The Tigers kicked the first two goals of the contest before Adelaide responded with four of the next five to take a six-point lead into the quarter time break with Taylor Walker booting three majors.

The margin was stretched to 19 points at half-time before a remarkable third term saw each side boot four goals.

The Tigers scored four goals in a blistering eight-minute period to hit the front before the Crows steadied with the last three goals of the term to go into the last term with a 14-point advantage.

The Tigers challenged again in the last term, but Adelaide was not to be denied picking up their second win of the season by 19 points.

Taylor Walker and Elliot Himmelberg combined for nine goals, Ben Keays and Brodie Smith got plenty of the ball in midfield while the defence was superbly led by potential skipper in waiting, Tom Doedee.

The Adelaide defence as a collective did a great job to restrict Jack Riewoldt and Tom Lynch to a combined four goals.

One player who deserves a shoutout is the much-maligned Billy Frampton. The former Port Adelaide player played an important role taking nine marks and gathering 22 disposals, his best return at AFL level.

The win was soured by the ACL injury to Rory Sloane with scans confirming the Skipper will miss the remainder of the season, but the inspirational leader is determined to return next year.

"For me at 32 doing a knee is not ideal but it's a great challenge to come back fitter and healthier, it's a little reset on the body for me to go again".

The Crows travel to Ballarat to take on the Western Bulldogs on Saturday afternoon. I will tip the Bulldogs just with the game being in Victoria but expect the Crows to attack the contest with plenty of confidence.

At 0-4, one would think that the Port Adelaide Football Club's AFL team would produce some fight and counterattack against resurgent Carlton Blues at the MCG on a sunny Easter Sunday. It was exactly the opposite, in the first half anyway, as the Blues romped to a 50-point half-time lead courtesy of the brilliance of midfielder Sam Walsh and the 'Royal Blue Duo' of Harry McKay and Charlie Curnow who both combined for a match-winning



eight goals. What was to occur in the final hour was beyond imagination as Port Adelaide rallied and added youngsters, albeit in their 50-plus AFL games, Connor Rozee and Zak Butters inside the centre square.

Port's Mitch Georgiades, a shining light as a lead-up forward throughout the game, curled home to get the Power again within a kick. After one final flurry with an unrealistic attempt at goal by Karl Amon, big beacon McKay clunked a Sam Docherty kick after a Port behind and it was game over. Port Adelaide coach Ken Hinkley believes his team may have turned the corner despite a limp first half.

"I'm going to continue to believe that and I'm going to continue to work towards that," Hinkley said. "It's enormously challenging, there's no doubt about that, but I'm not going to give up and the team won't give up. "We'll keep to task and we'll keep going and you never know, we might get on a (winning) run just as big." The Power are at Adelaide Oval to take on fellow strugglers but nemisis all the same West Coast Eagles on Saturday in a twilight match.

Here is my take of the game:

Positives:

How awesome was Zak Butters in the middle in second half. He's all class and makes things happen by 'left-of-the-middle' creativeness. He could be and should be Port's version of Sam Walsh who is probably now the best player in the AFL. Mitch Georgiadis' game was terrific as a target lead-up forward. He's getting better and better. Connor Rozee stepped up big time in second half but he had many mates. All class when he's on song. Let's hope this effort is a stepping stone. Ryan Burton and Dan Houston both terrific. Halfback / mids add a different dimension to Port's midfield. Thought Jackson Mead and Sam Hayes showed a bit. The latter won some big taps late against Marc Pittonet. Sam just needs to develop a bigger engine. Sam Powell-Pepper. All heart and he's starting to show poise when he gets the ball. Would love him to play the Dusty Martin; Jordon De Goey mid-forward role. Evergreen champions Robbie Gray and Travis Boak terrific. Hope something can be salvaged this year to send them off in their likely final year in 2023. Jeremy Finlayson. Showed a fair bit and could've had a couple more marks if not for 'rubber chest' moments. Would love him to impose himself more like his old teammate Jeremy Cameron does at Geelong.

Negatives:

No intent or purpose in the first half. And showing more poise when with the ball in dying stages of the game that should have put Port in a position of actually nailing the win.

North beat South in a thriller at Prospect

Round 4 of the SANFL season kicks off with a good old fashion battle between North and South at Prospect Oval. Both sides come into this one with 2 wins, however, differing outcomes from round 3. North Adelaide recorded a big win at home against Central District while the Panthers struggled against Sturt, going down by three goals. This game shapes as a massive opportunity for both teams to cement themselves in the top 5 early in the season with a 3-1 record.



North Adelaide bounced back after a poor showing against Adelaide in round 2 with a 43-point victory over Centrals. The Bulldogs got off to a good start, leading by 20 points at the first break, however, the Roosters inaccuracy was the only thing costing them, kicking 1.6. Centrals kept it relatively close up until halfway through the 3rd guarter where North kicked away for good. North lead most of the key statistical categories, however, not by as much as you would expect for such a one-sided final scoreline. This shows how much the Bulldogs were in the game for much of it and if not for North's late firepower it really could have been a nail biter. You could throw a blanket over a couple of guys for best on ground with Harrison Wigg (34 disposals, 1 goal and 15 marks) and Aaron Young (37 disposals, 1 goal and 11 clearances being the standouts. Jacob Bauer was great up forward kicking 5 goals, with 4 of them coming late in the game while North was trying to power home their advantage.

