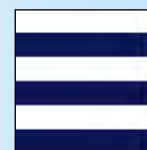

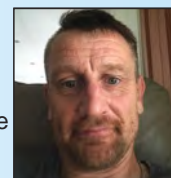
Port Adelaide v Geelong



REVIEW OF LAST FRIDAY NIGHT'S QUALIFYING FINAL

Port Orazzle Cats in clinic

Port Adelaide Power has booked itself to a second consecutive home preliminary final after a stirring 12.14 (86) to 5.13 (43) qualifying final win against Geelong Cats at Adelaide Oval on Friday night. Port powered away at each break and the predicted leg-speed factor was for all to see as the Power's small forwards Orazio Fantasia (four goals), Steven Motlop (two) and medical sub Sam Powell-Pepper (two final quarter goals) ran the Cats' defence ragged.

The hosts broke the game open in the second quarter with a 4.4 to a.3 term and Port did not take its foot off the pedal. It was in essence a statement game and Port Adelaide still has more to give. When the heat was on early, All-Australian centre-half-back Aliir Aliir was simply magnificent and it was as though Geelong picked him out time and time again. The midfielder tag-team of Travis Boak and Ollie Wines shared 65 possessions between them. It was the sure-handedness by handballs that tore Geelong apart and this aspect stood out.

Miles Bergman, in his first final, was superb for one so young while Zak Butters' front-on tackle on Cat key forward Jeremy Cameron was one of inspiration. Darcy Byrne-Jones played the perfect half-back's game in his best one for the season in what has been an indifferent year for the 2020 All-Australian and Karl Amon kept to his stellar regular season form with 25 touches in a big final. Xavier Duursma would have put a smile to the previous wearer of the Port Adelaide number seven guernsey Brad Ebert's face. Duursma committed to a spoil only to wear the brunt of a charging Cameron - a sacrificial act Ebert has done repeatedly over the years. Power coach Ken Hinkley said the week off will have his team as best prepared as possible for what he hopes is a gateway to the grand final.

"It's big in the overall goal because we get the perfect preparation for what we would like. We haven't had the pre-finals bye, so this is a bye I feel like is a bonus and benefit to us, clearly," he said. "It's probably what the old system looked like a little bit and now it works pretty favourably for us. We get to play at home again, we get to play after being a bit fresh. There's some risks with that but it's the perfect preparation in a tough, hard game of football and a bit of a rest." Port's only concern was a knee injury to Fantasia late in the game and he was replaced by Powell-Pepper. "He gave it a knock and we weren't going to take a chance. He was complaining that it was a bit sore and we were in a position where we certainly weren't going to take that chance and we didn't need to," Hinkley. "He's got two weeks so he's got plenty of time to get over that I'd imagine, but we'll see how he pulls up. It was a decision based around him being sore and we didn't need to take any more risks." Forward Mitch Georgiades, who missed the qualifying final with a slight hamstring strain, is expected to be available for the prelim final. "Mitch will be fine. He's been an incredible part of our team all the way through the year and it (playing four tall forwards) will be a decision that we have to make around what's right for us and the game and opposition that we play," Hinkley said.



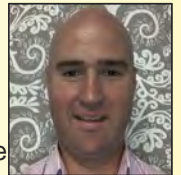

Norwood were in ripping form against the Roosters and were leading at every change to claim the two premiership points. More importantly, it brings them equal on points with Roosters and keeps their double chance hopes alive. To pinch a double chance spot, Norwood will need to beat Adelaide and hope their Eastern suburbs rival Sturt, can repeat the dose, and defeat the Roosters. Norwood were impressive against North Adelaide. Lachlan Pascoe, Harry Boyd and Nick Pedro were all multiple goal kickers, and they were ably supported by Richard Douglas, Declan Hamilton and Nikolaus Rokahr who all managed 27 possessions or more.

What makes the win more impressive was that Norwood were clearly beaten in clearances and inside 50's. Despite North winning these areas, Norwood's efficiency was the difference. Jack Heard took a team high nine marks to combine with his 18 disposals. Norwood will be ready to attack the crows this weekend, take that winning form either into a qualifying final or an elimination final. Either way, Norwood will be hungry and will want to continue their merry way.

