

Dees, Bulldogs to battle for podium rights

That final day in September is just around the corner as the Melbourne Demons and the Western Bulldogs prepare for Saturday night in Perth.

Melbourne and the Bulldogs held no prisoners in their respective preliminary finals to book a spot in the 2021 AFL Grand Final.

It was a preliminary final weekend that spoke of fairy-tale finishes for two teams, while two others experienced a preliminary nightmare. The Demons smashed an experienced Geelong outfit at Optus Stadium, while the Bulldogs stunned an in-form Port Adelaide side in front of their home crowd.

Both sides will enjoy the two week break before the Grand Final to hit refresh and ensure any injury concerns are dealt with prior to team selection this week. Steven May injured his hamstring in the preliminary final against Geelong, while Melbourne's Charlie Spargo is taking it easy after injuring his ankle during a training session last week.

The Western Bulldogs seem fit and ready as Cody Weightman will return from concussion and Marcus Bontempelli appeared to have no problems in the preliminary final.

Although Melbourne have some players to manage to ensure their Grand Final selection, both sides should be set to name their best 22 players.

However, team selection is a heartbreaking moment for those players who miss out on experiencing that premiership feeling. Perhaps the most heartbreaking story of this year is Nathan Jones, after the long-time Dee was told he would not be considered for selection.

It's a story eerily similar to former Bulldog Bob Murphy in 2016 as the Bulldogs pulled off an epic premiership run. Nathan Jones gave his everything to the Melbourne Football Club and led the club in their darkest days. Now, Melbourne are on track to taking home the 2021 premiership cup, but Nathan Jones will never experience premiership glory.

On the other hand, the Bulldogs will go with an almost unchangeable side from their preliminary final demolition with the exception of dynamic youngster Cody Weightman. Luke Beveridge mentioned after their one-point thriller against the Lions that Weightman is an "irreplaceable player" with his versatility on the ground and in the air. No doubt Weightman is itching to play his role on Saturday evening after being forced to stay on the sidelines for the past few weeks.

The Western Bulldogs and the Melbourne Demons are chasing different fairy-tale endings, but it will be a captivating story either way.

Melbourne face a different fairy-tale possibility, but the story would be magnificent. A 57-year premiership drought looms over the Melbourne Football Club, and that drought could be over in a historic Grand Final win. The potential is there, but will the pressure of ending that drought be too much for the Demons?

The coaching staff of both sides had homework to do after Melbourne and the Bulldogs did not hold back in their preliminary final win. The midfield battle will be a priority focus for both sides, as each team's midfield line-up sets up a fierce contest. Melbourne blew Geelong's midfield out of the water in the prelim with Geelong conceding 101 points from clearances. Clayton Oliver, Christian Petracca and Max Gawn delivered a midfield masterclass and their uncontested clearance work was unstoppable.

Similarly, the Bulldogs worked Port Adelaide's midfield beautifully and executed their stoppage work brilliantly. Jonathan Brown mentioned On The Couch that the Bulldogs "like to chain out by hands from stoppage" to create space out the back of the contest.

It was the Western Bulldogs' third loss on the trot, made worse, supposedly by the Brisbane Lions snaring fourth spot and the finals double-chance that same weekend. Bullies' coach Luke Beveridge galvanised the playing group.

There's no doubt he masked his concerned look from the players but portrayed it to the media, that of a mentor grasping at straws as to how he will give the Western Bulldogs yelp, a quality it was missing in the latter stages of the season.

'Bevo' listened to Kane Cornes' comments that the side will not make the Grand Final. 'Bevo' listened to the critics of Collingwood recruit Adam Treloar. The coach instilled motivation like no other ahead of the game against Essendon in the rain in Launceston. Tasmania. Tick woof!

On that first week of the AFL finals both Melbourne and Port registered predictable, if somewhat and surprisingly lop-sided results against Brisbane Lions and Geelong Cats. The Doggies made history as the winning side in Tasmania's first AFL finals hosting. A trip to the Lions' den beckoned and the Dogs were down and out mid-way into the third quarter.

Enter the blue-eyed boy wonder with the blonde flowing mullet Bailey Smith. He pounced on a handball from another forward revelation Mitch Hannan to pierce through a left-footed goal and subsequent and iconic 'nerves of ice' pose.

While the Lions' Zak Bailey levelled scores with his own ripping goal moments later, the Western Bulldogs' 'them against us' ethos played to script when Laitham Vandermeer toe-poked a point to put his side ahead. Captain Marcus Bontempelli was injured late but Talor Duryea warded off Brisbane's dynamo Charlie Cameron and the game was won in one of the best finals games ever. Tick woof two!

