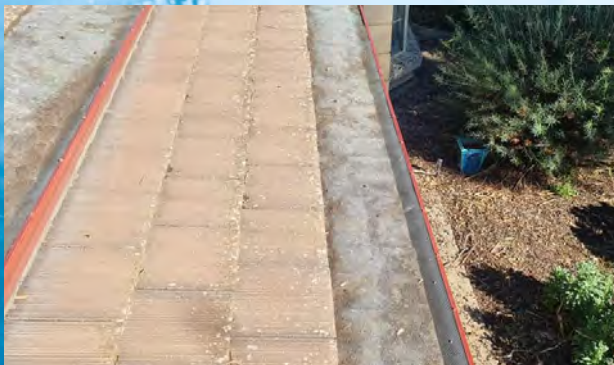

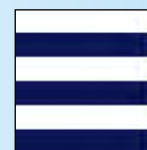

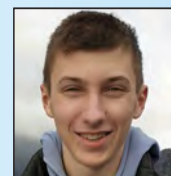

Demon Dream Crushed.

Cats into Back-to-Back Grand Finals

The Preliminary Finals have arrived and has brought a mouth-watering clash with it. Melbourne vs Geelong at Optus Stadium is very fitting considering the past that these two clubs have. Geelong have had to do it the hard way to get here after losing to Port Adelaide in the Qualifying Final and then beating GWS in the Semi, whilst Melbourne just had to beat Brisbane to book themselves in for this clash.

Melbourne have shot up this year off the back of almost every single player in their team having career best years. More notably All-Australian's Clayton Oliver, Christian Petracca, Max Gawn, Steven May and Jake Lever. Along with these guys it has been their role players that have played crucial roles in big games, especially in their Qualifying Final. Alex Neal-Bullen had 27 disposals, Angus Brayshaw 26, Bayley Fritsch 4 goals and Tom Sparrow 21 disposals just to name a few. They don't look to have a week spot over the ground which is a credit to them considering how heavily they have relied on their superstars over the last few years. If they can play the way that they did in the back half of their round 23 game against the Cats then there is no reason why they can't win, however, they can't afford to let the Cats off the leash and let them kick 4-5 quick goals which very nearly cost them last time.

The Cats have had to do it the hard way yet again which is becoming quite an alarming stat for Chris Scott's men. Arguably they would prefer to do it this way considering how, historically poorly they perform after byes so the fact that they got to play again in a semi-final may actually be beneficial. The Cats rely heavily on their key forwards due to some of their smalls not being able to produce on a consistent basis. In their qualifying final Hawkins, Rohan and Cameron combined for 3 goals and they got smashed. In the semi-final they combined for 9 goals, and they won comfortably. They are the key and Ratugolea in the side only helps even more. It's a tough ask against one of the best defences in the league, however, if they can get off the chain like they did in round 23 (8 goals combined) then it will go a long way to making back-to-back Grand Finals.

These two sides have some history, Dees fans will know that all too well. Dating back to 2011 when Geelong beat Melbourne by 186 points at Kardinia Park, it has been a long road of hurt for the Demons against the Cats since then. More notably, in 2018, Max Gawn missed a set shot with 20 seconds left to gift the Cats the win, and later in that year Zach Tuohy had a kick after the siren to sink the Dees. Geelong have always seemed to have the wood over Melbourne until round 23 of this year when Max Gawn kicked truly after the siren to win the Minor Premiership after trailing by 44 midways through the 3rd quarter. This felt like a passing of the guard moment after all those years of hurt since 2011, however, little did they know they would have to face the Cats one last time to make the Grand Final in what seems like a very fitting matchup. There is a lot of hype around the Dees this year, and justifiably so, they've been the best team all year. What can't be forgotten is the fact that the Cats did hold a 44-point lead against them only a few weeks ago in a team that was without Tuohy and Tom Stewart (who may be fit to return). The Dees are a strong side; however, Geelong make prelims for fun and have all the maturity in the world and I feel won't want to let what may be their last opportunity for a flag slip. **Geelong by 1-12 points**

