The path from great to elite

Sydney and Geelong have both enjoyed brilliant seasons which will culminate in the Grand Final this Saturday in what should be a cracking encounter.

Both sides enter the clash as the form sides of the competition, Geelong with 15 straight wins and Sydney with nine

Most will agree that Chris Scott &John Longmire are very good Coaches and this week one of them will join the elite ranks of becoming a multiple Premiership Coach.

Alastair Clarkson and Damien Hardwick the only current coaches who are members of this exclusive club.

The records

Scott and Longmire both started their Senior Coaching careers in the 2011 season. John Longmire took the reins from Paul Roos, while Chris Scott took over from Mark Thompson

Chris Scott became a Premiership Coach at the Cats in his first year and John Longmire in his second at Sydney.

Since then, Sydney and Geelong have been two of the most consistent sides in the competition with similar records. Chris Scott has an overall winning percentage of 69.8% and Longmire boasting a record of 62.8%.

Since the 2011 Premiership the Cats have made five Preliminary finals and contested the 2020 Grand Final.

Nerves started creeping in for the Swans, and the Magpies capitalised on this to kick the last two goals for the quarter. An after the siren miss by Heeney meant the margin was 23 points at three quarter time, but the game was well and truly on.

The start of the fourth was a real arm wrestle, but now it was Collingwood looking the more composed of the two sides. Even still, it took almost 8 minutes before the Pies broke through with the first goal of the term. All players started showing signs of fatigue, but Sydney's defence was able to hold strong against repeat defensive entries. Somehow, they navigated the ground to kick one more crucial goal, their first since 12 minutes into the third, and their last for the match.

And then, with 6 minutes to go, Collingwood did what Collingwood do best.

Three quick goals to Mihocek, Hoskin-Elliott and Sidebottom saw the lead all but disappear as it looked like Collingwood were about to deliver their most devastating of heartbreaks. Sydney's defence was fighting against a relentless Collingwood surge, but they dug deep to find everything they could and keep their heads. First, a big dive from Blakey took away a chance and got the ball back in Sydney hands. Chipping around in defence chewed up some crucial seconds but still Collingwood would not give up. One final play got the ball into goal kicking range, but the defensive instinct of McInerney to rush the ball through for a point ensured that come the final siren, the ball was in Sydney hands and they were 1 point in front.

The Grand Final will now be played by arguably the two teams most deserving of being there, and who will win is anyone's guess. Geelong have been the standout all season, but Sydney have been able to take out every challenge that has been thrown their way. Seeing the powerhouse forwards of Buddy and Hawkins in one game is sure to be a treat, and the battle of the midfields will possibly dictate the final result. Whoever wins, it's sure to be a ripper of a game to complete one of the best Finals Series many of us have ever seen.

One thing is guaranteed is that the aforementioned three will provide fireworks in the biggest game of the year.



narrowly nudged out by Melbourne. This is poised to be the ultimate game in the season, not just because it is a Grand Final, but because both sides are playing unbelievable football.

Geelong has won 15 games in a row. They have been as close to faultless a side can come. In the preliminary final against Brisbane, they made the Lions look like an under 12's side. Despite a close first half, Geelong proceeded to kick 11 goals in the second half. As such, they were 71-point winners and progressed to a Grand Final. This has been their kryptonite in recent years as despite being arguably the most successful side in the past 12 years, missing finals only once, they have played in only two grand finals. Moreover, in these two grand finals, they have won only one. Their weapon this season has been their all-round capabilities. They are ranked number two for defence and number three for offence. Through the likes of Hawkins (averaging 2.7 goals), Cameron (averaging 2.7 goals), Stengle (averaging 2 goals) and Rohan (averaging 1.3 goals), the Cats look a prominent side when going forward. This is complemented by their wealth of experience in their defensive half such as Kolodjashnij, Duncan, Blicavs, Tuohy and the youth of Guthrie and De-koning. As a result, there is little surprise why they have not lost since May.

Conversely, Sydney have been the form team of the competition behind Geelong. They have won their last nine games. Their ability to suffocate sides and hurt them on the turnover has been a feature of their game this season. The Swans are ranked fourth in defence and fourth in offence making them a well-rounded side. In their most recent clash against Collingwood, the Swans won by 1-point after leading at half time by 30-points. This came as a surprise to most Swans fans for two reasons. Firstly, swans fans are not accustomed to losing. Secondly, they are the greatest second half side in the competition. Like Geelong, Sydney is a very strong defensive side. They easily intercept high and long inside 50 entries through the McCartin brothers who collectively average 13.1 intercept possessions a game. This dynamic between the Swans strong backline and Geelong's established forward line in that of Hawkins and Cameron will be intriguing and could be won by either side.

The last time these sides met was in round 2, when Sydney won by 30-points. Much has changed since this point, but one thing remains the same, both teams have the arsenal to win. I feel the match will be won or lost in Geelong's forward line. If Lloyd, Rampe and the McCartin brothers can mitigate Geelong's forwards, who are their most influential players, Sydney will win. As such, I feel the Swans will narrowly win in the closest Grand Final since 2010.