'The Bont' was in some doubt for the 'mission impossible' task against the Power at Adelaide Oval.

Add to Cody Weightman's omission due to concussion he sustained when ex-Dog Marcus Adams got the young forward high. Then there was the hamstring strain at training to defensive key talisman Alex Keath in the week leading up to the preliminary final.

All the planets were lining up for the Power to qualify for the Grand Final for the first time since 2007. But someone forgot to tell Beveridge and his charges. There's no doubt he used all the South Australian pro-Port media mania to his and his team's advantage. The Western Bulldogs played with freedom against a side that had all the weight of Adelaide and the state on its shoulders.

However, it was through the sheer desperation and hunger, that Melbourne and the Dogs cruised to 71- and 83-point victories, securing a deserving spot in the Grand Final. As such, the battle between these sides is poised to be scintillating as both teams enter in arguably season best form.

Despite lockdown in Victoria, COVID restrictions will not be enough to control the ecstasy of Doggies supporters as they will cover the streets of Footscray in red, white and blue. As the Dogs prepare for the biggest game of the year, they will be looking to defy controversial words of Kane Cornes, "they have cost themselves a premiership... it is one of the greatest chokes of all time." This will make Dees fans anxious, as the Dog's love challenging situations. In a COVID riddled season, where they were pipped out of the top 4 and lost their key forward to injury, one would think it impossible to win a grand final from such a position. Yet, this is what they thrive in. This is what coach Luke Beveridge live for... a scrap.

The Bulldogs midfield coupled with their defensive half have been the two key sources to their success. With the AFL's Rolls Royce, Bontempelli, the scrapper, Liberatore and beautiful left footer, Jack Macrae, the Dogs have swiftly transitioned the ball to their forward half. These players are in the top 10 for clearances and ranking points, and top 12 for contested possessions. Bontempelli and Macrae are also in the top 10 for inside 50s and disposals. Therefore, the contest will likely be won or lost in the middle as Melbourne's elite midfielders of Gawn, Oliver and Petracca also share very similar statistics, hence their collective Brownlow tally of 70 votes.

Moreover, Beveridge will be impressed with the strength of his defense. While the Dog's play a relatively shorter backline, they have quality ball users. In Hawthorn's peak between 2013-15, this was a major strength of theirs. Beveridge has cultivated this strategy as Daniel, Dale, Duryea and Wood are all phenomenal ball users. In the preliminary final the players collectively went at 75 per cent. In a final and the difficulty of their disposals, this is a very high number.

In contrast the Melbourne have been close to faultless this year. After winning their first 10 straight games of the season, analytics were skeptical whether they could maintain the same energy, throughout the remainder of the season. While they did lose games by the end, they are once again hitting season best form. In their finals thus far, they are yet to be challenged defeating Brisbane in a comfortable 33-point victory and Geelong by a whooping 83 points. Subsequently, this will be fascinating how Melbourne can react to a Dogs challenge.

What will be pleasing for coach Simon Goodwin is his defense. Melbourne play a consistent zone, which forces teams to kick the ball down the line. This works into their favor as Lever, May and Salem can easily shut the ball off. Subsequently, they are all in the leaderboard for intercept possessions racking up a total of 528. Similar to the Western Bulldogs, Melbourne's defensive powerhouse is coupled with their midfield strength as Oliver, Gawn and Petracca all possess a rare match winning ability. As a result, Melbourne's hunger to break a 56-year premiership drought will overwhelm a fighting Dogs outfit, despite a close game. Melbourne by 13-24 points

While the Bombers were no match for the Bulldogs, and their electric start halted Port Adelaide, it's the match against Brisbane that earnt the Western Bulldogs their twilight Grand Final in the West. The Lions had fifteen extra cracks at it inside fifty, and yet the Bulldogs prevailed by a behind. They chipped it forward, they shepherded it forward and they tapped it forward, the forward pockets proving a prolific scoring zone.

Adam Treloar and even Tim English ran the ball up the wings to get them there, Treloar involved in an incredible 13 score assists against the power. Thirteen. Melbourne went farther past the cats in their booming win the night before. Can they get their noses in front and hold steady at Optus Stadium? These teams have met twice this season, both games decided by four-to-five goals, and on both occasions, the victor jumped to top of the table. It's a podium they'll jump on this time. Two months ago, the Bulldogs' fast start allowed them to hold off a fast-finishing Melbourne. It was pissing down with rain that day; the forecast for Saturday's final calls for 'glorious sunshine'. Josh Schache was a surprise inclusion that game, cleverly deployed down back to defend everyone from Luke Jackson to Tom McDonald and Ben Brown, before becoming a nuisance for Port up forward last week. Jackson is chipping in well as shadow ruck, each of his twelve hitouts one less for the gargantuan Gawn to get while roving his incredible five goal haul.