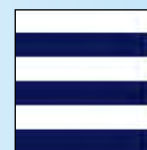

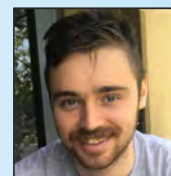


Melbourne v Geelong

Jekyll and Hyde 'Power' are set to turn up

Geelong have made it to yet another prelim the hard way, losing to Port by eight goals in their double chance final before quickly rebounding against GWS last week. Now they take on the Melbourne footy club who, after a slew of achievements this season, are one game away from their best crack at breaking the AFL's longest premiership drought. Melbourne sealed top spot for the first time since they were premiers, when Maxy Gawn goaled after the siren, completing a near 50-point comeback against the Cats back in Round 23. That game was at the Cattery, to add to the toll, whereas this Friday night's matchup is at Optus stadium I watched a 'hub update' video released yesterday, where Max Gawn gave Melbourne fans a welcome grin.

They're a little cooped up, he said, Simon Goodwin having walked a thousand laps of the carpark, but doing it better than those back at home in lockdown, in his consideration. Gawn has just made his fifth all Australian side and is also captain of 2021's Dream Team. Melbourne teammates were well represented, Jake Lever and Steven May for the first time, Christian Petracca and Clayton Olliver for their second. Tomahawk's in there again, and it was just revealed he's kicked more goals across the last five years than any forward in the comp. Joel Selwood just became Geelong's most experienced player. Jeremy Cameron has settled in nicely, not to mention Gary Rohan, and of course Dangerfield returning home from a career unfinished at the Adelaide Crows.

It's still unfinished at Geelong too, as they ran into Richmond at the peak of their powers in last year's grand final. And by Richmond, I might mean Dustin Martin, the best afield for each of the Tiger's three premierships in four years. That team and his personal record will take some beating. Richmond don't feature this post season, but Geelong always do. This Melbourne 22 can't let Geelong get halfway to their 44-point lead this time, as the experience Geelong has will ooze pressure on the Demons. Geelong lost to Port Adelaide in Adelaide last year also, before choking Collingwood, Brisbane and then alas themselves in successive weeks at the Gabba. Gary Ablett played two hours of footy with a broken shoulder, his last, before Richmond raced away nine-goals-to-two to crush the Cats' bones and spirit alike.

That's what'll be the driving force for Geelong – and unstoppable finals force meets 2021's immovable (and bearded) object. Which team will give first? Geelong beasted Melbourne in contested possessions early in Round 23, something Clayton and Christian and co. have otherwise done consistently all season. Guthrie led from the get-go for the cats, as he did to be club champion in 2020, backed by Blicavs, supported by Selwood and Stewart, Danger and Duncan, coach Brad Scott involved for a decade now. You'll see the same familiar faces hunting the Demons down, a team whose preparation for this match has been long and strong.

Like Ben Brown's set shots. It was familiar to see the old dog up forward, and within 30 seconds he'd unleashed a new trick, crumbing a checkside goal from front-and-centre. He's new to this team of course, but so too were nine players playing their first AFL final, and they did not waver for a second in their takedown of Brisbane. The double chance Lions then lost to the Dogs. Double chance Geelong remains. Melbourne are settled, but Geelong are an unsettling side. **Geelong 1-12 pts**



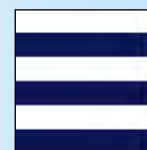

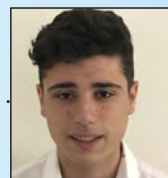

The Cats to find their purr against the Dees

Friday night will see a colossal match of footy between the two strongest pillars of Victorian football in season 2021. Under lights in the unfamiliar setting of Optus Stadium in Perth, Melbourne will clash against Geelong in what will be a nail-biting contest. The Dees and the Cats have been my two favourites for the flag for the duration of the season, so one of my predictions will play on the biggest stage of Australia's game.