Up forward, Tom Hawkins kicked 4 goals, but it could have been 2 or 3 more with the big man missing 3 very gettable set shots. Tyson Stengle was lively with 3 goals while Gryan Miers and Gary Rohan also kicked multiple goals. The only issue coming out of the game was Max Holmes potentially doing a hamstring injury. Brody Mihocek, Will Hoskin-Elliott and Steele Sidebottom had other ideas, all kicking goals to get the margin back to 3-points. The Swans managed to survive two more attacks, rushing the ball over for 2 behinds before the siren eventually sounded. Errol Gulden was immense, especially in the second half, recording 20 disposals while also laying 7 tackles, giving the Pies players no time to dispose of the ball. Callum Mills was also good around the stoppages with 27 disposals. Tom Papley provided the X-Factor up forward with 3 goals and the sealer. Lance Franklin also stepped up with 2 goals of his own.

These two sides have played once this year with the Swans winning by 30 points at the SCG. Callum Mills was the Swans best with 29 disposals and a goal while Brad Close kicked 4 for the Cats. That game was in round 2, far enough away that both sides will be looking very different this time around. Both sides look unstoppable, with Collingwood the only team that has nearly beaten them recently. Geelong just looks like they have everything sorted out, there forwards are firing, backline is stingier than ever, and Patrick Dangerfield looks hungrier than ever. 'Tommy' returns to the Parade after an eight year absence as the Redlegs come from behind in a Grand Final for the ages against the Red-hot Roosters.

After a relatively slow start to the 2022 Hostplus SANFL Grand Final, the Norwood Redlegs, prevailed in wet and windy conditions, defeating North Adelaide 8.11 59 to 8.10 58 to win their fourth flag in 11 years and first since 2014, whilst also exacting revenge from the shock upset loss in 2018 against the same team.

As has been the story of the finals for Jade 'Twig' Rawlings men, when it looked like they were down and out, they fought and clawed and always found a way to win. The Roosters, who finished the season as minor premiers, entered last Sunday's final game of the year, as the favourites, whereas the Redlegs were touted as the underdogs.

North Adelaide were off to a very hot start, having kicked the first three goals of the match before Matthew Panos snapped Norwood's first, 11 minutes, 42 seconds into the opening stanza. Tasmanian recruit, and the hero of last weekends Preliminary Final victory over the Adelaide Crows, Baynen Lowe, kicked Norwood's second goal of the game just before quarter time to cut the deficit to 11 points, the Roosters way. At the start of the second term, the rain kicked in, as North Adelaide were only able to manage 5 behinds the entire quarter as the lone goal in the quarter came from Norwood skipper, Matthew Nunn, who at the time got the Redlegs within a goal midway through the second term. Behinds from Dyson Hilder and Campbell Coombe two minutes before the main break gave the Roosters a much needed 7 point advantage, just as the rain was beginning to pick up.

Due to the rain and how heavy and intense it was getting, it took until the 8 minute mark of the 3rd quarter for a goal to be kicked, this time for Norwood's Connor Mclean, who brought his team back within 2 points. Five minutes later, Norwood, who had been trailing all game, hit the front thanks to a snap goal from Mitchell Carroll.

North Adelaide's first goal since the 19 minute mark of the 1st quarter was kicked, 27 minutes into the 3rd by Lachlan Wilsdon, then Harrison Elbrow kicked North's second of the quarter courtesy of an off-the-ball incident in which Norwood's Jackson Kelly was involved in a scuffle with Elbrow, before the bounce of the ball after the first goal. This led to North taking a 7 point lead into the final quarter.

After two quick goals to begin the 4th, the Roosters had a 17 point lead, 12 minutes into the last, and had looked almost certain to repeat their heroics from four years ago, but as is the Redlegs Motto: 'Fortis in Procella', which is Latin for Strength in Adversity, Twig Rawlings men never gave up and after consecutive goals from Josh Richards and former Geelong Cat, Ben Jarvis, Norwood trailed by only five points with about 10 minutes to go.

Then came the man and the moment; The person the Norwood faithful call "The King" Matthew Panos in the 26 minute mark of the final term, kicked the sealer, sending the Norwood faithful into a full on frenzy.

Norwood ruckman, and SANFL West End State captain, Harry Boyd was named the 2022 Jack Oatey Medalist, for his 20 disposals, 7 marks and a whopping 64 hitouts, as the 24-year-old, Shepperton boy adds another accolade to his already growing list of achievements in his short two-year career at the Parade.

Norwood's defence, especially in the finals, has been rock solid and that, is in huge part thanks to Jack Heard who once again had 24 possessions and six marks to come second behind Harry Boyd in the Jack Oatey Medal voting.

With this being Norwood's 31st overall premiership and first in eight years, it was a long time coming and well deserved and give credit where credit is due and that starts in large part with the coaching staff, especially Jade Rawlings.