The crows still have lots to play for. They can't make finals this season, however continuing to develop their players is still a huge priority for them. They will have tough list decisions to make post this weekend so players will want to perform. The players will be refreshed after having the weekend off, they will want to make things as difficult as possible for Norwood. Some of their better players against Central Districts were James Borlase, Lachie Sholl and Josh Worrel. Both Sholl and Worrel have experienced AFL football this season with Borlase on the Crows rookie list wanting to impress, and push his chances for higher honors in 2022.

The Crows will use this game to get matches into other senior listed players who didn't make AFL selection this year. Fisher McAsey and Tariq Newchurch are two players with a lot of talent, that will be keen to finish the season well, before heading into another pre-season. The concern I have for this game is it could be a repeat of their round seven fixture where Norwood managed 32 scoring shots to the Crows 14. Norwood's winning margin should have been bigger than the 48 points. The Crows only had three goal kickers.

Norwood should win and win well. I am certain they will have one eye on the match at Unley Oval, hoping the Double Blues can get the right result. **Norwood by 37-48 points**

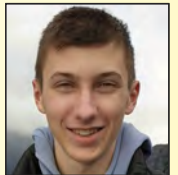
Port Adelaide v Glenelg

Port got off to a flyer, leading by 25 at quarter time, however, they lost their way and lost their lead in the 3rd quarter. From there it was a game of momentum and lead changes, until Port managed to get on top late in the last and kick three straight goals to get over the line. Port dominated the hit outs, which translated to a small win in clearances, however, they managed to rebound well and entered the 50 over ten times more than the Panthers. Boyd Woodcock had an unbelievable game with 43 disposals and a goal, along with 13 marks and 7 clearances. Clearly, he plays his best footy in the midfield, however, he just can't push his way into the Power's strong midfield which is a shame. Tom Clurey and Sam Powell-Pepper were solid, both recorded disposals in the 20s as they look to be a part of the AFL teams flag tilt. In front of goals, Jake Weidemann and Dylan Williams were very good, both finishing with 3 goals.

Glenelg on-the-other-hand continued on their merry way, accounting for West Adelaide by 36 points. They held the lead for the entire game and never gave the Bloods a look in. The Bays did exactly what they had to without really looking like they were trying too hard throughout the whole game. They ended up being +16 in clearances and +12 in inside 50s which is never going to give the opportunity a chance, especially when it is coming from a team as well drilled as Glenelg. Brett Turner had a huge day with 35 disposals, 1 goal and 12 tackles as he set the tone through the midfield. Allen (30 disposals), Landt (28) and Snook (27) all racked up the footy and never gave their opponents a chance. Darcy Bailey ended with 3 goals straight while Lachie Hosie (2.3) missed a few opportunities in what could have been a big bag.

These two sides always seem to put on a good show, however, recently Glenelg have had the wood over Port Adelaide. The Bays have won 4 of the last 5 and will be looking to continue that this week. This year, Glenelg ran away with a 10-point victory in a game that looked to be Port's for some of the last quarter. Powell-Pepper and Kane Farrell were the best for Port that day, while Liam McBean and Hosie combined for 8 goals for Glenelg. If Port can shut those two boys down then that will go a long way to winning, however, overall Glenelg have the stronger side and will become the second side in SANFL history to go undefeated through the home and away season.