How quickly we forget; in what was a mediocre 2020 season for the Demons as they failed to make the eight and former Crow champion, Simon Goodwin's job as the head coach was hanging by a thin thread. 2021 has been very reminiscent to their incredible form of 2018, which has not been replicated in the last couple of season. Positive testament must be attributed to the Melbourne footy club as they stuck to their guns by persisting with Goodwin, forming a formidable presence on the pitch and a comfortable one off the pitch. The Dees finished as minor premiers, on top of the pile at the conclusion of the home and away season with Port Adelaide a couple of points behind them. After a clean and quality performance against the Lions in the Qualifying Finals. The club and their faithful have hope and optimism that their 57-year premiership drought will end.

The Cats have once again been slick and fantastic this season with a third-place finish. With 15 finals appearances in the past 17 seasons makes the Cats one of the most consistent outfits in the competition. Since the 2016 season, the Cats have appeared in three Preliminary Finals and one Grad Final, a testament to the quality of the Scott era at the club. They themselves have a mini premiership drought as it has been ten years since Geelong lifted the premiership at a packed MCG. With one of the oldest lists in the competition, many of their star performers in Joel Seelwood, Tom Hawkins, Isaac Smith and Patrick Dangerfield are in the twilights of their careers. In the off-season, the Cats beef upped their lists with mature signings in Jeremy Cameron and Isaac Smith. It showed that Geelong are playing for a premiership now instead of building a future dynasty. In the view of club and their faithful, it is imperative that they bring the 2021 flag to Kadinia Park.

The Dees were mammoth in a 33-point defeat of Brisbane in the Qualifying Final at the Adelaide Oval. Melbourne played with ease and comfort for the entirety of the contest as the Lions proved once again that their ill-prepared for finals footy, even though they have a quality list. Their star three in Gawn (19 disposals, 37 hit outs), Oliver (33 disposals, one goal) and Petracca (30 disposal, two goals) were in full flight, and they must be again if them to be victorious against the Cats. Bailey Fritsch continued his great goalkicking form, slotting four through the big sticks.

After a disappointing Qualifying Final performance against the Power, the Cats bounced back strongly by comfortably defeating GWS by 35-points at Optus Stadium to book a fourth Preliminary Final in six years. Tom Hawkins showed once again that he continues to age like a fine wine as he booted five goals one. Sam Menegola played one of his finest career performances, notching 29 disposals and kicking two goals. Without Toby Greene for the Giants, they were overwhelmed by Geelong's quality and finals experience.

Friday night's clash will go down to the wire and prove to be one of the finest of contests of the 2021 season. Both sides are riddled with quality, but the experience of the Cats will get them over the line to enter a second consecutive Grand Final. It will be a cracker and the Cats will begin to purr. **Geelong 13-24 points**

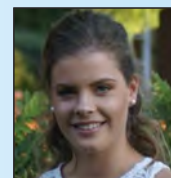
Port Adelaide v Western Bulldogs

The Western Bulldogs will travel from one hostile crowd to another, but the dogs made it clear on Saturday night that they won't let the crowd's displeasure bother them. A stadium of 26,500 Port supporters will do their best to overwhelm a determined Bulldogs outfit, after the Premier announced a crowd increase a few days ago. 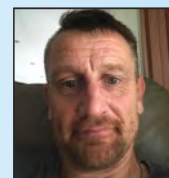

Western Bulldogs upstaged a Brisbane Lions outfit in a game that was theirs to lose. The running power of the Dogs was too much for the Lions to bear late in the game. It's this aspect that will put a 'RED ALERT' sign to Ken Hinkley and his Port Adelaide coaching staff colleagues. How to nullify the brilliant Marcus Bontempelli, the dashing and daring Bailey Smith whose running ability is the best in the AFL and the ball-getting capacity of Tom Liberatore, Lachie Hunter and Jack MacRae will be another task for Hinkley and his team.

Western Bulldogs coach Luke Beveridge was criticized with the use of Tim English up until before last week's elimination finals win against Essendon. He's now got the tag-team of English and Will Young right. The ruck pair will face a powerful combination of Scott Lycett, who destroyed the Bullies' rucking duo in round 23, and versatile Peter Ladhams. Western Bulldogs' much-vaunted midfield face an on-ball brigade that runs as deep as any in the competition. Port's midfield bulls of Ollie Wines, Travis Boak and Willem Drew complement the half-back-cum-midfield run of Dan Houston and Ryan Burton.