Martin and English share the ruck duties evenly and the Bulldogs will need the duo to produce David against the Goliath that is Captain Max Gawn. Captain Bontempelli, club champion in Premiership year 2016, enjoyed a rare night at the Brownlow Medal count last night, runner up with a stack of votes some 50% bigger than previously (in 2019). The umpires think 'the bont' is at his best and I must agree. Many of the Dogs are at their premiership-winning best, and 2016 accounts for half of last week's starters. 



South Adelaide have had to get here the hard way, beating North Adelaide in the elimination final and then, last week, beating Norwood in a semi-final. The Panthers never really looked like losing, leading by two or more goals for most of the game. Momentum was a big factor in this game with both sides getting on a hot streak at some point, with South Adelaide able to stop Norwood when they needed to, and they were able to keep them at arm's reach until the final siren. Norwood were better in the clearances and inside 50s which shows that both Glenelg and South Adelaide can improve in that area. The fact that the Panthers were still able to win will give them confidence as it shows that even though Norwood were better in such important categories, they were still able to get the win. Bryce Gibbs was as solid as ever with 31 disposals and 10 clearances while Jo Haines and Mitchell O'Neill provided support with 25 disposals each. Sam Skinner was a brick in defence with 10 contested marks and repelled what seemed like every Norwood attack. Daniel Nobes kicked 4 goals while Jason Horne-Francis only increased his draft stocks with a great run down the wing and lace out 50 metre kick that gained national recognition.

Glenelg won both games that these sides have played this year, however, does that mean anything at this stage of the year and the form that both sides are in? It has to count for something due to how good Glenelg looked in both games, but you cannot discount the form that South Adelaide are in right now and look like a team that are galvanised and primed for a crack at the cup. In saying that, Glenelg have been the best team all year and it would almost be unjust for them to miss out on even playing in the Grand Final, let alone winning the flag. Year after year Geelong have been dominate in the minor season, and year after year they fail to deliver come finals. They have made the finals every year but one (2015) since Chris Scott has taken over, but from this they have had only two Grand Final appearances and won only one premiership (In Scott's first year after taking over a very strong team from Bomber Thompson). His regular season winning percentage is 71.6%, above the AFL average. In finals it drops to 40%. This year they were terrible against Port Adelaide, and after fighting off a weakened GWS, they once more collapsed when facing Melbourne in the Prelim.

Since the 2007 grand final defeat, Port Adelaide have gone through a massive rebuild. Not only in players but also the coaching staff and the corporate figures. When Ken Hinkley signed on at the end of 2012 he was hailed as the saviour that would deliver Port their second AFL premiership. Since his takeover Port have made 5 finals series and were in the hunt for the other 4. But despite high praise for superb recruitment and off field developments (such as playing in China) the Power still have not returned to the big stage. Three times, including twice in the past two years, they have faltered at the Preliminary final. This year was particularly disappointing.

On paper, both of these teams should have won a premiership in recent years. Neither have. Geelong with their big names of Selwood, Dangerfield, Hawkins, and now the addition of Cameron. Port Adelaide with the magic of Gray, Boak, Wines, and new star Aliir Aliir for 2021.

And the fans are looking for someone to blame. There have been many calls for both Scott and Hinkley to be moved on and for new people to take the reins. They are the two longest serving head coaches without a premiership. It may be harsh, but the buck stops with the head coach. Scott and Hinkley are good coaches, that much can't be disputed, but it is appearing more and more doubtful that they can be great. Football moves fast, and after a while a coach can become stuck in old ways. It's clear that both teams have the skills and now the experience needed for a premiership, perhaps what they are lacking is the innovation.

Both coaches have had enough time to prove themselves, they have not delivered. Perhaps they would do better with a fresh start in a new team, but all that can be said is that Port Adelaide and Geelong are increasingly unlikely to taste ultimate success in the AFL with their current coaches at the helm.



SHEEDY SAYS

From the exit door to a Grand Final appearance

Every year the Grand Final provides plenty of good news stories and one such story this year is that of Tom McDonald.