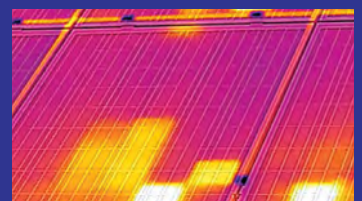

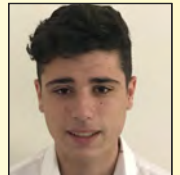

Central Districts come into the game with a one week break due to Round 18's staggered round. In this round the Dog's defeated the Crows in a 33-point victory. This was Central District's fourth win of the season. Therefore, as the home and away season concludes the Dog's will be happy to crawl to the finish line, in what has been a dismal season. In much of Central District's general play they have failed to generate enough scoring shots and have been beaten in inside 50's, clearances and marks. This has enabled opposition teams to both score heavily on oppositional turnovers and control the play. Further, the Dogs are reliant on a high-pressure game, therefore when teams can control the ball, this can nullify Central's pressure. In Central District's recent victory against the Crows, they rectified these fundamental areas and were able to maintain possession by taking 16 more marks. This was coupled with the Dog's cleanliness as they had 80 per cent disposal efficiency, which allowed them to easily transfer the ball from one end of the ground to the other. As a result, if Centrals want to upset the Eagles run into September, these areas are crucially important, as Woodville score heavily from turnovers by capitalising on their oppositions mistakes.

While, it has been a season to forget for Central Districts, fans should be enthusiastic for the future. In their last game, eight 23-year-olds played. This number is also the average age of the team. Veteran, Luke Habel, is the only player over 30. This group has the fabric of an incredibly successful premiership side, as Kyle Presbury, Nicholas Lange, Dylan Morton and Harry Grant have all had phenomenal seasons giving Doggy supporters something to bark about. In stark contrast the Eagles have a relatively experienced list who have been exhibited their class this season. The second sitting Eagles have made swift ball movement a staple of their game. This has allowed them to generate a high number of inside 50's. In the last 5 weeks, they have lost one inside 50 count. Subsequently, they have been able to score freely through their quality forward talent in that of Stengle and Menzel. These players have collectively kicked 65 goals in only 30 games and are both in the top 6 goal kickers this season. This forward class has been complemented by Woodville's defensive half. They have conceded the lowest score in the whole competition. This has been led by the experienced defensive pillars of Sam Rowland and Patrick Giuffreda, which has complemented their young run out of defensive 50 very much.

In a game that holds very little weighting in terms of ladder position, the consensus circulating Adelaide is that it will still be a scintillating game of football. Unfortunately, for Centrals this scintillation will only be down one end, as the Eagles superior experience will likely shine through, seeing a repeat of Round 9's earlier game, where Woodville waltzed to a 29-point victory. Therefore, after a crappy start, the class of Woodville's players will become evident, and scoring will be effortless.

That unexpected result would nudge the Double Blues ahead of the Panthers on percentage. South's season is in their own hands, Sturt's is half as much.

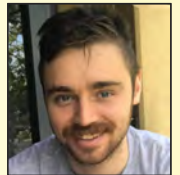
For the mighty Roosters, it's win and book themselves a qualifying final against Woodville-West, and a replay of both last year's Grand Final and the qualifier too. Sturt held the Eagles clipped for the length of their game on the weekend. They fought the contest as hard as they could, and the half-dozen extra clearances and contested marks were a sign of a team prepared to grind out a win.

The Double Blues turned the ball over quickly in their forward half early, and fired the footy in even quicker, kicking long and strong with the home breeze to earn every inch of their two-point first quarter lead over last year's premiers. Sturt trailed thereafter but had a whisper of momentum all the way through. With repeat entries late in the game, they were unable to break the comp's most miserly defence. Just about the next best in that stat is Sturt, despite four more losses, a "club that prides themselves on defence", said Jim Battersby even as he booted a first quarter supergoal for himself. The game was a good and proper arm wrestle until the final siren at Unley on Saturday. Their tight defence, tough mids and tall timbers get one last crack, again at home, against a team licking their wounds from a defeat that could cost them a finals lifeline. In my last preview I booked North in for a double chance a week too soon. I said they'd beat Norwood, given they are, or were, the comp's form team, aside from the bay.

But it was Norwood who had the 'legs for most of the match, and certainly in the first half, where they pressured to drag the lead away on repeat occasions up until half time. It was of course a finals-time fightback after the half, and the home team got going late in the third to trim the margin to an even kick. Norwood had the extra chances rebounding from half back, using them well to upset the Roosters and booking themselves a spot in the final five in the process. And so, this loss means two cracks at redemption for 2020 is not yet assured for the Roosters. Concerningly, North Adelaide were well held in the ruck by a rotating duo from Norwood, which does include the best ruckman post-lockdown in Michael Knoll, enjoying what could have been a productive end to 2019 with a different SANFL club in 2021.