Throw in the class of Robbie Gray, Connor Rozee, Zak Butters and Xavier Duursma, the Power's forwards could benefit if they go one-on-one against the likes of impressive half-backs Taylor Duryea, Bailey Williams and key position stopper Alex Keath. Bailey Dale and Caleb Daniel are class ball users and need to be minded with close-checking Port Adelaide half forwards. The Adelaide Oval stage is set. Port Adelaide Power should be ready and highly motivated by the prelim-final pain of 2014 and last year. The Western Bulldogs are riding on adrenalin amid injury concerns over skipper Bontempelli (knee) and livewire young forward gun Cody Weightman (head knock).

The 'Bont' was having treatment to his knee in the final few minutes as he sat on the bench while Weightman was bumped by ex-team-mate Marcus Adams just prior to half-time and was replaced by Jason Johannisen for the second half. It's not yet determined if Weightman's injury comes under the concussion and subsequent 12-day recovery rule implemented by the AFL. 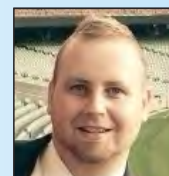

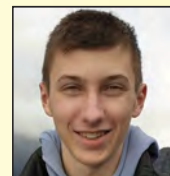

The Finals have arrived! And with that an Elimination Final between North Adelaide and South Adelaide at Adelaide Oval kicks it off. Despite nothing separating these two on the ladder, their form coming into this game couldn't be any more contrasting. North Adelaide is coming off a huge loss to Sturt while South needed to beat West Adelaide to secure themselves a spot in the finals and they did that with ease. Both sides went deep into finals last year with North falling over at the last hurdle. Both sides will be keen to go one step further this time around.

North Adelaide are coming off a 70-point loss to Sturt at Peter Motley Oval in a game that could have secured them a double chance had they have won. Sturt had plenty to play for, however, you would think that the double chance would have been enough inspiration to at least make it a contest. Sturt kicked the first 8 goals of the game, and it wasn't until 22 minutes into the second quarter before Lewis Hender kicked North's first major. Things didn't get much better for the rest of the game with Sturt kicking 16.14 to North's 6.4. In a wet day, Sturt dominated possession and also managed to just about level out the tackle count which typifies how much hungrier they were than their opposition. The Roosters were smashed in hit outs, clearances and inside 50s, all key indicators which, if you lose all three, it is very hard to win let alone keep it tight. Alex Spina was the only one that could find the footy for North and ended with 28 disposals while Lewis Hender kicked 2 of their six goals. The trouble was done down back with Abe Davis kicking 5 goals and having 24 disposals, almost beating the Roosters by himself.

South Adelaide, on-the-other-hand, found a little bit of form at the perfect time after coming off two poor losses prior to their round 19 game against West Adelaide. The Panthers ran out 43-point winners in a game that never really looked in doubt. South lead by 26 points at half time and never looked back, extending their lead until the last quarter where they took their foot off the pedal when the game was done and dusted. 43-points didn't really do South the justice that the game deserved as they kicked 12.17 and probably should have won by 60-70 points, however, they secured a finals spot regardless and won't be dwelling on that. Further to that point they recorded a whopping 34 more inside 50s but put it wide of the big sticks too often. Bryce Gibbs and Hayden Sampson both recorded over 30 disposals while the latter also kicked 2 goals. Liam Fitt was good up forward with 4 goals and 20 disposals.

This season these two sides have faced off twice, with each taking one win. South managed to win a tight one in round 2, while North had a big win more recently in round 17. Campbell Combe was instrumental in that result with 35 disposals and 16 tackles, while Aaron Young (4 goals), Lewis Hender (3.5) and Lachie Willsdon (3) were unstoppable in front of the goals. Bryce Gibbs (33 disposals, 2 goals and 10 tackles) and Joseph Haines (40 disposals) were huge for South, however, there were too many passengers who are going to need to step up this time around at Adelaide Oval. Despite coming off a big loss to the Double Blues, North come into this game in better form and the big win over South 2 weeks ago will only be more reason why they should win this game, however, expect it to be much closer. **North by 1-12 points**

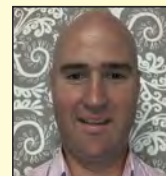
Eagles v Norwood

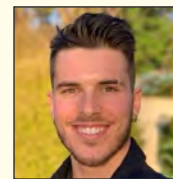

Who Will Be The Sixth 400-Gamer?