South Adelaide on the other hand, went down by 18 points at the hands of the Double Blues in round 3. The Panthers got off to a horror start, going goalless in the first quarter and at half time only having 1 goal and 9 behinds on the scoreboard. Credit it to them, they managed to wrestle their way back and save some percentage, however, the game was already over by halftime. I said last week in the preview for this game that if South Adelaide can continue their great form in front of goal, they should win this game. Well, that clearly wasn't the case as they had more scoring shots but went down, the complete opposite to how all of their other games have gone this season. The most damning stat of all, however, is the inside 50s. The Panthers had 20 more inside 50s and still couldn't manage to kick a winning score which they won't be impressed with. Mitch O'Neill was everywhere with 38 disposals while Fraser Turner also had plenty of it with 31. Hayden Sampson was the only multiple goal kicker for South Adelaide kicking 2 with plenty of others chipping in with 1.

Last time these 2 sides played was in last year's finals with South Adelaide winning by 43 points. Three weeks prior to that though, North Adelaide won by 58 points so expect another high scoring affair. In that finals game, South Adelaide lead from start to finish and never really looked like giving up their lead. Campbell Combe and Harrison Wigg were massive for North with both recording over 20 disposals and over 10 tackles. Bryce Gibbs had 29 disposals while Liam Fitt kicked 4 goals. In potentially an upset I expect North Adelaide to win this upcoming game. Both sides come into it with very similar form so it really could go either way.

Tigers To Taste Sweet Revenge

Anzac Day is poised for a salivating contest between the two grand finalists from last year. Last year's grand final saw the Eagles win back-to-back flags, after they beat an almost undefeated Tigers outfit. Glenelg will be searching for vengeance, while Woodville will look to assert their dominance over Glenelg, as they have won four of their last six clashes against the Tigers. In season 2022, Glenelg have continued their stellar form,



winning three straight games. Comparatively, the Eagles have a record of 2-1, following their upset defeat against North Adelaide in Round 1. This grand final replay is poised for one of the most exciting matches of the year.

Glenelg have been impressive this season demonstrating they will once again be one of the top contenders for the Premiership. In last weeks clash against Adelaide, Glenelg were 15-point victors, after trailing by 37 points at half-time. Early in the match, the Crows dominated possession and were effective with their ball use. This dissipated in the second half, due to Glenelg's pressure and control. Although the Tigers were smashed around the ball, they gradually were able to break even with the opposition losing clearances by only 3. Glenelg had 42 more marks, which enabled them to control the football and drive the ball forward in a coordinated manner. They were also able to spread effectively, winning outside ball. This was reflected through Glenelg's disposals, as they had 81 more than their opposition. This style of play has been a facet of the Tigers game, as they have managed over 80 marks in all three games. However, coach Brett Hand will be concerned with Glenelg's loss in the fundamental statistics. In the first three rounds, Glenelg have not won rebound 50's, nor have they won clearances in two out of three games. As a result, the biggest winning margin Glenelg has had is 15. Nevertheless, through Glenelg's experience in player leadership with the likes of Hosie, Partington, Snook and Turner, they typically find a way to win. This ability to find a way to win despite not necessarily playing their greatest style of football, is a characteristic of all great sides.

The Eagles lost in an upset Round 1. This has been an aberration to their season as they have won their two other matches. In last weeks victory against West Adelaide, they lost all the key statistics, but inside 50's and goals. Further, rebound 50's and inside 50's are the only two statistics Woodville have won in the past two weeks. Like Glenelg, these are signals of a quality side, when a team can be defeated around the contest yet win the game. This is largely attributed to the Eagle's stalwart players such as Menzel, Knight and Thompson, who can win the crucial moments in a game. Nonetheless, the statistics battle will be of great concern to coach, Jade Sheedy. When the Eagles won the premiership last season, they controlled the game by winning the two fundamental statistics... clearances and inside 50's. In the Eagles respective Semi and Grand final wins against Glenelg, they won these areas. Therefore, if they are to pose a threat to the arguably more in-form Tigers outfit, they will need to rectify such areas.

Overall, neither side is approaching the match in terrific form. Port Adelaide will host Sturt at Alberton Oval on Sunday afternoon in the fourth round of the SANFL season. It is anticipated to be an intriguing contest that is destined to display quality football, and The Double Blues are expected to continue basking in their early-season form and defeat Port Adelaide on their home turf.



It is still the very early stages of the season, thus is too premature to determine who would be this season's

front runners; however, The Double Blues so far are emerging as one of the competition's top seeds. After surpassing the Redlegs in the early stages of the contest, Port Adelaide were surpassed and didn't manage to maintain a degree of intensity to challenge them as Norwood were comfortably victorious by 14-points. In a discouraging loss there were glimmers of hope as Dylan Williams paraded the forward line, slotting three kicks through the big sticks. Young new recruit, Jase Burgoyne played an admirable game, notching 20 disposals and kicking a goal.

Sunday afternoon will prove to be a game of football that is worth a watch for all football purists. Port Adelaide are a struggling side still trying to find their feet and ground themselves into the season; they're eager to win and impress their home crowd. Sturt are playing sublimely and want to continue basking in this form and they are destined to achieve their goal.