So, Sturt may wish to give North the same treatment. Lachlan Burrows has played that 2nd man up, at age 20, quite well in the last two weeks, broadly playing well in the second half of 2021 alike many others in Sturt's renewed lineup. If I'm honest, the Sturt faithful will not want any spoilers from Flinders University Stadium's game scheduled 20 minutes prior to this match. West Adelaide would owe no favors to Sturt, the club that held them goalless two rounds ago, should they lose. Yet I've seen a lot of tough games of late and this is the last game for the season for many of these SANFL teams. None will give an inch in the final round. North Adelaide has two chances to earn, Sturt only half of one.

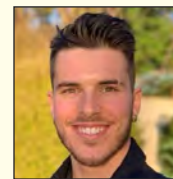

Who Will Be The Sixth 400-Gamer?

In what has been a difficult time for the game in the previous two weeks, with COVID-19 once again causing havoc on the AFL Season, it was a weekend of celebration for the great Shaun Burgoyne. On Saturday night, 'Silk' became the fifth player in the game's 163-year history to reach the 400-game milestone, and the first Indigenous player to notch the quadruple century.

For just five players to reach this incredible achievement in almost two centuries goes to show what is required; a strong work ethic, dedication, resilience and a hint of good luck with health and injury along the way.

There are many players currently in the league who are somewhat within striking distance of the 400 game mark. However, with form issues, injury concerns and the possibilities of game-time and/or positions on lists being compromised in the future due to rebuilding and money-saving, some are more likely than others.

I have identified three players who are the most likely to reach that elusive 400 game milestone;

1. David Mundy

Current Games Played: 347

Games Required: 53

For so long many out of Perth would barely give David Mundy a mention, but now the Victorian-born midfielder is certainly up there as one of the finest footballers to ever come out of a Western Australian club. From his first season in 2005, Mundy has held an unquestionable position in Fremantle's best 22 and has rarely disappointed. A best and fairest in 2010 and All Australian in 2015, and a selection in Fremantle's 2013 Grand Final are among his greatest achievements on field. At the age of 35, the former captain is playing as well as ever, averaging 25 possessions, five clearances and four tackles, all of which are considered above average for AFL standard. For David Mundy to reach 400 games, he would need to play majority of this season's remaining games at least two more full seasons, a final or two would help boost those games up. It seems far-fetched, but if he continues at the rate he is now... why couldn't he?

Only seven games away from over taking Matthew Pavlich's club record for most games played.

2. Joel Selwood

Current Games Played: 325

Games Remaining: 75

The captain of the Geelong Football Club has been the epitome of hard work, dedication, and an unbelievable success rate. Since debuting in 2007, where he won the NAB Rising Star award, he has played in five Grand

Finals, won four Premierships, three best and fairest awards, six All Australians and four times the most courageous player, he has also only ever missed the finals on one occasion in 2015. Only once in his fifteen seasons has he played less than 20 games a year, he has been able to escape serious injury for so much of his career and has never been dropped.

However, Selwood's courage to go back with the flight of the ball and unflinchingly dive into packs has resulted in concussions and head injuries. His biggest strength is also his biggest weakness, and this is the only concern in not reaching 400. With Geelong's premiership window wide-open for the next few seasons and with Selwood form still certainly apt to remain in the side, he would certainly be expected to at least get very close.

For Joel Selwood to reach 400 games, he would need to play until at least another three seasons, playing at least 20 games every campaign. By that stage he would be 36 years old, if he stays injury free and avoids anymore concussion issues, there is absolutely no reason it cannot happen.

3. Dustin Martin

Games Played: 258

Games Remaining: 142

This one may, but should not, come as a surprise. While Dustin Martin still has at least six seasons plus a few finals required to reach 400, he has proven to be one of the most consistent and durable players we have seen... possibly ever.