In what has been a difficult time for the game in the previous two weeks, with COVID-19 once again causing havoc on the AFL Season, it was a weekend of celebration for the great Shaun Burgoyne. On Saturday night, 'Silk' became the fifth player in the game's 163-year history to reach the 400-game milestone, and the first Indigenous player to notch the quadruple century.

For just five players to reach this incredible achievement in almost two centuries goes to show what is required; a strong work ethic, dedication, resilience and a hint of good luck with health and injury along the way.

There are many players currently in the league who are somewhat within striking distance of the 400 game mark. However, with form issues, injury concerns and the possibilities of game-time and/or positions on lists being compromised in the future due to rebuilding and money-saving, some are more likely than others.

I have identified three players who are the most likely to reach that elusive 400 game milestone;

1. David Mundy

Current Games Played: 347

Games Required: 53

For so long many out of Perth would barely give David Mundy a mention, but now the Victorian-born midfielder is certainly up there as one of the finest footballers to ever come out of a Western Australian club. From his first season in 2005, Mundy has held an unquestionable position in Fremantle's best 22 and has rarely disappointed. A best and fairest in 2010 and All Australian in 2015, and a selection in Fremantle's 2013 Grand Final are among his greatest achievements on field. At the age of 35, the former captain is playing as well as ever, averaging 25 possessions, five clearances and four tackles, all of which are considered above average for AFL standard. For David Mundy to reach 400 games, he would need to play majority of this season's remaining games at least two more full seasons, a final or two would help boost those games up. It seems far-fetched, but if he continues at the rate he is now... why couldn't he?

Only seven games away from over taking Matthew Pavlich's club record for most games played.

2. Joel Selwood

Current Games Played: 325

Games Remaining: 75

The captain of the Geelong Football Club has been the epitome of hard work, dedication, and an unbelievable success rate. Since debuting in 2007, where he won the NAB Rising Star award, he has played in five Grand

Finals, won four Premierships, three best and fairest awards, six All Australians and four times the most courageous player, he has also only ever missed the finals on one occasion in 2015. Only once in his fifteen seasons has he played less than 20 games a year, he has been able to escape serious injury for so much of his career and has never been dropped.

However, Selwood's courage to go back with the flight of the ball and unflinchingly dive into packs has resulted in concussions and head injuries. His biggest strength is also his biggest weakness, and this is the only concern in not reaching 400. With Geelong's premiership window wide-open for the next few seasons and with Selwood form still certainly apt to remain in the side, he would certainly be expected to at least get very close.

For Joel Selwood to reach 400 games, he would need to play until at least another three seasons, playing at least 20 games every campaign. By that stage he would be 36 years old, if he stays injury free and avoids anymore concussion issues, there is absolutely no reason it cannot happen.

3. Dustin Martin

Games Played: 258

Games Remaining: 142

This one may, but should not, come as a surprise. While Dustin Martin still has at least six seasons plus a few finals required to reach 400, he has proven to be one of the most consistent and durable players we have seen... possibly ever.

Since debuting for the Tigers in 2010, Martin has never played less than 20 games in a season. From round one 2010, he has always been one of Richmond's most important players and a main stay in the midfield. He has avoided injury through most of his career and become one of the greatest players in the game's history. Three premierships, three Norm Smith Medals and a Brownlow Medal put him in the elite category in every sense. Football is his life, he loves the game of there does not seem to be any obvious reason why he would give the game up until he exhausts everything he has, and he still has many years to come with a lengthy contract not expiring until 2024, which would be expected to be extended.

For Dustin Martin to reach 400 games, he would need to play until at least 2027. At this stage he would be 36 years of age and I cannot see any reason why this is an unrealistic prospect. He is arguable in career best form, tearing up the midfield with his strength, ability to shake players of and that powerful, penetrating kick.

