimate. Adelaide's David McKay was also sent to tribunal for an illegal bump when it was a player going in hard to a ground ball contest. Rightly, both incidents were cleared at the Match Review Panel (MRP). Umpires are being too cautious, and their decisions are seemingly trying to eradicate the natural hardness and physicality which makes our sport great and unique.

After viewing round 16's contest between Adelaide and Brisbane at the Adelaide Oval, it highlighted that there are major inconsistencies with one of the biggest components of the game, the hold in the ball. Also, as we have seen across many games throughout the season, the deliberate out on the full has been extremely inconsistent.

Umpires are being extremely inconsistent this season and it is more evident now than previous seasons. It is simple, it is being over-officiated. Constant rules changes and politics behind concussions are influencing umpires negatively. They are leaving a sour taste in our mouths as the fabrics of footy are being forgotten in their decisions. Maybe reform in umpiring is required.