Since debuting for the Tigers in 2010, Martin has never played less than 20 games in a season. From round one 2010, he has always been one of Richmond's most important players and a main stay in the midfield. He has avoided injury through most of his career and become one of the greatest players in the game's history. Three premierships, three Norm Smith Medals and a Brownlow Medal put him in the elite category in every sense. Football is his life, he loves the game of there does not seem to be any obvious reason why he would give the game up until he exhausts everything he has, and he still has many years to come with a lengthy contract not expiring until 2024, which would be expected to be extended.

For Dustin Martin to reach 400 games, he would need to play until at least 2027. At this stage he would be 36 years of age and I cannot see any reason why this is an unrealistic prospect. He is arguable in career best form, tearing up the midfield with his strength, ability to shake players of and that powerful, penetrating kick.

TEAM TALK with JORDAN

The Cattery

2007 was the year that Geelong became the powerhouse that they are known as today. After years of underachieving failing to become that powerful team that they always threatened to be they finally turned it around by not only having developed an ominous high attacking game style that wielded three premierships in five years, but they made their home ground Kardinia Park (it has had many different names over the years) the unbreakable fortress that many a team have now come to fear when they play there. In modern day football, every little bit counts, and the Cats have known that better than most teams. We all talk about fortresses when dominant teams seem even more powerful and even invincible on their home decks, but no team has ever had as pronounced a home ground advantage as Geelong has had at Kardinia Park. Footy pundits and critics have long since given up quoting the numbers, they've just accepted the fact that it's near on impossible to win there.

Before Geelong turned their fortunes around some 14 years ago, they famously lost a match to North Melbourne at Kardinia Park in what became the "line in the sand" moment for them. Not only was the playing group called into question but the club as a whole, culture administration, coaches all of it. They then destroyed an abysmal Richmond by 157 points at the Telstra Dome (now called Marvel Stadium) and from then have never ever looked back. As mentioned above, since then Geelong entered a golden era yielding three flags, playing in 5 grand finals and further 10 preliminary finals which is incredibly impressive. None of those games have been played at their home ground which is affectionately called "The Cattery" but it sure has played a major part in the club's consistent dominance over the competition. Since that loss to the Kangaroos in 2007 and as of the 2021 season, Geelong has played a total of 108 games at Kardinia Park. They've won an astonishing 97 of those, 97! Only 11 losses which is incredible, and their winning strike rate is 89.9%. The sheer key factors in the dominance that Geelong has there are teams that have relative unfamiliarity in which no visiting team ever playing there more than once per season and some of the bigger drawing Victorian clubs such as Hawthorn, Carlton and Richmond only playing there very occasionally, like once or twice in 12 years. The unique dimensions of the ground in my opinion play the biggest part.

Kardinia Park is only just the longest ground of any of the current AFL stadiums at 167 metres only a metre longer than Adelaide Oval, two metres more than Optus Stadium in Perth and five metres more than the MCG. It is significantly narrower than any of the other grounds however which is the most unique aspect of the grounds landscape. At just a measly 112 metres wing-to-wing, it is 27 metres skinnier than the MCG and that near 30 metres difference to the MCG is as good as one less kick for sides trying to switch the play side to side and make the ground bigger. It's no wonder teams have struggled and often have found themselves kicking the ball out on the full more than usual when they play at the cat's home ground. It's also Geelong's incredible defensive qualities that really shine through effectively smothering the opposition into turning it over and having all defensive lines covered effectively roadblocking half the ground. Considering how many teams have struggled there over the years, there are a few sides that boast somewhat of a half decent record there in recent times. Sydney has taken the cat scalp there 4 times in the last few years and had a 3-game winning streak there and Fremantle famously beat the cats in the first and only to date final played at the ground, the 2013 qualifying final, the dockers also beat them there again in 2015. For every other team it is the dreaded travel across there to face impending death. Of the 97 wins, 31 of those has been by a minimum of 10 goals and a further 8 has been by 100 points or more. Now that is some sort of dominance and it doesn't look like diminishing any time soon.