TEAM TALK with JORDAN

The Cattery

2007 was the year that Geelong became the powerhouse that they are known as today. After years of underachieving failing to become that powerful team that they always threatened to be they finally turned it around by not only having developed an ominous high attacking game style that wielded three premierships in five years, but they made their home ground Kardinia Park (it has had many different names over the years) the unbreakable fortress that many a team have now come to fear when they play there. In modern day football, every little bit counts, and the Cats have known that better than most teams. We all talk about fortresses when dominant teams seem even more powerful and even invincible on their home decks, but no team has ever had as pronounced a home ground advantage as Geelong has had at Kardinia Park. Footy pundits and critics have long since given up quoting the numbers, they've just accepted the fact that it's near on impossible to win there.

Before Geelong turned their fortunes around some 14 years ago, they famously lost a match to North Melbourne at Kardinia Park in what became the "line in the sand" moment for them. Not only was the playing group called into question but the club as a whole, culture administration, coaches all of it. They then destroyed an abysmal Richmond by 157 points at the Telstra Dome (now called Marvel Stadium) and from then have never ever looked back. As mentioned above, since then Geelong entered a golden era yielding three flags, playing in 5 grand finals and further 10 preliminary finals which is incredibly impressive. None of those games have been played at their home ground which is affectionately called "The Cattery" but it sure has played a major part in the club's consistent dominance over the competition. Since that loss to the Kangaroos in 2007 and as of the 2021 season, Geelong has played a total of 108 games at Kardinia Park. They've won an astonishing 97 of those, 97! Only 11 losses which is incredible, and their winning strike rate is 89.9%. The sheer key factors in the dominance that Geelong has there are teams that have relative unfamiliarity in which no visiting team ever playing there more than once per season and some of the bigger drawing Victorian clubs such as Hawthorn, Carlton and Richmond only playing there very occasionally, like once or twice in 12 years. The unique dimensions of the ground in my opinion play the biggest part.

Kardinia Park is only just the longest ground of any of the current AFL stadiums at 167 metres only a metre longer than Adelaide Oval, two metres more than Optus Stadium in Perth and five metres more than the MCG. It is significantly narrower than any of the other grounds however which is the most unique aspect of the grounds landscape. At just a measly 112 metres wing-to-wing, it is 27 metres skinnier than the MCG and that near 30 metres difference to the MCG is as good as one less kick for sides trying to switch the play side to side and make the ground bigger. It's no wonder teams have struggled and often have found themselves kicking the ball out on the full more than usual when they play at the cat's home ground. It's also Geelong's incredible defensive qualities that really shine through effectively smothering the opposition into turning it over and having all defensive lines covered effectively roadblocking half the ground. Considering how many teams have struggled there over the years, there are a few sides that boast somewhat of a half decent record there in recent times. Sydney has taken the cat scalp there 4 times in the last few years and had a 3-game winning streak there and Fremantle famously beat the cats in the first and only to date final played at the ground, the 2013 qualifying final, the dockers also beat them there again in 2015. For every other team it is the dreaded travel across there to face impending death. Of the 97 wins, 31 of those has been by a minimum of 10 goals and a further 8 has been by 100 points or more. Now that is some sort of dominance and it doesn't look like diminishing any time soon.

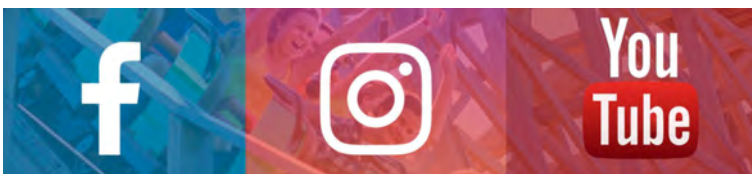

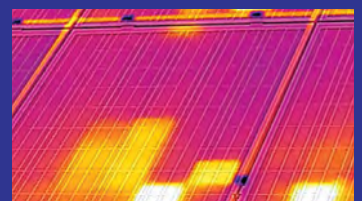

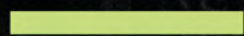