The 29-year-old will have an important role to play for the Demons in their first Grand Final appearance since 2000 against the Western Bulldogs.

Last year was a disappointing year for Melbourne as they missed finals for the second consecutive season.

McDonald personally had an underwhelming season, playing only nine games and finishing the year with seven goals.

Despite being under contract both player and club thought it was best for McDonald to explore fresh opportunities elsewhere, Melbourne also preparing for the pending arrival of Ben Brown.

The forward would eventually remain at the Demons and was brutally honest in what transpired during the trade period "Yeah (I was) looking elsewhere, no one wanted me"

The tale of the tape

The response from Tom McDonald in 2021 has been impressive. 31 goals from 22 games and averaging 14.3 disposals per match.

This output has been rewarded with a new contract that will see McDonald remain at the club until the end of 2024 and likely finish his career a one club player.

When penning the new deal, the 29-year-old delighted with what has transpired this year to date. "It's been an awesome season for the team and I'm pretty excited to be able to do this"

Drafted with pick 53 in the 2010 draft Tom McDonald has been there for all the ups and downs at Melbourne and a Grand Final appearance must have seemed a million miles away at various stages.

A reward for perseverance and hard work that may very well finish with a premiership medallion would be a fairy tale result with the Demons chasing their first Premiership since 1964.





TEAM TALK with JORDAN

The Cattery

2007 was the year that Geelong became the powerhouse that they are known as today. After years of underachieving failing to become that powerful team that they always threatened to be they finally turned it around by not only having developed an ominous high attacking game style that wielded three premierships in five years, but they made their home ground Kardinia Park (it has had many different names over the years) the unbreakable fortress that many a team have



now come to fear when they play there. In modern day football, every little bit counts, and the Cats have known that better than most teams. We all talk about fortresses when dominant teams seem even more powerful and even invincible on their home decks, but no team has ever had as pronounced a home ground advantage as Geelong has had at Kardinia Park. Footy pundits and critics have long since given up quoting the numbers, they've just accepted the fact that it's near on impossible to win there.

Before Geelong turned there fortunes around some 14 years ago, they famously lost a match to North Melbourne at Kardinia Park in what became the "line in the sand" moment for them. Not only was the playing group called into question but the club as a whole, culture administration, coaches all of it. They then destroyed an abysmal Richmond by 157 points at the Telstra Dome (now called Marvel Stadium) and from then have never ever looked back. As mentioned above, since then Geelong entered a golden era yielding three flags, playing in 5 grand finals and further 10 preliminary finals which is incredibly impressive. None of those games have been played at their home ground which is affectionately called "The Cattery" but it sure has played a major part in the club's consistent dominance over the competition. Since that loss to the Kangaroos in 2007 and as of the 2021 season, Geelong has played a total of 108 games at Kardinia Park. They've won an astonishing 97 of those, 97! Only 11 losses which is incredible, and their winning strike rate is 89.9%. The sheer key factors in the dominance that Geelong has there are teams that have relative unfamiliarity in which no visiting team ever playing there more than once per season and some of the bigger drawing Victorian clubs such as Hawthorn, Carlton and Richmond only playing there very occasionally, like once or twice in 12 years. The unique dimensions of the ground in my opinion play the biggest part.

Kardinia Park is only just the longest ground of any of the current AFL stadiums at 167 metres only a metre longer than Adelaide Oval, two metres more than Optus Stadium in Perth and five metres more than the MCG. It is significantly narrower than any of the other grounds however which is the most unique aspect of the grounds landscape. At just a measly 112 metres wing-to-wing, it is 27 metres skinnier than the MCG and that near 30 metres difference to the MCG is as good as one less kick for sides trying to switch the play side to side and make the ground bigger. It's no wonder teams have struggled and often have found themselves kicking the ball out on the full more than usual when they play at the cat's home ground. It's also Geelong's incredible defensive qualities that really shine through effectively smothering the opposition into turning it over and having all defensive lines covered effectively roadblocking half the ground. Considering how many teams have struggled there over the years, there are a few sides that boast somewhat of a half decent record there in recent times. Sydney has taken the cat scalp there 4 times in the last few years and had a 3-game winning streak there and Fremantle famously beat the cats in the first and only to date final played at the ground, the 2013 qualifying final, the dockers also beat them there again in 2015. For every other team it is the dreaded travel across there to face impending death. Of the 97 wins, 31 of those has been by a minimum of 10 goals and a further 8 has been by 100 points or more. Now that is some sort of dominance and it doesn't look like diminishing any time soon.
